CONSTITUTION

Illinois Baptist State Association

Complete document approved November 12, 2015

Updates approved November 4, 2021

INTRODUCTION

Illinois Baptist State Association received a charter as an Illinois Corporation on November 2, 1907, at Marion, Illinois, and is governed by the Illinois General Not For Profit Corporation Act.

ARTICLE I

NAME

The name of this organization is Illinois Baptist State Association, hereinafter referred to as The Illinois Baptist State Association or IBSA.

ARTICLE II

NATURE AND PURPOSE

Section 1. The Illinois Baptist State Association is an organized body of messengers from Baptist churches cooperating to encourage sound Biblical doctrine, cooperative missions, and Baptist fellowship. As an autonomous body, IBSA shall not violate the autonomy of any church or other Baptist body.

Section 2. The purpose of IBSA is to assist in establishing and developing effective Baptist churches in their context. IBSA shall engage in other related activities it considers relevant to its corporate fellowship.

ARTICLE III

DOCTRINE

Section 1. As IBSA, we adopt the Bible as the basis of all our faith and practice.

Section 2. Illinois Baptists have used various confessions of faith to better explain their understanding of the Bible. As IBSA, we acknowledge the value of all these documents, especially the Philadelphia Confession of Faith (1742), the New Hampshire Confession of Faith (1833), and the Baptist Faith and Message of the Southern Baptist Convention statement of 1925, with revisions in 1963, 1998, and 2000. We encourage IBSA congregations and associations to use confessions of faith as resources to inform and edify Illinois Baptists concerning the basic tenets of our faith. These documents will thus equip us as we seek to fulfill our historic commitment to evangelism, discipleship, missions, education, godly living, and mutual cooperation in bearing a Baptist witness to the world.

Section 3. The churches of IBSA have historically recognized that there are distinctive doctrines that unify us as Baptists and set us apart from other

denominations. Throughout our history, doctrinal statements have been adopted that express the common, but not necessarily universally held, elements of our faith. Baptists have always cherished the belief that individuals and churches are to study the Bible and form their beliefs as the Holy Spirit leads them. In keeping with this history, IBSA affirms the following statement as a basis of our continued cooperation in sharing our message with the people of Illinois and the whole world:

1. Confessions of faith constitute a consensus of opinion of some Baptist body for the general instruction and guidance of its people and others concerning those articles of the Christian faith which are most surely held among us.
2. We do not regard confessions of faith as complete statements of doctrine, having any quality of finality or infallibility. Baptists should hold themselves free to revise their statements of faith as may seem to them wise and expedient at any time.
3. Any group of Baptists has the inherent right to draw up for itself and publish to the world a confession of faith whenever the group determines it advisable to do so.
4. The sole authority for faith and practice among Baptists is the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments. Confessions are only guides in interpretation, having no authority over the conscience.
5. Confessions of faith are statements of religious convictions, drawn from the Scriptures, and as such are not to be used to hamper freedom of thought or investigation into other realms of life.

Section 4. We affirm that the Baptist Faith and Message of the Southern Baptist Convention adopted in 1925, and revised in 1963, 1998, and 2000, represents a consensus of Baptist beliefs for general instruction and guidance. These documents may be used with confidence by local churches and associations, and contain statements of Christian convictions, drawn from the Scriptures, affirming historic Baptist beliefs including the doctrines of soul competency, the priesthood of all believers, and salvation by grace alone, through faith in Jesus Christ. Cooperating churches or other interested parties may be instructed in how they might obtain a current publication of these documents by contacting the IBSA registered offices.

ARTICLE IV

MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. IBSA, in session, shall be composed of messengers who, as members of cooperating IBSA member churches, are elected and certified by said churches that have voluntarily accepted the nature, purpose, and doctrinal affirmation of IBSA and that have been approved by vote of IBSA messengers in session, based upon the recommendation of the IBSA Credentials Committee (see Article VIII, Section 7).

Section 2. The IBSA Credentials Committee shall receive and review all letters petitioning for affiliation, as well as constitutions and bylaws, operative documents, statements of faith, (in accordance with Article III Section 2) and other documents requested by the committee, from those churches seeking to affiliate with the IBSA. The IBSA Credentials Committee shall then make recommendations to the IBSA

messengers in session regarding those churches' requests for affiliation with IBSA.

Section 3. An IBSA member church will be considered a cooperating church when it has submitted an annual church profile and has contributed financially to IBSA through the Cooperative Program of the Southern Baptist Convention the preceding year to fulfill the nature, purpose, and doctrinal affirmation of IBSA.

Section 4. Cooperating churches who subsequently fail to fulfill the requirements of cooperation shall be subject to review and possible dismissal.

1. As soon as possible after the close of the annual meeting the Credentials Committee shall check all available records to determine whether there are churches failing to meet all the expectations of a cooperating church.
2. During the course of the year, the Credentials Committee shall make every effort to encourage non-cooperating churches to begin fulfilling all of the expectations of a cooperating church.
3. The Executive Director of IBSA will assume responsibility for communicating with churches who fail to meet the requirements of a cooperating church. Determination will be made as to the church's intent/desire to continue as a cooperating church in IBSA. IBSA reserves the right to remove churches who do not fulfill cooperation requirements of IBSA.
4. The Credentials Committee shall report its findings and recommendations at the next annual meeting of IBSA.

Section 5. Each cooperating church of IBSA shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, plus one messenger for each multiple of fifty (50) resident members, except that no church shall exceed fifteen (15) messengers.

Section 6. Voting privileges are given only to seated messengers.

Section 7. Messengers elected and certified by cooperating churches shall be seated at each IBSA annual meeting, upon verification by and recommendation of the Credentials Committee.

Section 8. Churches seeking affiliation with IBSA may have their messengers seated, upon recommendation by the Credentials Committee and approval by IBSA in session.

Section 9. Any motion charging doctrinal incompatibility against an IBSA member church shall only be presented in writing by a messenger at an annual meeting and will be automatically referred to the Credentials Committee.

1. The Credentials Committee shall seek other information or evidence and, along with the accusing messenger, shall consult with the leadership of the church being charged to determine the validity of the charges.
2. The Credentials Committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the next annual meeting of IBSA.

Section 10. Upon recommendation of the Credentials Committee of the Illinois Baptist State Association in annual session reserves the right to withdraw

fellowship, by a 2/3 vote of the messengers present and voting, from any IBSA member church for failure to conform to Article IV Section 3 or Article IV Section 9.

ARTICLE V

MEETINGS

Section 1. IBSA shall meet in annual session at such time and place as it may determine.

Section 2. Special meetings of the IBSA may be called:

1. Upon the request of five (5) messengers at the Annual Meeting of IBSA in writing to the president of the IBSA or by two officers of the IBSA in writing to the chairman of the Board of Directors of IBSA.
2. Approval of a Special Meeting shall require a two-thirds affirmative vote of those present and voting either by the messengers at the IBSA Annual Meeting or by the IBSA Board of Directors.

Section 3. The time and/or place of the annual or special meetings of IBSA may be changed upon approval of two-thirds of the Board of Directors.

Section 4. If emergency circumstances prohibit an in-person IBSA Annual Meeting, the IBSA Board of Directors shall be authorized to conduct the essential operational business of IBSA and its entities, excluding Constitutional and Bylaw changes, until the time of the next Annual Meeting.

Section 5. In case of the absence of the vice president from the annual or special meetings of IBSA, the president shall appoint an assistant, subject to the approval of the messengers, to serve when IBSA is in session.

Section 6. In case of the absence of the president from the annual or special meetings of IBSA, the vice president shall assume the duties of the president, retaining the position of vice president. The vice president may appoint an assistant, subject to the approval of the messengers, to serve when IBSA is in session.

Section 7. Motions made by messengers dealing with internal operations or ministries of an entity shall be referred to the elected board of the entity for consideration and a report to the constituency and to the next Annual Meeting of IBSA. On all matters referred by the messengers of the IBSA shall respond in writing at the close of their report in the Book of Reports and the IBSA Annual, giving specific information on:

1. How the matter referred was considered,
2. How it was reported to the constituency; and,
3. Any actions on the matter taken by the entity or action proposed to the Annual Meeting.

OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of IBSA shall be a president, a vice president, a recording secretary, and an assistant recording secretary.

1. Election of the president and the recording secretary shall take place during the first session of the annual meeting. Election of the vice president and the assistant recording secretary shall take place during the final session of the annual meeting.
2. Officers must have been members in residence of cooperating IBSA member churches for at least the twelve months immediately prior to their election, shall continue such membership during their term, and shall not be eligible to serve more than two consecutive terms. No employee of IBSA or family member of an employee of IBSA, nor any person whose salary is subsidized by IBSA, nor any person whose service shall provide a conflict of interest, shall serve as an officer of IBSA.
3. These officers shall be elected annually by ballot, except that by unanimous consent, any single nominee for an office may be elected by acclamation. Nominations for officers shall be received from messengers present at the IBSA annual meeting. All nominators, after obtaining prior consent of the nominee, in their nomination speech shall include but not be limited to: 1) the name and role of the nominee, 2) the nominee's history of service to IBSA, and 3) the history of participation in the Cooperative Program of the Southern Baptist Convention by the nominee's church and/or the nominee personally. Newly elected officers shall be installed during the annual meeting and shall assume responsibilities at the conclusion of the annual meeting. They shall serve until the end of the next annual meeting and until their successors assume office.
4. Election of all officers shall be determined by a majority vote, not simply a plurality vote when three or more candidates are considered.

Section 2. The President shall preside at meetings of IBSA. The president shall be an ex-officio member of the Board of Directors with vote. The president shall serve as an ex-officio member of all committees of IBSA without vote. The immediate past president shall serve as an ex-officio member of the Board of Directors for one (1) year without vote, and shall be ineligible for election to the board until one (1) year has elapsed following the year of ex-officio service.

Section 3. The vice president, in the absence of or at the request of the president, shall preside at meetings of IBSA. The vice president shall be an ex-officio member of the Board of Directors with vote. The vice president shall serve as an ex-officio member of all committees of IBSA without vote.

Section 4. The recording secretary shall be accountable for recording the proceedings of IBSA in session. A certified copy of the minutes of the IBSA annual meeting shall be submitted to the Executive Director of IBSA for inclusion in the *IBSA Annual*. The recording secretary shall affix the seal of IBSA to all documents as directed by IBSA. The recording secretary shall convene meetings of IBSA in the absence of the president and the vice president, and shall be an ex-officio member of the Board of Directors with vote. The recording secretary shall serve as an ex-officio member all committees of IBSA without vote.

Section 5. The assistant recording secretary shall perform the duties of the

recording secretary in the absence of or at the request of the recording secretary. The assistant recording secretary shall be an ex-officio member of the Board of Directors with vote. The assistant recording secretary shall serve as an ex-officio member all committees of IBSA without vote.

Section 6. With the exception of the president (see Section 2), immediate past officers of IBSA (vice-president, recording secretary, and assistant recording secretary) shall be ineligible for membership on the board until one (1) year has elapsed.

Section 7. In the event the president is unwilling or unable to complete the term of office, the vice president shall assume the office of president, vacating the office of vice president.

Section 8. A detailed guideline of the work of each officer of IBSA shall be placed in the IBSA Officer and Committee Manual. Such guideline shall include a particular method for reviewing and dismissing officers for violations of policy which it deems necessary for the effective and ethical service by its members.

ARTICLE VII

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. The Illinois Baptist State Association is an autonomous body. It shall be solely responsible for its organization. It shall elect a Board of Directors to direct all affairs of IBSA between annual meetings. One third (1/3) of the members of the board shall be elected at each annual meeting of IBSA for a three-year term.

Section 2. The Board of Directors shall determine the work to be performed by and the resources to be apportioned to all related organizations of IBSA except those related entities existing as separate corporations.

1. The Board of Directors shall be composed of thirty-three (33) members. Twenty-four of the members shall be elected from six regions apportioned decennially by the Board of Directors and nine of the members shall be elected from the state at-large.
2. The Board of Directors shall determine its time of meeting, organization, and method of procedures subject to the Constitution of IBSA. The Board may permit any or all directors to participate in a regular or special meeting by, or conduct the meeting through, the use of any means of communication by which all directors participating may hear each other simultaneously during the meeting. A director participating in a meeting by such means is deemed to be present in person at the meeting.
3. The Board of Directors shall employ one Executive Director of IBSA to accomplish the objectives the board may determine and shall set policy limits within which the Executive Director of IBSA shall function.
4. The Executive Director shall form and manage the IBSA staff, and shall have only such authority as has been delegated by the Board of Directors.

5. The Executive Director of IBSA shall serve as an ex-officio member without vote on the IBSA boards, but may be excused from executive sessions of the board unless requested to remain by decision of the board.

Section 3. Members of the Board of Directors shall be recommended by the IBSA Nominating Committee according to Article VIII Section 6. Nominees shall be published during the annual meeting and shall assume responsibilities at the conclusion of the annual meeting. They shall serve until the end of their respective terms and until their successors assume office. Terms shall be specified as ending at the conclusion of the annual meeting.

1. Individuals may not serve for more than two consecutive terms or major fraction thereof until one year has elapsed from their last date of service on the board.
2. In the event a member of a board is absent from more than one-half of the scheduled board and committee meetings in a twelve (12) month period, their position will automatically become vacant.
3. If vacancies occur between annual meetings of IBSA, prospective board members shall be nominated by the IBSA Nominating Committee and considered by the board.
4. The primary criteria to be used by the Nominating Committee of IBSA for the selection of nominees to the board are:
 - a. the individual's ability to make a maximum contribution toward attaining the goals of IBSA,
 - b. the goal of equitable representation of members from across the state,
 - c. the membership of the board consisting of a minimum of one-third (1/3) laypersons. (A lay person shall be defined as anyone who is not vocationally employed in a ministry position by a church or association. A lay person who begins ministry employment with a church or association shall be eligible to continue service until the expiration of his/her term),
 - d. the consideration of an individual's special skills and abilities
 - e. the maintaining of an equal number of Class A (one year remaining), Class B (2 years remaining), and Class C (3 years remaining) members among those serving on the board,
 - f. the reservation of membership on the board for those persons who are members of cooperating IBSA member churches and who have been members in residence of cooperating churches for at least twelve (12) months immediately prior to their election to any board, and who continue such membership during their term,
 - g. the prohibition of any cooperating IBSA member church from having more than one (1) member on any one board at the same time or more than two (2) members on all boards at the same time. A member

of the board moving to a church which has a member on the board or two (2) members on all boards shall resign. Officers of IBSA are excepted from the moving provision.

- h. the stipulation that the members of the board must meet the requirements established by any licensing agency applicable to the board,
 - i. the courtesy of considering the recommendation of the executive officer and the chair of the board.
5. No employee of IBSA or family member of an employee of IBSA, nor any person whose salary is subsidized by IBSA, nor any person whose service shall provide a conflict of interest, (other than those disclosed to and approved by the Board), shall serve as a member of the board of IBSA.

Section 4. During the fiscal year, the Board of Directors shall not obligate IBSA to expenditure nor incur accumulative indebtedness that will exceed its annual budget by an amount greater than three percent of its annual budget.

Section 5. The president of IBSA shall recommend to IBSA in session a firm of certified public accountants to audit the financial records of IBSA for the ensuing year. The Board of Directors shall submit to IBSA a report of its finances and shall submit to IBSA in annual session a proposed financial program or budget for the ensuing year. Such proposal shall be based on the anticipated gross receipts according to its financial report.

