




Trail Clean Up Project

Background

Lake Sallateeska has been a resource for Illinois Baptist Churches since 1942 for summer camps and retreats. Over the many years it has been open, the camp has seen children and adults come to Christ and deepen their relationship with Him. Through faithful service of volunteers and staff, the camp has been able to provide a place where people feel comfortable, safe and relaxed and a place where people can connect with the Lord and each other. One of the ways people enjoy our camp is through our extensive trail system. There is a lot of upkeep that is needed for keeping these trails in good condition.

Project

This project would consist of removing sticks and branches that have fallen, trimming low hanging branches and brush off the sides of the trails, and blowing leaves off the trail from fall and winter.



Logistics

This project would be great for a group of 5-10 people. It would be well suited for a group of adults or well supervised youth. The project should only take a day to complete. This project will need to be done no later than May 31st but can be worked on anytime between March and May.

The camp will provide weed-eaters, rakes, and blowers. The group should bring with them chainsaws, pole saws, loppers, and gloves.

Lodging is available at the camp for free. Snacks and drinks will be provided by the camp, but all meals will be the responsibility of the group. The camp can provide meals for \$7/meal/person if advance notice is given. There is also a kitchen available for groups that want to cook their own

meals. Every project participant will receive a “Lake Sallateeksa Camp Volunteer” t-shirt and our gratitude for serving alongside us in ministry.
