- The results of prayer and evangelism should be shared with the church body to share in the excitement and joy in what God is doing.

Our Action Steps for Incorporating Prayer

- Begin – don’t wait for everybody to be on board. Seek key leaders to “train” the body to pray effectively for “lost people.”
- Encourage our members to pray for lost friends and family members during invitation times during worship times.
- Setting goals for extended church-wide prayer; example: 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.