Section 6. Only the properties and assets of IBSA shall be owned by the corporation. The Board of Directors, by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting, may purchase, or otherwise acquire, lease, mortgage, sell, exchange, or otherwise dispose of any property, personal or real, of IBSA. The IBSA in annual session must approve the sale, lease, exchange or otherwise disposal of over one-half the fair market value of all of the property of the corporation, other than in the usual and regular course of its activities. The Board of Directors may appoint and delegate the authority to committees to act for them in the interim of their sessions. These committees shall not have authority to mortgage, exchange, or otherwise dispose of the property, personal or real, of IBSA, unless specifically authorized and directed to do so by a two-thirds vote of the Board.

Section 7. A quorum shall be present for any action of the Board of Directors, or any committee of the boards. Fifty-one percent of the members of the board or committees of the board, in office at the time of the meeting, shall constitute a quorum.

Section 8. The officers of the Board of Directors shall be a chair, a vice-chair, and a recording secretary. These officers shall be elected annually by the board at its last meeting prior to the IBSA annual meeting. They shall serve no more than two terms in any elected board office. Members of the board whose final term expires shall not be eligible for re-election as an officer. Officers of the Board of Directors shall serve on the Advisory Committee of the board with vote and shall serve with vote on the board committee to which they are elected, however they shall serve on the other standing committees of the board as ex-officio members without vote.

Section 9. It shall be the duty of the chair to preside at all meetings of the board, and to perform such other duties as usually pertain to this office. The chair shall be an ex-officio member of all committees of the board.

Section 10. It shall be the duty of the vice-chair to perform the duties of the chairman in the absence of the chair. In the event of the death or resignation of the chair, the vice-chair shall serve until a new chair is elected.

Section 11. It shall be the duty of the secretary to keep an accurate account of the proceedings of each meeting of the board, and to perform such other duties as usually pertain to this office.

Section 12. The chair of the board shall initiate an annual evaluation of that entity's executive officer, using the forms and processes adopted by the board.

Section 13. The board shall submit for consideration by IBSA in session a budget in keeping with Section 5. The board shall have the authority to change line items, providing the total budget figure remains the same as approved by IBSA in session. The Board shall submit for consideration by IBSA any plans for new special offerings or capital fund-raising activities. Authorized offerings for state-wide promotion are: 1) the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering for North American Missions, 2) the Mothers Day's Offering for the Baptist Children's Home and Family Services, 3) the Mission Illinois Offering, 4) the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions, and 5) the World Hunger Offering.

Section 14. The board shall be organized into standing committees. Each committee shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary. At the last committee meeting of the year, officers are elected for the following year. The chairperson of the board shall appoint each board member to one standing committee each year. The standing committees shall evaluate, approve, and recommend to the board such goals as may pertain to that committee's area of responsibility.

Section 15. The standing committees of the Board of Directors are:

1. The Administrative Committee will review board policy and recommend adjustments to insure efficient operations of the board and the IBSA staff, in order that the various segments of IBSA may effectively work together to achieve the mission, vision, and goals of IBSA.
2. The Strategic Planning Committee will work directly with the Executive Director to assess the needs of churches and associations, to establish and recommend to the Board of Directors mission, vision and goal statements, to assist the Board of Directors in identifying end results that are desired from IBSA activities and ministries, to assess the effectiveness of IBSA delivery of services, to recommend effective communication channels, and to recommend special ministry projects that will assist IBSA to accomplish its mission, vision, and goals.
3. The Resource Development Committee shall assist the Executive Director to gather and recommend distribution of resources to meet the mission, vision, and goals of IBSA. It will assist in budget development, allocation of Cooperative Program resources, long range financial planning, and management of all IBSA facilities.

4. The Advisory Committee shall consist of: 1) the chair of the board, as chair, 2) other officers of the board, and 3) the chair of each of the other standing committees of the board. The Advisory Committee will act as counsel for the executive officer. In the event of the death, incapacity, or prolonged absence of the executive officer, the Advisory Committee shall assume responsibilities for day to day operations until the next meeting of the board, and shall report to the board at each regular and special meeting any actions it has taken in the interim.

Section 16. Regular meetings of the board and the committees of the board shall be held at least semi-annually. The board shall fix the dates, times, and places of its meetings. Special meetings may be called by two officers of the board. At least seven days written notice of the date, time, and place shall be given to each member of the board by the person(s) calling the meeting. The notice shall state the nature of the business to be considered at the special meeting, and no business other than that stated in the notice shall be considered at such meeting.

Section 17. A detailed guideline of the work of the board will be placed in the Policy and Procedures Manual of the entity. Such guideline shall include a particular method for reviewing and dismissing members for violations of policy which it deems necessary for the effective and ethical service by its members.

ARTICLE VIII

STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. The standing committees of IBSA shall be: 1) Committee on Committees, 2) Committee on Order of Business, 3) Nominating Committee, 4) Credentials Committee, 5) Constitution Committee, 6) Resolutions and Christian Life Committee, and 7) Historical Committee.

Section 2. The standing committees of IBSA shall consist of twelve (12) members each. One-third (1/3) of the members shall rotate off annually. Any person having served three (3) years, or major fraction thereof, shall be ineligible for re-election to the same committee until at least one (1) year has elapsed. Committee membership shall be reserved for those who have been a member in residence of cooperating IBSA member churches for at least twelve (12) months immediately prior to election, and who continue such membership during their term.

1. No employee of IBSA or family member of an employee of IBSA, nor any person whose salary is subsidized by IBSA, nor any person whose service shall provide a conflict of interest, shall serve as a member of any standing committee of IBSA.
2. No person may serve simultaneously as a member of the board and as a member of an IBSA standing committee.
3. In the event committee members absent themselves from two (2) consecutive committee meetings that appear on the IBSA calendar, their positions shall be automatically vacant.
4. A quorum shall be present for any action of the standing committees. Fifty-one (51) percent of the members of the committee in office at the time of

the meeting shall constitute a quorum.

5. The IBSA Committees may permit any or all members to participate in a regular or special meeting by, or conduct the meeting through, the use of any means of communication by which all members participating may hear each other simultaneously during the meeting. A member participating in a meeting by such means is deemed to be present in person at the meeting.
6. If a person has been elected to a standing committee or an ad hoc committee of IBSA and then is later elected to the position of an officer of IBSA, such person shall vacate the committee role in order to fulfill the role of an officer. Such vacancies shall be handled in the same manner of committee vacancies that may occur for any other reason.
7. No church shall have more than one (1) member on an IBSA standing committee at the same time, with no more than two (2) different members from one church on all IBSA standing committees. A member of a standing committee moving to a church which has a member on that same committee or two (2) members on all standing committees shall resign. Officers of IBSA are excepted from the moving provision.
8. If vacancies occur on a standing committee between annual meetings, nominations of prospective members for said vacancies shall be made by the Committee on Committees to the Board of Directors of IBSA for approval.

Section 3. Upon assuming office, the newly elected president of IBSA shall appoint members to fill vacancies on the Committee on Committees.

Section 4. The Committee on Committees shall nominate at each annual meeting of IBSA persons for membership on all standing committees and all ad hoc committees authorized by IBSA, including all committee vacancies, with the exception of the Committees of the Board of Directors. While serving on the Committee on Committees, members shall be ineligible for nomination to other standing committees and all ad hoc committees of IBSA.

Section 5. The Committee on Order of Business shall suggest a program including an order of business for the IBSA annual meeting. It shall provide time for the introduction of matters requiring a vote not scheduled on the agenda, and shall fix a time for the consideration of the same. The committee shall recommend the time and place for the annual meeting three (3) years in advance. The committee shall recommend a speaker for the annual sermon for the succeeding IBSA annual meeting.

Section 6. The Nominating Committee shall nominate members for the board to IBSA in session. If vacancies occur between annual meetings of IBSA, prospective board members shall be nominated by the IBSA Nominating Committee and considered by the board. While serving on the Nominating Committee, members shall be ineligible for nomination to the board.

Section 7. The Credentials Committee shall enroll all qualified messengers, those elected and certified by cooperating churches, at each annual meeting and special meetings of IBSA.

1. The committee shall monitor the enrollment of churches at the meetings of IBSA and dispense all official materials.
2. The committee shall receive and review all letters petitioning for affiliation, constitutions and bylaws, operative documents, statements of faith, (in accordance with Article III, Section 2) and other documents requested by the committee from those churches seeking to affiliate with IBSA. The committee shall then make recommendations to the IBSA messengers in session regarding churches requesting to affiliate with IBSA.
3. The Credentials Committee shall also review information regarding churches which may fail to fulfill the requirements of cooperation and shall make recommendations to IBSA in session regarding the cooperating status of said churches, including but not limited to issues of doctrinal affirmation. (See also Article IV Section 3)
4. It shall also be the responsibility of the Credentials Committee to count all ballots at the annual meeting.

Section 8. The Constitution Committee shall review the Constitution and the IBSA Officer and Committee Manual at least annually.

1. The committee shall submit a written report to each annual meeting of IBSA, containing an assessment of the work of IBSA in light of the Constitution's constraints, and any suggestions for adjustments or amendments. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on all proposed amendments to the Constitution. When requested, interpretation of the Constitution shall be given by the committee through its chairman or a designee of the committee.
2. In conjunction with the IBSA Executive Director, the committee shall make updates and changes to the Officer and Committee Manual.

Section 9. The Resolutions and Christian Life Committee shall prepare and submit to IBSA in session, all resolutions, which it deems appropriate for adoption, and report on all matters submitted to it by IBSA, with or without recommendations or amendments. All proposed resolutions shall be referred to the Resolutions and Christian Life Committee no later than the end of the first session of the annual meeting of IBSA.

Section 10. The Historical Committee shall procure and preserve historical records. In addition, the committee shall seek to keep the churches and messengers of IBSA informed of those items which it deems of historical significance to the life and ministry of IBSA.

Section 11. The Executive Director of IBSA shall serve as an ex-officio member without vote on all IBSA standing committees. The standing committees shall assign to the Executive Director of IBSA such work as they may require. Allocated resources shall be prescribed in the annual budget for all standing committees of IBSA.

Section 12. A detailed guideline of the work of each standing committee of IBSA shall be placed in the Officer and Committee Manual of IBSA. Such guideline shall

include a particular method for reviewing and dismissing members for violations of policy which it deems necessary for the effective and ethical service by its members.

Section 13. IBSA shall create such ad hoc committees as it may require. The nomination of committee members shall be made by the Committee on Committees. The allocated resources of each ad hoc committee shall come from available funds with the recommendation of any limitations of funds coming from the Executive Director of IBSA and approved by the Board of Directors or IBSA in session.

ARTICLE IX

RELATED ENTITIES

Section 1. The Illinois Baptist State Association is the sole member and controlling entity of the Illinois Baptist Children's Home and Family Services (BCHFS) and the Baptist Foundation of Illinois (BFI), all of which are corporations governed by the Illinois General Not For Profit Corporation Act.

Section 2. A Coordinating Council shall: 1) coordinate the work of IBSA, BCHFS and BFI to facilitate harmony and unity, 2) decide matters of dispute between the entities, and 3) give direction to the boards of each entity in matters not clearly defined in this Constitution, written policy, bylaws or law. The Coordinating Council shall be comprised of the president of IBSA, the vice-president of IBSA, the chair and the vice-chair of each entity's board, and the executive officer of each entity operating under the direction of each board.

1. Each member of the council shall be a voting member.
2. The president of IBSA and the vice-president of IBSA shall serve as the chair and the vice-chair, respectively, of the Coordinating Council.
3. The Coordinating Council shall meet at least semi-annually and report to IBSA during each annual meeting.
4. The president of IBSA shall be empowered to call additional meetings of the Coordinating Council as necessary.

Section 3. The IBSA alone in annual session shall authorize new entities set apart by IBSA and the composition of the board to govern such separate entity. The IBSA alone in annual session shall authorize the dissolution or merger of any of the IBSA entities.

Section 4. The president, vice president, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary of the IBSA, and executive director of the IBSA staff shall serve as ex-officio members of the boards of the BCHFS and BFI. The executive director of the IBSA staff shall serve without vote. The president, vice president, recording secretary and the assistant recording secretary of the IBSA shall serve with vote.

Section 5. No cooperating IBSA member church shall have more than two (2) members on the collective boards of the IBSA, BCHFS and BFI at any one time.

Section 6. The president of the Association shall report to IBSA in annual session the firm(s) of certified public accountants selected by BCHFS and BFI to audit the financial records of the respective entity for the ensuing year. BCHFS and BFI shall both submit a financial report to IBSA in annual session, and a proposed budget for its approval.

Section 7. The Nominating Committee of IBSA will nominate BCHFS and BFI board members for election by the IBSA in annual session, with consideration given to suggestions from board members and executive director of the respective entities.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS

All proposed amendments to the Constitution must be submitted in writing to the Constitution Committee no later than three (3) months prior to the Annual Meeting for possible presentation and first reading at the Annual Meeting. All motions to amend the constitution presented at the Annual Meeting will automatically be referred to the Constitution Committee by the Presiding Officer for review and recommendation to the messengers at the next annual meeting.

1. Such proposed amendments which may be recommended by the Constitution Committee shall be presented at two (2) consecutive annual meetings, the first for reading only, the second for reading, consideration, and vote.
2. All proposed amendments shall be reviewed by an attorney, parliamentarian, and/or financial advisor, at the discretion of the Constitution Committee chairman or the Executive Director of IBSA, prior to presentation to IBSA for consideration.
3. Such recommendations shall be considered by messengers during the first session of the annual meeting.
4. No vote is required at the time of first reading. Following the second reading and the subsequent consideration, a two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote of those messengers present and voting is required for approval of such recommendations.
5. Amendments shall become effective at the close of the annual meeting in which they are properly presented and approved, unless otherwise provided in the amendment.

ARTICLE XI

PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The president shall appoint a parliamentarian, subject to the approval of the messengers, to serve when IBSA is in session. Parliamentary rulings shall be governed by the current edition of the Robert's Rules of Order.

ARTICLE XII

INDEMINIFICATION

Section 1. Indemnification in Actions other than by or in the Right of the Corporation. The Corporation may indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed action, suit, or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative (other than an action by or in the Right of the Corporation) by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorneys' fees), judgments, fines, and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection with such action, suit, or proceeding, if such person acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Corporation and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful. The termination of any action, suit, or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, or conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the Corporation or, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, that the person had reasonable cause to believe that his or her conduct was unlawful.

Section 2. Indemnification in Actions by or in the Right of the Corporation. The Corporation may indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed action or suit by or in the right of the Corporation to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that such person is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the corporation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection with the defense or settlement of such action or suit, if such person acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Corporation, provided that no indemnification shall be made in respect of any claim, issue, or matter as to which such person shall have been adjudged to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of his or her duty to the Corporation, unless, and only to the extent that the court in which such action or suit was brought shall determine upon application that, despite the adjudication of liability, but in view of all the circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for such expenses as the court shall deem proper.

Section 3. Right to Payment of Expenses. To the extent that a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation has been successful, on the merits or otherwise, in the defense of any action, suit, or proceeding referred to in Sections 1 and 2 of this Article, or in defense of any claim, issue, or matter therein, such person shall be indemnified against expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection therewith.

Section 4. Determination of Conduct. Any indemnification under Sections 1 and 2 of this Article (unless ordered by a court) shall be made by the Corporation only as

authorized in the specific case, upon a determination that indemnification of the director, officer, employee, or agent is proper in the circumstances because he or she has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Sections 1 or 2 of this Article. Such determination shall be made (a) by the Board of Directors by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of trustees who were not parties to such action, suit, or proceeding; (b) if such a quorum is not obtainable, or even if obtainable, if a quorum of disinterested directors so directs, by independent legal counsel in a written opinion; or (c) by the members entitled to vote, if any.

Section 5. Payment of Expenses in Advance. Expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, suit, or proceeding may be paid by the Corporation in advance of the final disposition of such action, suit, or proceeding, as authorized by the Board of Directors in the specific case, upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the director, officer, employee, or agent to repay such amount, unless it shall ultimately be determined that he or she is entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation as authorized in this Article.

Section 6. Indemnification Not Exclusive. The indemnification provided by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those seeking indemnification may be entitled under any bylaw, agreement, vote of members or disinterested directors, or otherwise, both as to action in his or her official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office, and shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a director, officer, employee, or agent, and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, and administrators of such a person.

Section 7. Insurance. The Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation, or who is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, against any liability asserted against such person and incurred by such person in any such capacity, or arising out of his or her status as such, whether or not the Corporation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability under the provisions of this Article.

ARTICLE XIII

MERGER/DISSOLUTION

The Illinois Baptist State Association alone in annual session shall authorize the dissolution or merger of the IBSA.

Minutes of 2021 Annual Meeting of the Illinois Baptist State Association

November 3-4, 2021

Crowne Plaza Hotel, Springfield, Illinois

On November 3, 2021, the 115th Annual Meeting of the Illinois Baptist State Association was called to order at 1:30 p.m. by Heath Tibbetts, President of the association. President Tibbetts used the gavel made from wood of the James Smith home to call the meeting to order. Smith was the first Baptist to preach in the new Illinois territory in 1787. Tibbetts is the pastor of First Baptist Church in Machesney Park. President Tibbetts announced that the focus of the time together would be "On this rock, I will build my Kingdom."

Announcements concerning the events of the meeting were presented by the President and it was noted that resolutions needed to be submitted by 4:30 p.m. that afternoon. Adam Cruse, pastor of Living Faith Baptist Church in Sherman, led the group in the opening prayer. Following the prayer, Bob Dyer was appointed Parliamentarian for the meeting with no objections. Kevin Carrothers, Associational Mission Strategist for Salem South Association was appointed with no objections to assist the President in moderating portions of the meeting, as currently there is no Vice President for the association.

The first order of business of the meeting was to seat the messengers. Ryan Beck, messenger from First Baptist Church, Carrier Mills and the Chair of the IBSA Credentials Committee, reported there were 304 registered messengers at that time. The Credentials Committee recommended that those messengers as well as other duly elected messengers who would register later be seated. As a recommendation from a standing committee no second was required. The motion carried. The committee continued by reporting that sixteen new churches had applied for affiliation with the Illinois Baptist State Association. The committee recommended that the sixteen churches be approved for affiliation. The motion carried. Further, the committee recommended that the messengers of the sixteen churches be seated as messengers. The motion carried. The committee then brought the recommendation to disaffiliate six churches which had been non-cooperating for at least five years. The motion from the committee carried. Newly affiliating and disaffiliating churches are listed in the 2021 Book of Reports.

Wilson Wickiser, Swansea Baptist Church, Swansea and chair of the Committee on the Order of Business brought a motion to adopt the agenda for the meeting. The motion carried. The committee presented the locations and preachers for upcoming meetings. The first recommendation was that Paul Westbrook of Metro Community Church, Edwardsville bring the 2022 Annual Sermon and that Josh Crisp of the First Baptist Church of Bethalto serve as alternate speaker. The second recommendation was that the 2024 IBSA Annual Meeting be held at Ashburn Baptist Church in Orland Park, November 13-14. This motion was approved.

President Tibbetts announced that the committee reports began on page six of the Book of Reports. A motion to adopt these reports would take place on the second day of the meeting. In addition, there would be a vote on day 2 for changes to the IBSA Constitution.

Following the committee reports a theme interpretation video was shown, after which IBSA Executive Director Nate Adams affirmed the information on the video.

The next order of business was the election of the President of IBSA. Kevin Carrothers presided over the election and the remainder of the first session. Nominations for the office of President were entertained and the name of Heath Tibbetts was placed in nomination by Jeremy Byrd, Lincoln Avenue Baptist Church,

Jacksonville. There were no other nominations. A motion was made and seconded to elect Heath Tibbetts by acclamation to serve as the president. The motion carried.

Nominations for Recording Secretary of IBSA were requested and the name of Brianna Trowbridge, Samaria Missionary Baptist Church, Albion was placed in nomination. Steve Freels, pastor of First Baptist Church of Mt. Carmel presented her name. The motion was seconded and carried.

There was no miscellaneous business.

The next portion of the annual meeting included presentation of the partnership reports. Ashley Clayton brought the report from the SBC Executive Committee. He highlighted Vision 2025 and the six strategies it included. Videos from the mission boards were presented. The International Mission Board video was followed by word from Rusty Ford and his wife Jennifer, IMB missionaries from Illinois who are serving in Europe.

Kevin Ezell, President of the North American Mission Board presented a report via video. He emphasized to depend on the Lord and lean on each other.

The next report was a video presentation from Alliance Defending Freedom. The Alliance's goal is to assist churches with legal matters related to religious freedom, making sure churches are prepared in case they are challenged in court.

Following a short period of worship through music led by the worship team, IBSA Board Chair Andy Dewitt, First Baptist, Salem and Nate Adams, Executive Director presented the "Mission Illinois" report.

The IBSA Board of Directors recommended the following:

- A Cooperative Program goal of \$6.2 million for 2022
- A Cooperative Program Ratio of 56.5 percent for IBSA and 43.5 percent for the national SBC, excluding SBC recognized and Board approved shared expenses not to exceed 10 percent of the Cooperative Program goal
- That Cooperative Program funds received beyond the goal will be distributed 50/50 between IBSA and SBC

A motion for approval of these recommendations was approved as presented.

IBSA Board Chair Andy Dewitt then presented a motion to accept the proposed 2022 IBSA Budget and Salary Scale as presented in the Book of Reports. The motion was approved.

Executive Director Nate Adams then presented his portion of the report using a slide presentation as follows:

Highlights

- Thirteen new church plants
- Sixty churches are at various stages of development
- Sixteen newly affiliating churches
- Illinois will again host the Midwest Leadership Conference in January 2022.

The worship team returned to the platform and during this time the Minister's Relief Offering was taken. This offering is to assist pastors and their families who are facing unexpected difficulties.

The afternoon session concluded with the President's Message presented by President Heath Tibbetts. His message was titled "Find the Joy" and he emphasized there are enough lost people to go around, do you want to see your church grow?'

The first session of the 2021 IBSA Annual Meeting ended with prayer.

The evening session began at 6:15 with worship through music led by the worship team. The second session was called to order by President Heath Tibbetts who introduced Vaughn Sanders, First Baptist Church, Bolingbrook to open the session with prayer. The theme of the evening was "Each Church Thriving." During this session the IBSA celebrated the witness of God's blessings on his people; churches that thrived in one way or another, despite the trials of 2020-2021. Nate Adams facilitated the sharing of encouraging stories.

- 50th anniversary of the relocation of IBSA to Springfield
- Recognition of newly affiliated churches
- Remarkable stories from church planters, newly affiliated churches and multiplying churches
- Disaster Relief Food Distribution

The keynote speaker for the evening was Ben Mandrell, president of Lifeway Christian Resources and native of Tampico, IL. Following Dr. Mandrell's address, the meeting was closed with prayer.

Session three of the IBSA Annual Meeting began with worship through music.

The meeting was called to order at 8:31 by President Heath Tibbetts. The opening prayer was delivered by Joshua York, pastor of Second Baptist Church in Mt. Vernon.

According to the IBSA Constitution, it is the responsibility of the President to report to the Association the auditors selected by the three IBSA entity boards. Kevin Carrothers who was appointed in the opening session of this meeting presided as President Tibbetts presented the motion.

IBSA will engage the accounting firm of Capin Crouse, as auditor for IBSA for 2022.

Baptist Foundation of Illinois will use Sikich LLP Auditing Firm.

Baptist Children's Home and Family Services selected Atlas CPAs. The motion was seconded and approved.

The partnership video from Guidestone Financial Services was then presented.

Shelly Pender, chair of the Constitution Committee and messenger from First Baptist, Cobden, presented the report of the committee. It was clarified in terms of what would be presented at this meeting. Proposed updates found on pages 10 and 11 of the Book of Reports are for "first reading" and will be voted on at the Annual Meeting in 2022. The recommended amendment for "second reading" on page 11 is what was brought to the group for a vote.

The single proposed amendment to Article Five of the IBSA Constitution had to do with creating additional emergency measures if the IBSA Annual meeting cannot take place in-person. This recommendation came from the committee and did not require a second. There was no discussion and the motion carried.

Jim Hanger, chair of the Resolutions and Christian Life Committee and messenger from Logan Street, Mt. Vernon reported that each resolution would be voted on separately and there were no new resolutions presented to the committee by 4:30 p.m. on November 3.

The first resolution was a statement of unity among Illinois Baptist churches in opposition to the Equality Act awaiting action in the U.S. Congress. It was in harmony with the resolution approved by messengers to the Southern Baptist Convention in Nashville in 2021. The resolution came from the committee thus no second was needed. The motion carried.

The second resolution was entitled “Resolution on the Sufficiency of Scripture for Racial Reconciliation”. There was no discussion and the motion carried.

A resolution on “Churches’ Response to the Covid-19 Pandemic” was presented with no discussion and the motion carried.

The final resolution, on the 50th Anniversary of IBSA’s move to Springfield, IL, received no discussion and the motion carried. This resolution concluded the report of the committee.

The next action of the messengers included adoption of the committee reports as announced on the previous day of the meeting. The reports to be adopted are found in the Book of Reports and are listed here:

- the Committee on Committees
- the Historical Committee
- the Nominating Committee

There was no discussion of the reports and a motion to accept all reports as printed was approved.

There was no miscellaneous business.

Election of Vice President.

The name of Michael Nave from Cornerstone Church in Marion was placed in nomination by Tim Rhodus of Cross Church in Carlinville. A motion was made and seconded to elect Michael Nave, motion carried.

Joshua Steely of Chatham Baptist Church presented the name of Charlene Moe, of Chatham Baptist Church to serve as Assistant Recording Secretary. The motion was made and seconded, motion carried.

The WMU partnership report was presented via video by Illinois’ own Sandy Wisdom-Martin, Executive Director and Treasurer of the Women’s Missionary Union. She emphasized that we must thrive for the Kingdom, God’s dreams are bigger than ours.

The Chair of the Board of Baptist Children’s Home and Family Services, Rebecca Whittington, and Executive Director Denny Hydrick brought the report of BCHFS. Following the report the budget was presented for approval. There was no discussion and the motion carried.

Mr. Hydrick had announced his resignation earlier in the year and Chair Whittington recognized him as a man of prayer. She also presented him with a token of appreciation for his time of service to BCHFS.

The final board report from the Baptist Foundation of Illinois was given by Board Chair David Grove and Executive Director Doug Morrow. Mr. Morrow stressed the importance of God’s call for stewardship. The budget recommendation was presented and the motion to accept was approved.

Executive Director Nate Adams presented several special recognitions.

- Denny Hydrick, Executive Director of BCHFS

- IBSA Officers Heath Tibbetts, Sharon Carty, and Brianna Trowbridge
- IBSA Building 50th Anniversary

Executive Director Adams also welcomed the incoming IBSA Officers.

The retiring officers were presented with tokens of appreciation for their year of service to IBSA.

The Worship Team was welcomed to the stage one last time and recognized for their excellent work to organize and lead the services.

Following worship in music, Jeremy Byrd, pastor of Lincoln Avenue Baptist Church in Jacksonville presented the annual sermon. Pastor Bryd shared with the group that it is essential to worship God.

President Tibbetts announced the 2022 Annual Meeting will be at Metro Community Church in Edwardsville, November 2-3, 2022. President Tibbetts asked the assembly to pray for guidance and blessing of God's work. After prayer the 115th Annual Meeting of the Illinois Baptist State Association was declared adjourned.

Constitution Committee Report

The IBSA Constitution Committee met on March 25 to review and consider the IBSA Constitution, Bylaws for both the Baptist Children's Home and Family Services (BCHFS) and the Baptist Foundation of Illinois (BFI), and the Association's Officer and Committee Manual as directed in Article VIII, Section 8 of the IBSA Constitution.

During its August 24 meeting the Committee discussed several items. One item in the IBSA Constitution pertained to changes in wording for how long one can serve as an officer on the IBSA Board of Directors, and two items pertained to the Baptist Foundation of Illinois Bylaws, regarding the sale of real estate and assignment of trustees to a standing committee.

Following are the committee's recommended changes to the IBSA Constitution, which received first reading at the 2020 IBSA Annual Meeting and are now ready for discussion and action at the 2021 IBSA Annual Meeting. Also included are the recommended second reading changes to the IBSA Constitution and the BCHFS and BFI Bylaws, to be voted on by the association messengers at the 2021 IBSA Annual Meeting.

RECOMMENDED AMENDMENTS FOR FIRST READING

Recommended Changes (noted in red type) to the IBSA Constitution – First Reading

ARTICLE VII

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 8. The officers of the Board of Directors shall be a chair, a vice-chair, and a recording secretary. These officers shall be elected annually by the board at its last meeting prior to the IBSA annual meeting. They shall serve no more than two **consecutive** terms in any **one** elected board office. Members of the board whose final term expires shall not be eligible for re-election as an officer. Officers of the Board of Directors shall serve on the Advisory Committee of the board with vote and shall serve with vote on the board committee to which they are elected, however they shall serve on the other standing committees of the board as ex-officio members without vote.

Section 14. The board shall be organized into standing committees. Each committee shall have a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a secretary. At the last committee meeting of the year, officers are elected for the following year. The chairperson of the board, **in consultation with the Executive Director**, shall appoint each board member to one standing committee each year. The standing committees shall evaluate, approve, and recommend to the board such goals as may pertain to that committee's area of responsibility.

Recommended Changes (noted in red type) to the Baptist Foundation of Illinois Bylaws – First Reading

Article XI Purchase and Sale of Property

Old Language. All instruments conveying real estate shall be executed by both the Executive Director and the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees.

New Language: All instruments conveying real estate may be executed by the Executive Director without assignment to other personnel.

Article VI Committees of the Board of Trustees.

1. **Standing Committees.** The Board of Trustees shall be organized into five standing committees. Each committee shall have a chairperson, vice chairperson and a secretary that are elected at the Fall Board meeting. The Chairperson of the Board, in consultation with the Executive Director, shall appoint each Board member to at least one standing committee each year. The standing committees of the Board are:

Recommended Changes (noted in red type) to the Baptist Children’s Home and Family Services Bylaws – First Reading

Article VI Committees of the Board of Trustees

1. **Standing Committees.** The Board of Trustees shall be organized into four standing committees. The Chairperson of the Board, in consultation with the Executive Director, shall appoint each Board member to serve on at least one standing committee each year. Each committee shall have a chairperson, vice chairperson and a secretary that are elected at the Fall Board meeting. The standing committees of the Board are:

RECOMMENDED AMENDMENTS FOR SECOND READING

Recommended Changes (noted in red type) to the IBSA Constitution – Second Reading

**ARTICLE V
MEETINGS**

Section 1. IBSA shall meet in annual session at such time and place as it may determine.

Section 2. Special meetings of the IBSA may be called:

1. Upon the request of five (5) messengers at the Annual Meeting of IBSA in writing to the president of the IBSA or by two officers of the IBSA in writing to the chairman of the Board of Directors of IBSA.
2. Approval of a Special Meeting shall require a two-thirds affirmative vote of those present and voting either by the messengers at the IBSA Annual Meeting or by the IBSA Board of Directors.

Section 3. The time and/or place of the annual or special meetings of IBSA may be changed upon approval of two-thirds of the Board of Directors.

Section 4. If emergency circumstances prohibit an in-person IBSA Annual Meeting, the IBSA Board of Directors shall be authorized to conduct the essential operational business of IBSA and its entities, excluding Constitutional and Bylaw changes, until the time of the next Annual Meeting.

Section 54. In case of the absence of the vice president from the annual or special meetings of IBSA, the president shall appoint an assistant, subject to the approval of the messengers, to serve when IBSA is in session.

Section 65. In case of the absence of the president from the annual or special meetings of IBSA, the vice president shall assume the duties of the president, retaining the position of vice president. The vice president may appoint an assistant, subject to the approval of the messengers, to serve when IBSA is in session.

Section 76. Motions made by messengers dealing with internal operations or ministries of an entity shall be referred to the elected board of the entity for consideration and a report to the constituency and to the next Annual Meeting of IBSA. On all matters referred by the messengers of the IBSA shall respond in writing at the close of their report in the Book of Reports and the IBSA Annual, giving specific information on:

1. How the matter referred was considered,
2. How it was reported to the constituency; and,
3. Any actions on the matter taken by the entity or action proposed to the Annual Meeting.

Resolutions and Christian Life Committee Report

The Committee met March 23 and June 29 to discuss potential resolutions to be presented at the 2021 IBSA Annual Meeting and assigned topics to members. The Committee then reviewed drafted resolutions during its September 16 meeting.

The Committee recommends the following resolutions for vote at the 2021 IBSA Annual Meeting. Any additional resolutions by messengers are to be submitted by 4:30 p.m. on Wednesday, November 3. The Committee will meet to discuss any newly submitted resolutions, and either prepare those resolutions for presentation and vote at the Thursday afternoon session or recommend that they be referred to the 2022 Resolutions and Christian Life Committee for further consideration.

Resolution on the Equality Act

As messengers from local churches affiliated with the Illinois Baptist State Association (IBSA), in friendly cooperation with thousands of other churches across the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC), the following statements demonstrate our unity and agreement with sister SBC churches in opposition to the Equality Act, approved in resolution by messengers to the 2021 Southern Baptist Convention in Nashville, Tennessee.

WHEREAS, Scripture teaches that all people are created in God's image (Genesis 1:27), are designed to worship Him (Isaiah 43:7), and, established upon these veracities, hold fundamental gravity; and

WHEREAS, God's plan was the creation of two separate sexes, male and female (Genesis 1:27; Matthew 19:4), which define the essential distinction that God has rooted in the very ecology of the human race; and

WHEREAS, The Bible provides us clear directives and confines concerning what comprises God-honoring expression of human sexuality (Genesis 2:24; Hebrews 13:4; 1 Corinthians 6:9; Romans 1:26-27); and

WHEREAS, Southern Baptists resolved in 2014 "On Transgender Identity" that, "The Fall of man into sin and God's subsequent curse have introduced brokenness and futility into God's good creation," and therefore; as a result, some are allured to question God's gift of sexuality; and

WHEREAS, The Equality Act seeks to modify the Civil Rights Act of 1964 by addition of prohibition of discrimination on the base of sexual orientation or gender identity; and

WHEREAS, The First Amendment of the Constitution prohibits Congress from crafting any law forbidding the free exercise of religion; and

WHEREAS, as stated in the 2021 SBC Resolution and adopted by the 2021 SBC messengers, "Congressman Chuck Schumer and Senator Ted Kennedy wrote that "governments should not substantially burden religious exercise without compelling justification" in the Religious Freedom Restoration Act of 1993 (RFRA), which President

Bill Clinton signed into law after the act passed with prodigious bipartisan support in the Congress;" and

WHEREAS, If ratified, the Equality Act would overtly reject RFRA claims concerning the Equality Act and would openly authorize the government to place significant afflictions upon religious exercise without having to validate any persuasive justification to do so; and

WHEREAS, This change in the significance of the right to free exercise enjoyed by all Americans, if it were to take place, would bring far-reaching and historic alterations to religious liberty with demoralizing effects to this foundational freedom; and

WHEREAS, Faith-based charities whose fundamental religious beliefs about human dignity, sexuality, gender, and marriage shape their ministry policies would be required under the Equality Act to choose between freely exercising those fundamental religious beliefs or deserting their ministries; and

WHEREAS, This type of lawmaking castigation against faith-based charities for serving the common good according to their valued beliefs would be unparalleled; and,

WHEREAS, The Equality Act would force healthcare providers to partake in and provide abortions, hormone therapies, and other procedures which may defy their genuinely held religious beliefs; and

WHEREAS, The Equality Act would emasculate the bipartisan, nearly half-century-old Hyde Amendment, which preserves federal taxpayer dollars from funding abortion; and

WHEREAS, The Equality Act would challenge decades of hard-fought civil rights safeguards for women and girls by threatening competition in sports and ignoring the privacy concerns women justly have concerning sharing sleeping accommodations and intimate amenities with members of the opposite sex; and

WHEREAS, By departure from our foundations of municipal forbearance, this acrimonious legislation would undermine the capability of Americans who differ in belief to work together for the communal good; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the messengers to the Illinois Baptist State Association meeting in Springfield, Illinois, November 3-4, 2021, spread love and benevolence to those who identify as gay, lesbian, bisexual, or transgender and invite all members of this community to trust in Christ and to experience regeneration in the gospel; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we declare that Christ offers forgiveness of sin for those who turn from their sins and believe on Christ; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we believe efficient Gospel ministry to persons who consider themselves part of the LGBTQ community necessitates that we speak to them and concerning them with respect and Christlike love while holding resolutely to our biblical principles on these issues, and be it further

RESOLVED, That we, therefore, embolden our fellow Illinois Baptist State Association messengers to engage dialogue of the Equality Act and interrelated matters with this in mind; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we vigorously contest the Equality Act and desire Congress to rebuff this treacherous legislation, which epitomizes one of the paramount dangers to religious liberty in our nation's history; and be it finally

RESOLVED, That we uphold the role of churches in providing compassionate care, biblical truth, and invigorating hope to men, women, and children, irrespective of sexual orientation or gender identity, while jubilantly celebrating God's good purpose in sexuality as clearly conveyed in Scripture.

Resolution on the Sufficiency of Scripture for Racial Reconciliation

WHEREAS, 2 Timothy 3:16-17 tells us, "All Scripture is inspired by God and is profitable for teaching, for rebuking, for correcting, for training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work," and

WHEREAS, Genesis 1:27 states "God created man in his own image;" and

WHEREAS, Acts 17:26 states "From one man God has made every nationality to live over the whole earth," and

WHEREAS, Galatians 3:26-28 reminds us "Through faith we are all sons of God in Christ Jesus...There is no Jew or Greek, slave or free, male and female, since you are all one in Christ Jesus," and

WHEREAS, Romans 12:18 clearly states "If possible, as far as it depends on you, live at peace with everyone;" and

WHEREAS, Revelation 7:9 states "After this I looked, and there was a vast multitude from every Nation, Tribe, People and language which no one could number standing before the throne and before the Lamb;" now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, Messengers to the Illinois Baptist State Association meeting in Springfield, Illinois November 3-4, 2021 affirm the sufficiency of Scripture on race and racial reconciliation; and be it therefore

RESOLVED, We reaffirm our agreement with biblically faithful Southern Baptist condemnations of racism in all forms; and be it further

RESOLVED, We reaffirm the Scriptural truth that all persons are made in the image and likeness of God, and are therefore worthy of respect, dignity, and opportunity; and be it further

RESOLVED, We affirm the primary human problem is sin against God, which manifests in all aspects of human brokenness, including racism, oppression, and discrimination; and be it further

RESOLVED, We affirm the ultimate solution for the sins of racism, oppression, and discrimination is in repentance and forgiveness of sin, found and proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ, and be it finally

RESOLVED, We affirm that through reconciliation with Christ, we as Illinois Baptists seek to promote healing and unity in our world by standing together against racism, oppression, and discrimination in all their forms and expressions.

Resolution on the Church's Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic

WHEREAS, The COVID-19 pandemic presented unprecedented challenges to nearly every institution, including churches, in Illinois, across the U.S., and around the world, and forced many congregations to temporarily suspend in person gatherings; and

WHEREAS, Churches of the Illinois Baptist State Association (IBSA) made numerous pivots to address new and urgent needs amid the COVID-19 pandemic, both in their congregations and in their communities, and to support first responders and healthcare workers with prayer, encouragement, and material supplies; and

WHEREAS, Pastors and church leaders were called to balance competing priorities, including the Scriptural mandate not to neglect meeting together (Hebrews 10:25), the commands to love God and love our neighbors (Mark 12:30-31), and the call to submit to governing authorities (Romans 13:1), as well as the desire to protect and promote public health; and

WHEREAS, The Covid-19 pandemic has brought to light new questions concerning religious liberty, especially as it relates to the restrictions placed on church gatherings compared to those placed on businesses and other organizations; and some congregations in the U.S. have been treated differently and therefore unfairly, particularly related to reopening, compared to the other establishments in their communities; and

WHEREAS, We as Christians trust in Christ's statement that while life will bring trouble; we can take heart because He has overcome the world (John 16:33) and our faith and hope are in God (1 Peter 1:21); now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, IBSA churches are urged to continue defending the protections granted in the U.S. Constitution for our houses of worship and others, committing to stand firm on our calling as Christ's church while seeking peaceful resolution when conflicts arise; and be it further

RESOLVED, IBSA churches are urged to continue seeking new ways to serve in our communities with urgent needs, health concerns, and with new and difficult circumstances brought by the pandemic, and those who do not yet know Christ, always giving reason for the hope we have in him (1 Peter 3:15); and be it further

RESOLVED, We as an IBSA family of churches are urged to “make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace” (Ephesians 4:3), acknowledging that the differences of opinions and practices revealed during the pandemic do not exceed our shared faith and calling in Christ, and be it finally

RESOLVED, IBSA churches are urged to continue to pray fervently for an end to the pandemic, for the healing and restoration for those who are sick, for those who have suffered loss, for medical professionals and first responders that have been serving on the front lines, and for the Lord’s continued transforming work through every circumstance, trusting in the God who is making all things new (Revelation 21:5).

Resolution on the 50th Anniversary of IBSA’s Move to Springfield

WHEREAS, 2021 marks fifty years since the Illinois Baptist State Association staff and offices relocated from Carbondale to Springfield, Illinois; and

WHEREAS, The IBSA Building was first dedicated to the service of the Lord and to Illinois Baptist churches on November 11, 1971 at the IBSA Annual Meeting held in Springfield, Illinois, which is also the site of the 2021 meeting; and

WHEREAS, Visionary Baptist leaders in the 1960s saw growing spiritual need in the vast mission fields all across Illinois following the attention of two national Southern Baptist Convention Annual Meetings in Chicago in the preceding years, and

WHEREAS, The relocation of IBSA offices to Springfield represented a bold, missional move toward expanding the reach and ministries of Baptist churches throughout the state, and toward making the IBSA staff and services more accessible to all member churches; and

WHEREAS, The prime location, size and quality of facilities, and continued renovations and beautification of the IBSA Building located at the prominent corner of Stevenson and Dirksen have served IBSA churches well for the past half century, and given Illinois Baptists an attractive and positive witness to both the Springfield community and to visitors from around the state, nation, and world; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the messengers meeting at the November 3-4, 2021 IBSA Annual Meeting in Springfield commend the vision and stewardship of IBSA’s leaders who undertook the many challenges of moving the IBSA offices to Springfield; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the churches, board, and staff of IBSA are to be congratulated for so carefully maintaining and updating the IBSA Building over these fifty years, and are encouraged to continue stewarding this facility for the glory of God, and for the benefit and gospel mission of IBSA churches for many years to come.

The past couple of years have provided the IBSA Board the opportunity to adjust and be creative in carrying out its responsibilities. We've met virtually the past four Board meetings. Only a few years ago, who could have anticipated that we would "go virtual" in attending to the tasks for which the IBSA Board is responsible. Nevertheless, IBSA staff and our Board members adjusted well to the new format, and from the Chair's perspective, the meetings went smoothly.

During the spring meeting, the Board was introduced to IBSA's Vision Frame. This is a shift from the past when churches and associations were more program driven. Today, it seems expedient to be process driven. The mission of our State Association is to "Deliver network values that inspires each church to **thrive** in health, growth, and mission." The supportive values are: "At IBSA, we value measurable **Excellence** for the churches, delivered in practical **Helpfulness** to churches, that inspires cooperative **Engagement** with churches, and leads to Gospel **Advance** through churches.

The ReFocus revitalization process is off to a great start. Some 40 churches have expressed interest and becoming involved in the process. In addition, several local associations are also looking to participate in revitalization. Revitalization will be a major emphasis for years to come as Illinois Baptists seek to continue to minister and spread the good news of Jesus in an everchanging culture.

I personally wish to thank the 2021 IBSA Board for their work and involvement in making the Illinois Baptist State Association one of the best state conventions. Nate, and the IBSA staff do incredible work in our state. I'm also grateful to the chairs of the three committees of the Board: to Jay Simala, Strategic Planning Committee; Josh Bledsoe, Resource Development Committee; and Bob Dyer, Administrative Committee and to the members of these committees.

Please continue to pray for our Executive Director, the IBSA Staff, and the proposed new IBSA Board officers for 2022. The Chair is Jeff Logsdon, Vice Chair Bruce Kirk, and Secretary Terry Foster. And continue to pray for and encourage IBSA pastors and churches. This is a great state association and with God's grace it will continue to be.



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT
Illinois Baptist State Association
Dr. Nate Adams

The IBSA Board of Directors approved four major goals for 2021, along with multiple metrics for each goal:

Praying for God's guidance and power, and cooperating with associations and other partners, we will strive to truly assist churches as we:

- 1. Develop Leaders:** Effectively engage a growing network of church pastors, staff, planters and other leaders in spiritual, relational development processes, striving for breakthrough growth in leaders that helps transform churches into higher levels of effectiveness.
- 2. Inspire Cooperation:** Effectively communicate and consult with IBSA churches and leaders, continually developing excellent relationships and trustworthy services and processes that strengthen Baptist identity, affinity, and cooperation.
- 3. Stimulate Church Health and Evangelistic Growth:** Effectively train and resource churches in the making, maturing, and multiplication of both disciples and leaders, and in the development of new and improved ministries.
- 4. Catalyze Evangelistic Church Planting and Missions:** Effectively facilitate the movement of evangelistic volunteers from churches to their Acts 1:8 mission fields, and the multiplication of evangelistic, cooperating Baptist churches and pastors throughout Illinois.

The IBSA staff has been pursuing each of these goals and corresponding metrics, many of which cannot be fully reported until after year-end 2021 Annual Church Profile data is available from churches in January 2022. The Coronavirus pandemic that immersed the country and world throughout most of 2020, and that has continued into most of 2021, has had several negative impacts on these goals and metrics, but some positive.

By the end of 2021, 9 to 12 new church plants are anticipated (14 new churches were planted in 2020, and 11 in 2019), and about 65 church plants are in some stage of development. In addition, 16 new churches are being recommended for affiliation at the 2021 IBSA Annual Meeting, up from 12 in 2020. Baptisms in IBSA churches were down 42% in 2020, after being down only 3% in 2019, and up 6.8% in 2018. And while continued travel restrictions and health concerns continue to restrict the number of mission trips possible in 2021, 1,307 individuals and 304 churches have engaged in at least 29 IBSA-coordinated missions projects through August. During a year when several disaster relief ministries have been somewhat restricted, volunteers have pivoted to a food distribution ministry that has served thousands in need during the various pressures of the Coronavirus pandemic.

IBSA's two camps properties, Lake Sallateeska and Streator Baptist Camps, had forced sabbaticals for most of 2020, due to state-mandated Coronavirus restrictions and safety precautions. But attendance at both camps has rebounded thus far in 2021 to about half to two-thirds of 2019 levels.

2021 marks the 50th year of IBSA in Springfield and the 50th anniversary of the IBSA Building on the corner of Dirksen and Stevenson. A special celebration of that milestone is planned during the 2021 IBSA Annual meeting, which is being held in Springfield, as it was when the building was first dedicated in November 1971.

In spite of this year's ongoing Coronavirus pandemic restrictions, IBSA will again surpass its goal of having more than 600 pastors and leaders involved in leadership development events and groups (635 through August). In addition to these leadership development efforts, 4,980 individuals from 429 churches have participated in one or more of IBSA's training offerings through August. The Midwest Leadership Summit, planned by 9 cooperating Midwest Baptist state conventions every two or three years, will again be hosted by IBSA in Springfield in January 2022, with more than 1,100 participants anticipated.

In 2020 IBSA began a new church revitalization ministry, under the leadership of Scott Foshie. Our goals in this area involve enlisting both pastors and churches in separate self-assessment processes, and then beginning relationships through trained coaches that may lead to more intensive revitalization process with certified pathfinders. Many pastors found it necessary to postpone their plans for revitalization processes in 2020 due to pandemic-related needs such as virtual worship services, online giving, and the requirements of socially distant ministry. Still, through August of 2021, 57 pastors and 47 churches have completed a revitalization readiness assessment. And 33 churches and 14 Illinois Associations are actively participating in a revitalization strategy.

Year-end measurements of missions giving from churches will not be available until Annual Church Profiles are compiled in early 2022. Through September, however, Cooperative Program giving is up 5% over 2020, though still 5% below 2019's pre-pandemic level. Mission Illinois Offering receipts through August are up compared to the previous year by an encouraging 41%, though most churches receive the MIO offering in September and October. The 2021 IBSA Budget anticipates a return in CP giving to \$6.2 million by year-end, and a draw on up to \$500,000 in reserves as necessary. However, through August 2021 only \$109,000 in reserves have been needed.

While face-to-face contact has continued to be a challenge in 2021, IBSA staff have made a concerted effort to connect with and engage pastors and churches in 2021, through phone, e-mail, webinars, town halls, and videoconferencing. Through August, our staff has had direct contact with 65% of IBSA churches, with a goal of reaching at least 85% by the end of the year. And for the fourth time in five years, *The Illinois Baptist* was again named top Christian Newspaper by the Evangelical Press Association.

IBSA continues to be engaged in an ongoing, 3-year strategic planning process with consultants from Denominee that is scheduled to run through 2022. This is in partnership with the North American Mission Board, who is also subsidizing Denominee's consultation with 8 other Baptist state conventions. One significant outcome of this process for IBSA is a new mission statement, which is to "Deliver network value that inspires each church to thrive, in health, growth, and mission."

The IBSA missionaries, staff, and I appreciate so much the partnership and cooperation of IBSA churches and consider it a joy to serve the Lord through this ministry. We welcome any questions or input that may assist us in serving IBSA churches more effectively.

1. Chairman Andy DeWitt called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM.
2. Chairman Andy DeWitt called for the adoption of the agenda. Bob Dyer made motion to adopt the agenda which was seconded by Josh Bledsoe. Motion was approved.
3. Chairman Andy DeWitt recognized Rene Escalante who was asked to read from Scripture. He read from Matthew 18:19-20 and then led in prayer.
4. Chairman Andy DeWitt called for the adoption of the September 15, 2020 Meeting Minutes. A motion was made by Rob Windes and seconded by John Mancha. The motion passed.
5. Chairman Andy DeWitt welcomed visitor Denny Hydrick and introduced and welcomed new board members.
Rene Escalante, Bruce Kirk, Noah Lee, Joel Newton, Carrie Tabor.
6. Roll Call was taken by Mike Jameson with each board member answering here or present.
7. Announcements were made by Chairman Andy DeWitt. He noted Sammy Simmons was invited, however, because of a previous engagement he was unable to attend but communicated his gratitude for the opportunity to serve IBSA.
8. Chairman Andy DeWitt recognized Denny Hydrick who brought greetings from the Baptist Children's Home and Family Services staff. He gave a quick update of what BCHFS had been able to accomplish over the past year. While COVID impacted activity,

BCHFS was able to open GraceHaven Pregnancy Clinic in Mt. Vernon. He asked for continued prayer. The annual Mother's Day offering is coming, and a change in approach was mentioned. Leadership staff was going to engage in a two-day retreat to do some strategic planning. He also welcomed any ideas pastors may have as this is an extension of IBSA ministry. Denny added the counseling ministry is able to assist ministers and their spouses remotely for free from anywhere in the state. He thanked IBSA for the opportunity to provide us with this update.

9. Chairman Andy DeWitt read the following recommendations from IBSA Nominating Committee.

The IBSA Nominating Committee recommends that Pamela White (The Ridge Church, Carbondale in Nine Mile Association) fill the vacancy on the Baptist Foundation of Illinois Board of Trustees (a Class A term expiring in 2021).

The IBSA Nominating Committee recommends that David Smith (First Baptist Church, Grayville in Greater Wabash Association) fill the vacancy on the Baptist Children's Home and Family Services Board of Trustees (a Class A term expiring in 2021).

These recommendations came from an Association committee to the board between annual sessions. A motion was made to accept the recommendations by Jeff Logsdon and seconded by Jerry Higdon. The motion passed.

10. Chairman Andy DeWitt read the following recommendations from IBSA Committee on Committees.

The IBSA Committee on Committees recommends that Jeffrey Williams (New Christian Fellowship, Fairview Heights in Metro East Baptist Association) fill the vacancy on the IBSA Resolutions and Christian Life Committee (a Class B term expiring in 2022).

The IBSA Committee on Committees recommends that Lawrence Haskin (Household of Faith Christian Assembly, Markham in Chicago Metro Baptist Association) fill the vacancy on the IBSA Resolutions and Christian Life Committee (a Class B term expiring in 2022).

The IBSA Committee on Committees recommends that Claude White (Grace Baptist Church, Peoria in Metro Peoria Baptist Association) fill the vacancy on the IBSA Resolutions and Christian Life Committee (a Class C term expiring in 2023).

The IBSA Committee on Committees recommends that Derrick Taylor (Net Community, Staunton in Macoupin Baptist Association) fill the vacancy on the IBSA Committee on Order of Business (a Class C term expiring in 2023).

The IBSA Committee on Committees recommends that James Shannon (Peoples Community Church, Glen Ellyn in Chicago Metro Baptist Association) fill the vacancy on the IBSA Credentials Committee (a Class B term expiring in 2022).

This recommendation came from an Association committee to the board between annual sessions. A motion was made to accept the recommendation by Jeanette Cloyd and seconded by Bruce Kirk. The motion passed.

11. Chairman Andy DeWitt read the following informational report regarding Committee Selections to Board Officer Nominating Committee.

The following names were submitted to serve on the Board Officer Nominating Committee Drake Caudill (Administrative), Luke Henry (Strategic Planning), and Josh Bledsoe (Resource Development).

12. Chairman Andy DeWitt yielded the floor to IBSA Executive Director Nate Adams for the Executive Director's Report.

The Executive Director began his report by introducing new IBSA staff members, Fran Trascritti, Scott Harris, Bob Evaul, and Roger Marshall. The Executive Director recognized Kris Kell and his 20 years of service to IBSA.

The Executive Director proceeded to note key Board Committee responsibilities:

Strategic Planning – Annual Survey, ACP, Goals

Resource and Development – Budget Accountability and Philosophy

Administrative – Evaluate Executive Director and Board

The Executive Director proceeded to review the 2020 ACP Data Summary and reminded us that the ACP Data, the Church Needs Survey Results, and the Year-End Report on 2020 IBSA Goals are the tools the IBSA uses to determine how things are going in the member churches. Nate noted that nearly every ACP category was down for 2020 because of COVID. He explained a few anomalies in the reported data. Nate reported while giving was down in 2020, giving had rebounded so far in 2021 to a level closer to 2019.

IBSA churches have been resilient. 15 churches in danger of closing their doors were given grants totaling \$41,000.00. CP giving was down 12%, MIO giving was down 15%, and undesignated giving was down < 3%.

IBSA was able to navigate the budget shortfall through reduced spending and through the aid of the CARES Act's PPP funding.

The Executive Director's report moved on to the 2020 Church Needs Survey Results. He noted that this year there were 4 new COVID specific questions. He shared the following results.

Covid Specific Questions

- Respondents rated the COVID-related services they received from IBSA during the time of limited meetings an average of 3.7/5.0, with 60.3% rating these services 4 or 5.
- Churches' greatest need during 2020 COVID-19 limitations were:
 - Spiritual Support and Inspiration (3.6/5.0)
 - Ideas and Examples for Ministry During the Pandemic (3.6/5.0),
 - Trustworthy Information on Covid-related Regulations, Meeting Limitations, and Religious Freedom Insights (3.5/5.0)
- What churches need most from IBSA as they come out of the pandemic:
 - Ways to Do Ministry and Mobilize that Meet the Unique Challenges of a Crisis (56%),
 - Rebuilding the Fellowship and Purpose of the Local Church Body (53%)
 - Continued Use of Technology for Worship, Discipleship, Evangelism, Etc. (50%)

Church Ministry Needs questions

- Churches indicated they need most assistance with:
 - Leadership Development (59% rated 4 or 5),
 - Worship and Technology (52% 4 or 5) and
 - Church Revitalization (50.7% rated 4 or 5)
 - 52.3% of respondents indicated their church's need for revitalization as either Urgently Needed (11.8%) or Needed Now (40.5%).
- Churches believe IBSA should give more time or emphasis to:
 - Training and Consultation to Revitalize Churches (4.0/5.0),
 - Providing Missions Opportunities Within Illinois (3.9/5.0),
 - Planting Churches Among Ethnic and Language Groups (3.9/5.0), and
 - Ministry to Children and Students (3.9/5.0).

Cooperative Program and Communications

- 62% of respondents indicated that the percentage of Cooperative Program giving sent to the national SBC should stay the same, 29% indicated that a greater percentage of CP giving should remain in Illinois, and 9% indicated that a greater percentage should go to the national SBC.
- Respondents' greatest engagement during the past (pandemic) year was with:
 - The Illinois Baptist Newspaper (84%)
 - The IBSA.org web site (81%),
 - Promotional E-mails (65%)
 - IBSA NOW e-newsletter (60%)
 - Personal Contacts such as visits, phone calls, texts, or personal e-mails (58%).
- Respondents considered the most effective forms of communication with churches to be
 - Personal Contact (64.2% 4 or 5),
 - The Illinois Baptist Newspaper (63.4% 4 or 5),
 - the IBSA NOW E-Newsletter (55% 4 or 5),
 - Promotional E-mails (54.1% 4 or 5), and the IBSA.org web site (53.7%).

Overall IBSA Effectiveness

- The effectiveness of respondents' churches connection with IBSA remained steady at 3.4% in 2020, the same as 2019.
- The overall effectiveness score of IBSA increased by .4 from 2019, to 3.8. The 3-year average is 3.6.

About the Survey:

- 270 participants responded to IBSA's annual Church Needs Survey.
- 209 (18% participation) were pastors or church staff and 61 (.5% participation) were from the wider audience of IBSA's wider e-mail list.

The Executive Director then presented the Year-End Report on 2020 IBSA Goals.

IBSA adapted (pivoting to provide value), where they were able to meet goals, having good progress toward meeting goals, or not meet goals. Examples were provided from each team.

- Goal #1 – Develop Leaders – Good results with webinars, town halls and zone consultants taking lead in contacting pastors.

- Goal #2 – Inspire Cooperation – Engagement was at an all-time high. CP and other giving down.
- Goal #3 – Stimulate Church Health and Growth – Pastors were more eager to have help, but engagement with lay leaders was down. Partnership with Illinois associations in training strategies and events was higher than planned.
- Goal #4 – Catalyze Evangelistic Church Planting and Missions – Churches as a whole, were not able to engage in many activities such as mission trips. However, 14 new churches were planted, up from 11 the previous year.

Lastly the Executive Director presented the new IBSA Vision Framework with the new mission statement: Deliver network value that inspires each church to thrive in health, growth, and mission.

Nate then brought the report to a close.

13. Chairman Andy DeWitt recognized Jay Simala, chair of the Strategic Planning Committee for the Strategic Planning Committee Report. The minutes from the February 22, 2021 meeting were recognized as part of the advanced materials. The following recommendation was made for the board to consider:

The IBSA Board's Strategic Planning Committee recommended to the full IBSA Board approval of the proposed IBSA "Vision Frame," including the entity's newly stated Mission, Values, Strategies, and Measures, as well as the proposed 2022 Objectives and Key Results draft document for the purpose of drafting the 2022 IBSA Annual Budget, with the understanding that a final version of the 2022 Objectives and Key Results document will be presented at the September 14, 2021 IBSA Board of Directors Meeting.

Nate further clarified the details were part of the advanced materials as well as a one-page summary. A final draft of how the Vision Frame will be measured as well as the budget will be ready for the August 9-10 committee meeting and the September 14, 2021 IBSA Board of Directors meeting.

The recommendation was approved.

14. Chairman Andy DeWitt recognized the Resource Development Committee chairman Josh Bledsoe for his report. Two items were recommended by the committee. It was noted the audit report was one of the cleanest in the past three years with only one minor correction. Recommendations were suggested by the audit company to prevent the need for the correction which have already been implemented.

2020 Audit Report Recommendation

The IBSA Board's Resource Development Committee recommends to the full IBSA Board approval of the 2020 IBSA Audit by CapinCrouse as presented.

The recommendation was approved.

Also, the committee recommended the following 2022 Budget and Cooperative Program Goal & Ratio Recommendation.

That the Executive Director prepare a 2022 budget and salary structure based on:

- a Cooperative Program Goal of \$6,200,000,
- utilization of up to \$700,000 in IBSA's financial reserves (due to the potentially continuing effects of the Coronavirus pandemic),
- a Cooperative Program ratio of 56.5 percent/43.5 percent (IBSA/SBC), excluding shared expenses not to exceed 10% of the Cooperative Program Goal,
- and with Cooperative Program funds received beyond the budget goal to be distributed at a ratio of 50 percent/50 percent (IBSA/SBC).

The recommendation was approved.

15. Chairman Andy DeWitt recognized Administrative Committee Chairman Bob Dyer for his report from the Administrative Committee. Administrative Committee Chairman Bob Dyer made note the committee met. No recommendations were presented during the main session, however two items the committee discussed during their meeting were mentioned: the possible need for a policy review regarding the need for a conflict-of-interest policy for the IBSA Board of

Directors. This is being researched. Secondly, the annual evaluation of the executive director was reviewed and there was an item to be considered during the executive session.

16. There was no miscellaneous business to be handled.
17. Chairman Andy DeWitt called the meeting into Executive Session with no objections.
18. By statement Chairman Andy DeWitt called the meeting to a close. There were no objections. Closing Prayer was offered by Bruce Kirk.

1. The virtual meeting was called to order by chairman Andy DeWitt at 10:00 AM.
2. A motion to adopt an amended agenda that added a roll call of IBSA Board Members attending was requested. Motion was made by Jeff Logsdon and seconded by Jeanette Cloyd. The motion was approved.
3. Chairman Dewitt greeted the visitors attending and provided instructions regarding voting procedures for approval/disapproval of motions and recommendations introduced in the meeting.
4. The roll was called by Secretary Mike Jameson. There were 27 members present.
5. Scripture reading beginning with 2 Corinthians 1:8 and prayer was offered by Mark Goldman.
6. Greetings were brought by Doug Morrow from the Baptist Foundation of Illinois and a brief review of the past years' ministry efforts were presented. The highlights included the ongoing transition to new accounting software for BFI and the introduction of Biblical financial management training modules both for individuals and churches affiliated with the IBSA.
7. A motion to adopt the March 30, 2021 meeting minutes was made by Bob Dyer and seconded by Bob Dickerson. The motion was approved.
8. Luke Henry presented the report from the Board Officer Nominating Committee and the following slate of candidates were recommended.

Chair – Jeff Logsdon, Vice Chair - Bruce Kirk, Secretary – Terry Foster

The committee recommendation was approved.

9. Chairman Andy DeWitt recognized Executive Director Nate Adams for the Executive Director's Report.

The executive director provided a power point presentation which reviewed each board committee's function and responsibilities during the year for any new board member's reference.

Board members completing their terms were then recognized along with the Board Officers who were also completing their terms.

IBSA Staff member Barbara Troeger was recognized for her ten years of service.

A staffing update was then presented. There are several open staff positions at this time. It has been difficult to fill some positions because of limited candidates available. The efforts to fill these positions is ongoing.

IBSA is still responding to the pandemic and assisting churches where needed. Church relief grants had not changed since March.

2021 IBSA camp attendance was down up to half compared to prior years, but it was better than no camps in 2020.

CP giving is up 5% compared to 2020 but down 5% compared to 2019.

Online connections are down but still up compared to 2019.

Final preparations for the 2021 IBSA Annual Meeting in November are ongoing.

IBSA is preparing for the 2022 Midwest Leadership Conference in January.

Mid-year metrics regarding: Develop Leaders, Inspire Cooperation, Stimulate Church Health and Growth, and Catalyze Evangelistic Church Planting and Missions were presented.

Four Lanes of Restructuring Process – in lane three currently. Restructuring to processes as opposed to programs, continuing Refocus with Rob Peters, and Denominee with Will Mancini – four quarterly meetings were held.

“Next Step” conversations and consultations for 2022 – is a strategy to lead consultations in addition to events and trainings since each church is unique.

Nate then addressed the theme for the 2021 annual meeting – Thrive.

This is the 50th year for the IBSA building and there are plans for guests to the annual meeting to tour the facility. Nate reported that he plans to recommend additional renovations to the first floor of the IBSA building at the Board's February and March 2022 meetings.

Nate then concluded his report.

10. Chairman Andy DeWitt recognized Strategic Planning Committee chairman Jay Simala for the Strategic Planning Committee Report. The committee met and there were no action items to bring before the Board.

11. Chairman Andy DeWitt recognized Resource Development Committee chairman Josh Bledsoe for the Resource Development Committee Report and Recommendations. The following two action items were presented.

- Recommendation of 2021 Cooperative Agreement with BFI:
The Resource Development Committee recommends to the IBSA Board of Directors that there is no longer a need for a formal Cooperative Agreement between IBSA and BFI due to the financial stability of BFI. Recommendation was approved.
- Recommendation of the 2021 IBSA Budget, CP Ratio, and Pay Scale:

The IBSA Board of Directors' Resource Development Committee recommends the proposed 2022 budget, salary structure, and CP ratio be approved as printed for presentation to the IBSA messengers at the IBSA Annual Meeting, based on a Cooperative Program Goal of \$6,200,000 and a Cooperative Program ratio of 56.5%/43.5% (IBSA/SBC), excluding shared expenses not to exceed 10% of the Cooperative Program Goal, and with Cooperative Program funds received beyond the budget goal to be distributed at a ratio of 50%/50%. Recommendation was approved.

12. Chairman Andy DeWitt recognized Administrative Committee chairman Bob Dyer for the Administrative Committee Report & Recommendations. The following two informational items were presented.

IBSA Constitution

ARTICLE VII

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 8. The officers of the Board of Directors shall be a chair, a vice-chair, and a recording secretary. These officers shall be elected annually by the board at its last meeting prior to the IBSA annual meeting. **They shall serve no more than two consecutive terms in any one elected board office.** Members of the board who's final term expires shall not be eligible for re-election as an officer. Officers of the Board of Directors shall serve on the Advisory Committee of the board with vote and shall serve with vote on the board committee to which they are elected, however they shall serve on the other standing committees of the board as ex-officio members without vote.

Action Item

- The Administrative Committee Recommended the following conflict of interest policy addition to IBSA Board Handbook:

Policy Type: Governance Process III-3.4

Policy Title: Conflict of Interest Disclosure

In order to assist Board members to comply with the Board Members' Code of Conduct (Policy III-3.3) the IBSA Board of Directors has established a process to avoid conflicts of interest, and to disclose any conflicting interest should it occur.

Annually, Board members will be asked to:

1. Review any transactions or relationships that would create a conflict of interest, or the appearance of a conflict,
2. Disclose any such conflicting interest,
3. Certify those conflicts, or certify that none exists, and
4. Notify the chairman of the Board of Directors if any such conflict should arise in the future.

An appropriate Conflict of Interest Statement and Disclosure form will be provided for Board members' certification

The recommendation was approved.

13. Chairman Andy DeWitt presented the Advisory Committee Report. The committee recommended that (today's) September 14, 2021 IBSA Board Meeting be held virtually for safety reasons due to the spike in delta variant Covid cases.

Church Building Loans



BFI's Church Building Loan program is a true win-win situation for Illinois Gospel ministry! The loan application process is simple and provides permanent financing (no balloon payments) to churches looking to purchase new property or who plan to expand/improve their existing facilities. **BFI is currently providing nearly \$11M in loans to 69 churches**, the great majority of which are saving interest by paying over and above their monthly commitment.

Most of our loans are funded by the sale of BFI Bonds. This allows God's people to invest in church growth throughout our state! BFI Bonds are low-risk investment options with a respectable rate of return. Bonds are secured by a first-person mortgage and a loan is never made for more than 50% of the property value. Investor's rate of return ranges from 1.25% for a 1 year bond to 4.25% for a bond with a 5 year maturity.

Saving and Investing

BFI continues to provide savings and investing accounts to both churches and individuals. Our goal is to provide prudent, Biblically-based investment options that avoid unnecessary risk while offering clients a reasonable rate of return. Most importantly, BFI clients have peace of mind in knowing that they are investing with a fiduciary organization that is focused on Kingdom growth as opposed to one with a secular mission.

To better serve our investors, BFI began hosting quarterly pool investor conference calls in 2020. These quarterly calls give clients the opportunity to engage with our investment managers to learn even more in-depth information about the performance and outlook of their BFI investments. In 2021, BFI began offering cash management accounts to all our church, individual and organizational clients at 1% APR and no fees! Clients can still access their accounts within 24-48 via ACH (Automated Clearing House). This is a tremendously better rate than most local banks offering 0.01% - 0.025% APR.

In addition, BFI provides customized counsel to finance/stewardship teams helping them to make wise financial decisions that honor God while encouraging the generosity of God's people.

Educational Scholarships


Long before the Baptist Foundation became the fiduciary organization it is today, the Foundation provided Christian education to SIU students in Carbondale, IL. As a continuation of our academic roots, BFI offers approximately \$80,000 in scholarships to Illinois Baptist students each year. Scholarships range from \$1000 to those working toward Associates Degrees to \$2,000 for Bachelor Degrees and \$2,675 to Seminary students. BFI Scholarships are provided by a number of generous donors who have a passion for equipping the next generation for Gospel ministry.



In 2020, BFI provided scholarships to 40 students (18 Seminary and 19 Bachelor and 3 Associates)!

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by David Grove, Chairman, at 10:10 am. He thanked Springfield Southern Church for hospitality.

Opening Devotion and Prayer

Doug Morrow reminded participants of the Treasure Principle mentioned by Jesus in Matthew 6:19-21. He submitted that this is the central teaching of Jesus, often echoed by later New Testament writers. Doug equaled "the moth and rust" destruction of treasures in this passage, to the depreciation and the "passing away" of earthly securities. However, investing in Christian Kingdom causes is not only investing in "assets" that are appreciating, but also investing in the destination of permanence to which we are moving closer, every day. This principle is crucial because one's investments are shaping one's affections. Doug exemplified this point by briefly contrasting two interaction of Jesus from Luke 18 and 19. In Luke 18, Jesus met with the rich young ruler, who was accustomed to living by the rules and checking-in boxes. But he missed the stewardship and generosity invitation of Christ, and therefore missed salvation. By contrast, Zacheus, the tax collector from Luke 19, embraced the generosity and stewardship principle, and he was welcomed by Christ into His kingdom. Doug concluded by leading the Board in prayer.

Roll Call

Mihaela Sexton, Board Secretary, called the roll as requested by Chairman David Grove.

Review of the last meeting's minutes and adoption of the agenda

The Fall meeting minutes were read by Mihaela Sexton, Board Secretary. David Grove, Chairman, called for the approval of the minutes from the Fall meeting, as well as the Agenda for the Spring meeting. A motion was made by Newlin Wollaston and seconded by Ron Knox. The motion passed unanimously.

Executive Director's Report

Doug Morrow started his report by pointing to the BFI Dashboard, located on the Trustees' intranet, and which captures a snapshot of all the areas of activity at BFI. He pointed to the value of Assets under Management (AUM) of \$52.5 million at the end of the 4th quarter of 2020. He mentioned that due to the financial climate of 2020, the investment committee had to meet several times throughout the year to decide diversification in investments and adjustments in allocation limits of the different pool components. This flexibility kept BFI in a good position with a 3.99% yield in the Long-Term Fixed Income Investment pool (8.2% TR) and a total return of 14.2% in the Blended pool.

Next, Doug introduced Shannon Jones, from partner Bank of Springfield, who presented a new analytic tool she and her team developed for BFI: the Global Account Investment Dashboard. This complex tool is required by the uniqueness of BFI's financial activity with its many components (loans, investments, bank debenture) and allows careful monitoring of fund allocations per correct parameters. The Global Account Investment Dashboard is currently being updated manually by Shannon's team on a quarterly basis. There was a discussion regarding the availability of this tool to the Board and/or investors. Due to the fact that this is a live document with a high level of technical details, this tool is currently available to the Trustees of the Investment committee. At the request of Chairman David Grove, Doug explained the term "bank debenture" as a different type of bond which purchases bank debt. The current earning for the BOS bank debenture that BFI purchased is 6.5%, accrued quarterly. It is a low-risk investment due to the financial health of BOS and it is a "win-win" solution for both BFI (due to its earnings, currently much higher than the corporate, or municipal bonds) and BOS (where it can be reported as assets and therefore increase their loan capacity).

Doug continued his report with a couple of examples of Individual Legacy Custodial Investment accounts for Earl and Marcella Cannedy and June Slaton, both members of Calvary Church in Alton. Doug pointed out that upon the death of these clients, their assets came under management and BFI was in the unique position to administer the legacy of these families, according to the client's exact desires and very specific requests.

Ken Steward, part-time Assistant Director, was then invited to present a few examples of Church Legacy accounts and their recent opportunities and challenges. It is the desire of BFI to see most of the church properties in the Church Legacy program continue to be used as churches. In that regard, Ken mentioned Heartland Caseyville Church which was recently purchased by Citadel Deliverance Temple (through a reverted asset loan with BFI) and South Pekin which will transfer to New Hope Baptist in the near future. Maintaining the properties in the Church Legacy program is not without challenges - but BFI partnered with Southern Baptist Disaster Relief teams to repair water leak damages in East Side, Mt Vernon and a heater failure in Eagle Summit, Colona, thus enabling the Congolese congregation of Maranatha Revival, who is space-sharing in Colona, to return to worship.

The bulk of Doug's presentation was centered on three strategic items that he brought before the Board and for which he asked for guidance and feedback.

First strategic item was the situation of the BFI owned property of Paradise Church in Tamaroa. This is a beautiful property appraised at \$89,000, for which BFI sought a new church plant for several

years, without success. BFI was also approached in the past by prospective buyers, but the offers were considered too low for the value of the property. Seeking to find a godly purpose for this building, BFI initiated discussions with the Baptist Children's Home, the Franklin Association and the Nine Mile Association in order to establish a Baptist Center, where BFI and these organizations would have satellite offices, sharing in the cost of improving and maintaining the property. This initiative was previously discussed during the 03/19/2021 Administrative Committee meeting, and the Committee approved the project and the spending of a maximum of \$15,000 of BFI reserves for the initial remodel. However, now Doug has submitted that he has received a new purchase offer for the property for the amount of \$50,000, which he considered acceptable in value. The prospective buyer is a person with previous ties to the church and who would use the space to open a local heritage museum and offices. This was considered an honorable function for the property, in the absence of a church plant. Doug sought feedback and advice from the Board. From the discussion resulted that selling the Paradise, Tamaroa property would be the most prudent decision, since there was not yet any definite commitment/agreement from the other organizations to the project of a Baptist Center. In addition, the establishing of the Baptist Center and the initial remodel would require a considerable managerial effort, not justified by the benefit of a BFI satellite office used only seldomly.

The second strategic item brought up by Doug was the need for a new, more sophisticated software which would address BFIs accounts complexities in real time, allowing for daily reconciliations of all securities and an interface with Charles Schwab. Doug mentioned that this will be a major item for discussion on the Fall Board meeting agenda. Currently BFI uses software from Trinergy with a contract for \$15,000 annually, which expires in 3 years, and has no buy-out option, other than paying the \$45,000 remaining. However, the present software cannot handle accurately the dynamic activity of the multiple-component funds, which have to be reconciled manually on a monthly basis. Doug is considering using a different software company, HWA International Trust Processor, from Tennessee, which is servicing other Baptist associations and promises to be able to deliver the required features. A major demonstration of the new software is set up for Tuesday, April 13, 2021. Tonya Downard and Doug will be present for the demonstration. The benefits of the new software, as pointed by Doug, Tonya and Tim Sadler would be improved accuracy, improved customer satisfaction and streamlining of operational workload for staff, which would allow both Doug and Sheila to work on growth acceleration. The cost of the new software is \$90,000 for the first year, followed by \$21,000 annually. The Board asked Doug to enquire if HWA would consider amortizing the first year cost, over a period of several years, if HWA would do a buy-out from Trinergy in BFI's behalf, or if some type of specialized contract can be worked out with HWA. Advice was given to start saving now for the initial cost needed potentially in 2025. Doug was asked if BFI could accept a donation restricted to the purchase of software and his answer was affirmative.

Before the third item was mentioned, the BFI staff was temporarily invited out of the meeting.

The third strategic issue was the need for increased operational help, which Doug suggested could be solved by elevating Ken Steward's position from part-time assistant Director to full-time Assistant Director, starting May 1st, 2021. In addition to his current role, Ken would work in the office several days a week and learn all the operational workflows that are currently performed by Sheila. This will allow for a thorough understanding of operations for Ken, making him a better manager in the future. It will also provide the expertise overlap needed for Sheila's time off and which does not currently exist. Doug submitted that the increase in the Assistant Director's salary and benefits will be funded for a year from the Vision fund, which sits currently at \$52,000. For subsequent years, the increase in salary could be funded by an increase of \$5.00 millions in AUM, which is estimated by Doug as achievable. Newlin Wollaston, BFI Board Vice-chair commented that this is a positive step in the direction of instituting legacy and continuity in the BFI management for the future. Several trustees who knew Ken, while he was working for the Baptist Children Home, made positive remarks about Ken's

abilities. Doug mentioned that Ken has clear aptitude for the Church Legacy program and that the Board could trust that there will be competent continuity in the area of BFI's management of operations, upon Doug's retirement. It was also mentioned that with the ending of Caitlin Glick's term as an intern, the internship program will be discontinued, but it might resume in 6-7 years.

The BFI staff was invited back in the meeting and Ken was made aware of his position's elevation to full-time starting May 1st, 2021.

Doug offered special recognition and words of thanks for the work that Caitlin Glick has done as an intern with BFI. Upon her graduation from Hannibal-LaGrange University, she will be joining the Navy.

Administrative Committee Report and Recommendations

The report was presented by Don Carlyle, Chair. During the Administrative Committee meeting from 3/19/2021 the following items were discussed:

- the need to revise / update the current BFI-IBSA Cooperative Agreement before our Fall BFI Board Meeting
- the need for maintaining quality standards for BFI Board of Trustees members
- the updated BFI Employee Handbook was approved by the committee, and it is now available on the Trustees' intranet. Don Carlyle moved to have the updated BFI Employee Handbook approved by the Board. It passed unanimously.
- the BFI owned property Paradise, Tamaroa, as mentioned above in Doug's Report
- permission for Doug to work with IBSA Constitution Committee in order to change the wording of article XI of BFI Bylaws. The current wording requires both the BFI Executive Director and BFI Board Chair signatures for the sale of BFI properties, slowing this process down. Doug argued that the move and disposition of assets is BFI's core business, therefore an exemption should be permissible. To change the language of Bylaws is a two-year process. Don Carlyle submitted a motion to affirm Doug's seeking the wording change. It passed unanimously.
- the need for new software as mentioned above in Doug's Report

The Board paused for lunch at 12:15 and reconvened at 12:45.

Board Chairman, David Grove, asked all present trustees to fill out and sign the "Conflict of Interest Policy Disclosure" and, if needed, the "BFI Reimbursement/Donation Request".

Investment Committee Report and Recommendations

David Rochleau, Chair, gave the following informational report:

The Investment Committee met several times since the Fall Board meeting in order to decide on investment diversification in the absence of acceptable municipal bonds, as well as to approve several Church loans.

The investment Committee had no recommendations at this time.

Audit Committee Report

David Rochleau, Chair, mentioned that the committee met on 04/08/2021 and Lauren Groff from Sikich Auditing presented the Draft Report of 2020 Audit, which is available on the Trustees' intranet. Tonya Downard said the draft reports a good, clean 2020 Audit. She mentioned that in the past two years the cost of the audit was higher due to the extra work required from Auditors to complete the report. For 2020 the cost, and the timeline of the audit should align with the customary audit processes. Tonya also mentioned that there will be a change to the BFI Dashboard to reflect the figures for the entire 2020 year and not just the 4th Quarter.

David Rochleau moved to request approval from the Board for the Draft version of the 2020 Audit Report, pending any subsequent material findings which will be reported to the Board. The motion passed unanimously.

Scholarship Committee Report and Recommendations

Tim Sadler, Chair, reported that this year BFI awarded 37 scholarships (to Associate, Bachelor and Seminary students) amounting to a total of approximately \$78,000 generated by the earnings of the three types of BFI Scholarship funds: restricted, preferential and unrestricted. There was a record number of volunteer evaluators that presented on March 6th, 2021 to read the applications and the process went smoothly. Also, unique for this year, the candidate with the top score received a paid-for trip to Israel with Passages Israel, due to an anonymous donation which covers the cost of the trip. Tim moved that the 37 scholarships, as well as the Israel trip be awarded as listed. The motion carried without dissent.

Doug made Tim aware that since Mihaela Sexton is now an officer of the Board, she cannot hold the Vice Chair position in the Scholarship Committee. Presently this committee is without a Vice Chair and Secretary.

Tim mentioned the following issues discussed at the Spring Scholarship committee meeting, held via Google meets on 03/19/2021:

- the Committee's decision to publicize the story behind each of the 31 scholarships in the fund. This information will be added to the BFI public website and it will be included into a brochure to be presented to the scholarship recipients, in order to inspire both the students and potential new donors. Currently Sheila Jessen, Tim Sadler and Mihaela Sexton are gathering the biographical information and pictures of the donors. The Trustees will be provided and email list of the 31 scholarships and are invited to help in the search for information.
- the need to develop a standard of requirements for prospective evaluators/readers. Currently there is no guideline in this regard.
- next year's evaluation session will be held on the first Saturday in March (03/05/2022) at Tabernacle Baptist church in Decatur. All trustees are encouraged to participate.
- Trustees will be required to present scholarship certificates to the awarded students in their areas.

Other Business

There was no other business to be discussed.

Introduction of the New Trustees

Doug introduced the following incoming Trustees: Bruce Guebert, Richard Harris, Pam White, Julian Willams and Anthony Richardson

Adjourn

Newlin Wollaston moved, and Bruce Guebert seconded to adjourn at 1:19 pm. David Grove closed the meeting in prayer.

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by David Grove, Chairman, at 10:14 am. He mentioned that this is a hybrid meeting with a couple of participants online. He opened the meeting in prayer.

Opening Devotion

Ben Foxworth started with a family anecdote in order to illustrate the role of a steward. He defined the word “steward” as caretaker, or manager of someone else’s stuff. He stated that God gave us the role of stewards from the beginning when, at the time of creation, in Genesis 2: 15, Adam was tasked by God to tend and watch over the Garden of Eden. In Romans 1:20 the caretaking role is given a new meaning: when we steward God’s creation, we are actually taking care of that which reflects God’s invisible attributes, His eternal power and divine nature, manifested in creation so that all can see the reality of God and believe. Throughout God’s word, we see that we are not only stewards of material things, but we have also been entrusted to take care of the Gospel, of God’s word and its proper handling, and ultimately of people, by loving, helping, serving, teaching, training and encouraging one another. BFI is a steward entrusted by churches and individuals to manage their resources. As Trustees we are therefore stewards also and we should be mindful that one day we will give an account to the Lord for our service. Rev. Foxworth urged us to recognize God as the source of all the gifts and to serve with faithfulness daily, as we aspire to hear from the Lord one day “Well done, good and faithful servant!”

Roll Call

Mihaela Sexton, Board Secretary, called the roll as requested by Chairman David Grove.

Review of the last meeting’s minutes and adoption of the agenda

The Spring meeting minutes, and the Agenda for the Fall meeting were adopted unanimously as presented on the intranet, without change.

Executive Director’s Report

BOT Update:

Doug Morrow, Executive Director of BFI, started his report by showing the pictures of five future BFI Board of Trustees members expected to join the Board after the Nov 2021 IBSA convention. They are:

- DeWanna Oliver , from Algonquin, present client and upbeat, positive personality,
- Greg Kyrouac, from New Beginnings Church in Ashland IL, replacing his pastor who was a Trustee for a short term,
- Paul Stanford, from, with previous involvement with the Foundation,
- Scott Andrews, pastor and army chaplain, client of BFI and previously involved with the Baptist Children Home, and
- Brent Cloyd, Director of Missions in the Grand Wabash Association, and a precise thinker.

Doug asked for prayers for the new members, and noted that before our Spring meeting there might be another new Trustee to replace David Sutton who now has a position with IBSA which precludes him from being on the BFI Board. Doug added that several of the new members are pastors and that would balance the composition of the Board which is at present in majority formed by laity.

HWA International, Trust Processor Update:

Doug mentioned that June data is ready to import and it is anticipated that live and parallel data being input with 1 October 2021, with the expectation that after January 1st, 2022, the Trust Processor software will be totally live and the first contractual payment will be due to HWA at the end of the 1Q22.

Budget reporting and 2022 Budget:

Tonya Downard, CPA started by pointing to the BFI Dashboard (found on the Trustees' intranet) which she and Ken maintain, and which captures a snapshot of all the areas of activity at BFI including the current budget in a graph comparing projected versus actual figures. She pointed to the value of Assets under Management (AUM) of \$55.4 million at the end of the 2th quarter of 2021 and the upward trend of AUM over the last decade. Tonya asked the Board to give her feedback if the Trustees would like to see additional data reported on the dashboard.

Q. Mihaela Sexton asked what areas contributed to the growth of 3 Million in AUM in the last two quarters.

A. Doug Morrow answered that it is a combination of four-digit individual investments (primarily custodial) and six-digit estate gifts reaching maturity. Doug and Ken affirmed that even last week they each did financial coaching with individuals who are beginning the stewardship journey. However, there is much potential for growth. Strategically BFI has five divisions and does not plan to increase that number in the near future, but in Doug's estimation only 1-2% of Illinois Baptists are aware of the BFI and what it does. With the implementation of the new accounting software which can handle AUM of 150M, we are positioning ourselves for economies of scale.

Tonya referred next to the 2022 Proposed Budget (on the intranet) and noted some changes compared to the 2021 budget:

- BFI Bonds line is projected to remain the same as the projected 2021, even though the realized amount had a negative variance for the first two quarters of 2021 – the feeling is that the projection is realistic
- The Loan Processing Fee line remains blank – Doug commented that even though BFI is authorized to charge loan processing fees, it has suspended its 1% origination fee on loans during Covid

- The Contract Clerical Support line will be -0-
- The IT – Accounting Software line will be significantly larger because it will involve paying both Trinergy per contract until it expires, and HWA – Doug pointed out that the cells in the budget form which have a small black triangle in the top-right corner, contain comments or breakdown of totals for details.
- The Vision Fund line – is a one time line item that will be used in 2022

Q. Dan Huffman asked if the Office Rental to IBSA line is increasing every year or it is constant

A. Doug Morrow answered that it is constant, that the BFI offices are back on the 3rd floor in the IBSA building and the rent is flat, being based on square footage and including all utilities.

Q. Tim Sadler commented that the rent seems high compared to what he pays in Decatur

A. Doug responded that it is smaller compared to other offices, at least per pre-covid data, and that IBSA has a demand on office space even though some vacancies still exist in the building.

Tonya concluded her remarks by thanking the board for deciding to proceed with the introduction of the new software before the Trinergy contract ended. She stated that even though it is a grueling process right now to transition to the Trust Processor, she is excited about the increased versatility, better reporting tools with more transparency this application will allow in the near future. Doug asked for prayer for a smooth transition process to the new software.

Investment Performance:

Doug stressed the seriousness of the fact that 2022 is a pivotal year. In the BFI model of five divisions, only two divisions that provide income streams: the management fees from AUM and the BFI Loans to churches.

Next, Doug introduced **Marcus McGlasson, VP** at partner Bank of Springfield, who presented the investment performance of the Blended Pool, Long Term Fixed Income Fund and Endowment Accounts. Distinction was made between reporting growth in Yield (Y) vs growth in Total Return (TR), where TR is a function of asset gain and yield.

Blended Pool performance: Total Return is 10.89% annualized compared to 7.16% in 2019 and 13.5% in 2020. This fund is comprised currently of 55% quality equity and 45% bonds

- Long Term Fixed Income fund performance: Yield of 5.15% compared to 5.29% in 2019 and 3.99% in 2020. The TR on this fund is stable at around 7%. This fund is comprised of > 90% fixed income bonds. In the last 12-18 months this area experienced challenges, not just due to a slower economy, but also due to the Government involvement meant to drive the interest rates low. BOS worked closely in this period with BFI Investment Committee to offset some of this challenges. One strategy was to invest in utility funds: they are a conservative equity that keeps pace with inflation and their the long term distributions will be tied to the prices they charge which have increased at a rate of 19% in the last year
- Endowment Fund has a Yield back at around 5% after its decrease to 3.99 % in 2020. Some structural and strategy changes were done on this fund as well in the past year in consultation with the Investment Committee. For the first time a TR of 6.87% was

reported on this fund in 2021. This is linked to the motion that was presented later by the Investment committee.

Q. Dan Huffman asked if BFI struggled with companies rushing to call their bonds in today's economy.

A. Marcus McGlasson answered in affirmative.

Q. Dan Huffman asked if Doug is discerning an uptick in enthusiasm among Illinois Baptists regarding investing with BFI.

A. Doug answered that he has no tool to measure it at the state level and that all his evidence is anecdotal. He would like to have an analytic tool to measure BFI name recognition, for example.

Q. Dan Huffman commented that the challenge to reach pastors in his association is that the churches are small and the pastors are bi-vocational, therefore have limited time and interest.

A. Doug answered that we will be successful at promoting BFI when we will be helpful to pastors. The Biblical Financial Management Series videos were designed with this purpose: to be a resource to pastors.

Q Dan Huffman asked if the BFI connection with Directors of Missions in the IBSA Associations is strong enough to promote BFI through DOMs.

A. Doug answered that some DOMs are very excited, but that there are a number of Associations that do not have DOMs at this time.

C. Pam White commented that in a small way we can promote BFI programs when the Trustees present the educational scholarships, if we ask to have five minutes extra during the service.

C. Tim Saddler advised that we should not ask for extra minutes, but instead use the opportunity to promote BFI anyway.

A. Doug suggested the use of the explainer video "What is BFI?" found at <https://baptistfoundationil.org/> [Baptist Foundation of Illinois - Christian Stewardship in Illinois \(baptistfoundationil.org\)](https://baptistfoundationil.org/Baptist-Foundation-of-Illinois-Christian-Stewardship-in-Illinois) as a preamble to the scholarship presentation. The video could be viewed over the church wifi, or it could be downloaded to a memory stick.

Q. David Grove commented that the most effective promotion is possibly done by the Trustees in their own churches. In this regard he asked Doug to name one thing that we should promote above others.

A. Doug answered that we should make the pastors aware of the BFI Cash Management Fund which produces 1% interest, 4 to 10 times higher than the average checking account in a local bank. The churches have the potential of increasing their ministry funds and maintaining the same level of liquidity by investing their cash in a BFI cash management fund. Doug estimates that there are 75M-100M dollars in church funds sitting in banks across the state and producing very little interest.

Doug concluded the Executive Director's report by pointing to the book "*Don't Waste Your Life*" by John Piper, which was offered by the Foundation as a gift to each Trustee. He considers it an impactful book that should be shared.

Administrative Committee Report and Recommendations

The report was presented by **Dan Huffman, Vice Chair**. During the Administrative Committee meeting from 9/17/2021 the following items were discussed:

- The Proposed budget for 2022 was examined in great detail and with a decision of 7-0 the committee submitted to the whole Board the **motion to approve the 2022 BFI Operating Budget as presented**. Motion passed unanimously.
- The Trustees Self Evaluation Survey discussion will be postponed to the Spring Committee Day due to the large number of incoming Trustees
- The committee received an update from Doug on the timeline of implementation of the HWA International Trust Processor software
- The need for greater harmony and mutual understanding among BFI, IBSA and BCHFS. These three Illinois Baptist entities have the common goals of expanding God's kingdom and increasing stewardship and generosity among Baptists. In this regard, the Administrative committee submitted the **motion to authorize BFI management to begin a process of drafting a Memorandum of Understanding with IBSA and BCHFS, acknowledging and encouraging our shared efforts in our general work to expand the Christian Kingdom and our efforts to improve stewardship and generosity among Illinois Baptists**. Chairman David Grove asked for advice from the former Chairs of the Board present, and they agreed that such a document was necessary and timely. The motion carried without dissent. The long term goal is to increase awareness and understanding among IBSA, BCHFS and BFI with the scope of mutual promotion.
- The Administrative committee elected the following officers for 2022: Don Carlyle, Chair; Pam White, Vice-Chair; and Ben Foxworth, Secretary.

Investment Committee Report and Recommendations

David Rochleau, Chair, gave the following report:

- The Investment Committee on 9/17/ 21 looked at investment performance as presented earlier by Marcus McGlassen and Doug Morrow.
- In order to stabilize the income stream generated by the Endowment fund and compensate for the fluctuations in yield seen in the past year, the Investment Committee recommends the following **motion: BFI is authorized to distribute endowment gifts at a calculated rate based on the total return for 12 regressive quarters. Twice annually, the Investment Committee will recommend to the Board of Trustees the distribution rate for the subsequent**

two quarters following a meeting. For quarters 4Q21 and 1Q22, the Investment Committee is recommending a distribution of $\frac{1}{4}$ of 5%. The motion passed unanimously.

- The Investment Committee has elected the following officers for 2022: Dave Rochleau, Chair; Alan Monroe, Vice Chair, and Bruce Guebert, Secretary

Scholarship Committee Report and Recommendations

Tim Sadler, Chair, mentioned the following issues discussed at the Fall Scholarship committee meeting, held via Google meets on 09/17/2021:

- Next year's scholarship evaluation session will be held on the **last Saturday in February (02/26/2022) at Tabernacle Baptist church in Decatur**, instead of the first Sunday in March as previously announced. All trustees are encouraged to participate and bring other evaluators to the event. For overnight accommodations, there is the Decatur Conference Center and Hotel, located near the church.
- The Committee has always aimed at making the evaluation process as objective as possible. In this regard additional procedural steps were discussed.
- The Scholarship Committee awards an annual grant of \$2500 to a church initiative for community outreach. There were seven grant applications submitted this year. The committee advanced the following ***motion***: *BFI awards the 2021 Christian Service Grant of \$2,500 to the First Baptist of Litchfield for their Tending the Vine Children's Ministry*. The motion carried with 100 % Yes votes.
- The Scholarship Committee has elected Tim Sadler, Chair; Anthony Richardson, Vice Chair; and Nedra Robinson, Secretary for service during 2022.
- Mihaela Sexton asked if possible that all grant requests be made available to the Trustees for their personal consideration, since many of the projects were worthy of support, and only one BFI grant was awarded.

Executive Director Performance Evaluation

David Grove, Chair, mentioned that he had asked **Vice Chair, Newlin Wollaston**, to compile the results of the Evaluations surveys submitted by the Trustees and to lead the Performance evaluation discussion which took place on 10/01/2021 prior to the BOT meeting. Doug, David and Newlin were present. Newlin mentioned that they had a serious, positive and candid discussion during the evaluation, and Doug was receptive when presented with growth opportunities. Doug responded that he delights in his work and values the relationships he formed over the years with the Board members. He takes seriously their accurate feedback because it prepares him to be ultimately ready to give an account to the LORD.

David Grove mentioned that the evaluation is available to the Trustees upon request.

Election of 2022 General Board Officers & Advisory Committee Recommendations

The following **motion** was submitted by Alan Monroe to select as General officers for 2022: David Grove, Chair of the Board, Newlin Wollaston, Vice Chair, and Mihaela Sexton, Secretary. Julian Williams seconded. The Motion passed unanimously.

Other Business

There was no other business to discuss.

Special Recognitions

Doug thanked Dan Huffman for his service as a Trustee. A special recognition from the foundation will follow for Dan and possibly other departing Trustees.

Adjourn

The Board adjourned for lunch at 12:25 and reconvened at 13:00 for annual group photo.

**BYLAWS
OF
THE BAPTIST FOUNDATION OF ILLINOIS**

an Illinois Not For Profit Corporation
(herein called the "Corporation")

Approved November 12, 2015
Updates approved November 7, 2019

**ARTICLE I
NAME AND PURPOSE**

1. **Name.** The name of the not for profit corporation is The Baptist Foundation of Illinois.
2. **Purpose.** The Corporation was formed under the laws of the State of Illinois and is organized to serve and further the development of any religious, benevolent, charitable, educational or missionary purpose, undertaking, institution, or agency operated, sponsored, sanctioned, supervised or supported by the Illinois Baptist State Association.

**ARTICLE II
MEMBERSHIP**

The Corporation has a sole member, being the Illinois Baptist State Association (the "Association").

**ARTICLE III
BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

1. **General Powers.** The Board of Trustees will carry out and effectuate the purposes of this Corporation and manage the business and affairs of the Corporation, with full authority to determine the service and operating programs of the Corporation and to take whatever action it may deem advisable to achieve the Corporation's objectives. The Board is accountable to the Association.
2. **Number, Election and Term.** The Board shall consist of 21 trustees, and each trustee shall serve a term of 3 years, with one-third of the trustees elected annually by the Association in its annual session. Trustees may be elected for no more than two consecutive terms, and will not be eligible for reelection to the Board until at least one year has lapsed. The president, vice president, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary, and executive director of the IBSA shall serve as ex-officio members of the board of the BFI. The president, vice president, recording secretary and the assistant recording secretary of the Association shall serve with vote, while the executive director of the IBSA shall serve without vote.
3. **Qualifications.** The primary criteria to be followed for selection of Board members shall be:
 - A. An individual's ability to make a maximum contribution to attaining the goals of

the Corporation.

B. An individual's understanding of or sympathy for the mission and purpose of the Corporation.

C. An individual's high level of emotional and spiritual maturity in the way they conduct their own business and in the way they relate to their own local churches.

D. An individual's possession of a reputable and responsible character, and who has not been convicted of a felony or indicated as being involved in any financial malfeasance or breach of fiduciary obligation.

E. An individual's ability to commit to attend at least 50% of the regularly scheduled Board meetings and invest the time necessary to fulfill assigned responsibilities.

F. An individual's active membership in a cooperating church of the Association.

G. Individuals that reflect a diversity of strengths and perspectives, possess appropriate skills and experience, and reflect the community being served (ie. demographically, culturally, pastors and laity).

H. Board members shall be a mixture of ordained and non-ordained persons who are committed to Christian Stewardship principals.

I. Directors, officers, and employees of the Association, or entities related to the Association, or any such person whose salary is subsidized by the Association, shall not serve as members of the Board.

J. No church shall have more than one member on the Board at the same time. A member of the Board moving to a church, which has a member of the Board, shall resign from the Board.

K. The Nominating Committee of the Association will nominate Board members for election by the Association in accordance with the rules of the Association, with consideration given to suggestions for trustees from the Executive Director of the Corporation.

4. **Resignation.** Any Trustee may resign at any time by delivering a resignation in writing to the Chairperson or Secretary of the Board. The acceptance of any resignation, unless required by its terms, shall not be necessary to make the resignation effective. The resignation shall be effective when the notice is received unless the notice specifies a later effective date.

5. **Removal.** Any Trustee may be removed at any time in either of the following manners:

A. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Trustees, the Association may remove a Trustee prior to the expiration of the Trustee's term in accordance with its own governance and rules. Such removal may occur only upon the Association's finding that the removal of such Trustee is in the best interest of the Corporation and one or more of the following causes for removal are deemed by the Association to exist: breach of trust; neglect of duty; diminished physical or mental capacity; immoral, fraudulent or dishonest conduct; or breach of loyalty or conflict of interest.

B. In the event a member of the Board is absent from more than one-half of the scheduled Board and committee meetings in a twelve (12) month period, such Board member shall be automatically removed from the Board and their position shall become vacant.

6. **Vacancies.** Any vacancy occurring between annual meetings of the Association, prospective board members shall be nominated by the IBSA Nominating Committee and considered by the IBSA Board of Directors. A trustee elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office.

7. **Conflict of Interest.** No member of the Board may derive or appear to derive any personal profit or gain, directly or indirectly, by reason of his or her membership on the Board or because of services provided to the Board. Each Board member must disclose to the Board any personal interest, which he or she may have in any current or potential matter before the Board and refrain from participation in any decision on such matters.

No employee of BFI or family member of an employee of BFI, nor any person whose salary is subsidized by BFI nor any person whose service shall provide a conflict of interest (other than those disclosed to and approved by the Board), shall serve as a member of the Board of BFI.

8. **Ex-Officio Membership.** The president and vice president, recording secretary, and assistant recording secretary of the Association and the executive director of the IBSA staff shall serve as ex-officio members of the board of the BFI. The president, vice president, recording secretary and the assistant recording secretary of the Association shall serve with vote, while the executive director of the IBSA staff shall serve without vote.

ARTICLE IV MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

1. **Regular Meetings.** Regular meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be held at least twice each year. The Board shall fix the date, time and place of its meetings.

2. **Special Meetings.** The Chairperson, Executive Director or at least twenty percent of the Trustees then in office may call a special meeting of the Board of Trustees. At least 7 days written notice of the date, time and place shall be given to each member of the Board by the person(s) calling the meeting. The notice shall state the nature of the business to be considered at the special meeting, and no business other than that stated in the notice shall be considered at such meeting.

3. **Quorum and Voting.** At all meetings of the Board of Trustees, a majority of the entire Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Except as otherwise provided by law or these Bylaws, the vote of a majority of the trustees present at the time of any vote shall be the act of the Board. The Board may permit any or all trustees to participate in a regular or special meeting by, or conduct the meeting through, the use of any means of communication by which all trustees participating may hear each other simultaneously during the meeting. A trustee participating in a meeting by such means is deemed to be present in person at the meeting.

4. **Action by the Board.** Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board or by any committee thereof may be taken without a meeting if all members of the Board or committee are polled and the action evidenced by one or more written consents describing the action taken, signed by each trustee, and included in the minutes filed with the corporate records reflecting the action taken. Such action shall be initiated by the Chairperson over his or her signature and also requires the consent of the Vice Chairperson, or, in the absence of the Vice Chairperson, the Secretary.

5. **Records and Minutes.** Written records and minutes of all Board meetings and committee meetings shall be maintained and made available for review. Such records reflect the official actions of the Board and at a minimum contain the date of each Board meeting, any committee reports made to the Board, and all actions taken by the Board.
6. **Procedures.** The meetings shall be conducted in accordance with the current edition of Roberts Rules of Order.
7. **Access.** Meetings of the Board of Trustees and committees thereof shall be open to the general public; provided, however, that the Board of Trustees may hold a closed meeting at a specified future date or close a portion of a meeting to the public upon a majority vote of a quorum of the trustees present. Such vote must be taken in an open meeting, and meetings may only be closed for certain issues and discussion in the closed meeting limited to the cited issue(s). Minutes must be taken of the closed meeting. The issues that may be discussed in closed meetings of the Board of Trustees include: 1) personnel and employee compensation matters, 2) hearing of testimony on a complaint against the Corporation or employee to determine the validity, 3) pending or threatened litigation against, affecting, or on behalf of the Corporation.

ARTICLE V OFFICERS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

1. **Officers.** The officers of the Board of Trustees shall be a Chairperson, a Vice Chairperson and a Secretary.
2. **Election, Term of Office and Removal.** The officers of the Corporation shall be elected for a one (1) year term at the Fall meeting of the Board of Trustees. Any officer of the Corporation may be removed, with or without cause, by a vote of a majority of the entire Board.
3. **Chairperson: Powers and Duties.** The Chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Trustees and perform such other duties as usually pertains to this office or as the Board of Trustees shall from time to time proscribe. The Chairperson shall serve as a voting member of one of the standing committees and an ex-officio member of all other committees of the Board without vote.
4. **Vice Chairperson: Powers and Duties.** The Vice Chairperson shall perform the duties of the Chairperson in the absence of or at the request of the Chairperson, and all other duties the Board of Trustees shall from time to time proscribe. The Vice Chairperson shall serve as a voting member of one of the standing committees and an ex-officio member of all other committees of the Board without vote.
5. **Secretary: Powers and Duties.** The Secretary shall record the proceedings of the Board of Trustees and provide a copy of the minutes to the Executive Director after each meeting, and shall perform all other duties the Board of Trustees shall from time to time proscribe. The Secretary shall serve as a voting member of one of the standing committees and an ex-officio member of all other committees of the Board without vote.
6. **Delegation.** In case of the absence or disability of any officer or of any person authorized to act for such officer, the Board may from time to time delegate the powers and duties of such officer

to any other officer, trustee, or person whom it may select during such period of absence or disability.

ARTICLE VI COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

1. **Standing Committees.** The Board of Trustees shall be organized into five standing committees. Each committee shall have a chairperson, vice chairperson and a secretary that are elected at the Fall Board meeting. The standing committees of the Board are:

A. **Advisory Committee.** The Advisory Committee consists of all officers of the Board of Trustees and the chairpersons of each of the other standing committees. The Advisory Committee will act as counsel for the Executive Director. In the event of the death, incapacity, or prolonged absence of the Executive Director, the Advisory Committee shall assume responsibilities for day to day operations until the next meeting of the Board, and shall report to the Board at each regular and special meeting any actions it has taken in the interim. The Advisory Committee will meet with the Executive Director to discuss and develop a slate of nominees for Board officers for the next year.

B. **Administrative Committee.** The Administrative Committee is responsible for the general areas of personnel, policy, procedures, and development.

C. **Scholarship Committee.** The Scholarship Committee is responsible for the general process of awarding scholarships from various scholarship funds managed and controlled by the Corporation.

D. **Investment Committee.** The Investment Committee is responsible for the oversight of the Corporation's investment program and its cash management service.

E. **Audit Committee.** The Audit Committee, composed of the members of the Advisory and Investment Committees, is responsible for scheduling, reviewing and disseminating the audit in conjunction with the auditors and management.

2. **Meetings.** Each committee shall meet as frequently as may be needed to accomplish its business at the call of its chairperson, the chairperson of the Board of Trustees or the Executive Director.

ARTICLE VII EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

1. **Employment and Duties.** The Board of Trustees shall employ one Executive Director to provide executive management of the Corporation, administer its programs and services, and perform all other duties assigned by the Board. The Executive Director shall provide an annual report to the Board concerning the status of the Corporation, and also make any recommendations to the Board concerning the needs of the Corporation. The Executive Director shall have only such authority as has been delegated by the Board.

2. **Personnel.** The Executive Director shall have authority to appoint, reassign, and discharge all employees and staff of the Corporation.

3. **Execution of Documents.** The Executive Director shall execute all documents on behalf of the Corporation, provided that all conveyances of real estate must be co-signed as provided herein. The Executive Director shall have the authority to authenticate records of the Corporation.
4. **Conflict of Interest.** No member of the immediate family of the Executive Director may serve on the Board.

ARTICLE VIII COORDINATING COUNCIL

The Association is the sole member and controlling entity of the Corporation and the Illinois Baptist Children's Home & Family Services, all of which are corporations governed by the Illinois General Not For Profit Corporation Act (herein together the "Entities"). A Coordinating Council shall: 1) coordinate the work of the Entities to facilitate harmony and unity, 2) decide matters of dispute between the Entities, and 3) give direction to the Boards of the Entities in matters not clearly defined in the governing documents of the Entities or law. The Coordinating Council is comprised of the president and vice president of the Association, the chairperson and the vice chairperson of boards of the Entities, and the Executive Director of each of the Entities. The governing documents of the Association provides for all terms governing and controlling the Coordinating Council.

ARTICLE IX FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall begin January 1 and end December 31.

ARTICLE X USE AND MANAGEMENT OF FUNDS

The Board of Trustees shall maintain all funds, such as trust funds, endowment funds, and current and capital funds, separate and inviolate as to the cause for which the funds were received. Such funds are not to be used for any other purpose, even temporarily, except as specified by the donors. The Board of Trustees shall determine and manage the investment policy, guidelines, and objectives for the assets of the Corporation in order to meet the current and future expenses of the agency and to insure it continues its ministry.

ARTICLE XI PURCHASE AND SALE OF PROPERTY

All instruments conveying real estate shall be executed by both the Executive Director and the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE XII BUDGET AND REPORT

The Corporation shall submit to the Association for its consideration in annual session a financial report and a proposed budget for the ensuing year. The Board shall have the authority to approve over-expenditure of line items, providing the total budget figure remains the same as approved by the Association in session. The Board shall submit for consideration by the Association any plans

for new special offerings or capital fund-raising activities. During the fiscal year, the Board shall not obligate the Corporation to expenditures nor incur accumulative indebtedness that will exceed its annual budget by an amount greater than three percent of its annual budget.

ARTICLE XIII AUDIT PROCEDURES

The Board of Trustees shall appoint a firm of certified public accountants to examine the books and records of the Corporation for the ensuing year. Upon completion of the audit, a copy of the audit and management letter will be provided to the Executive Director and each member of the Board of Trustees as facilitated by the Audit Committee. Upon request, a representative of the auditing firm shall personally appear before the Board of Trustees to make a summary presentation of the audit report and answer any questions of the Board. Summary audit information shall be presented to the Association.

ARTICLE XIV INDEMNIFICATION

1. **Indemnification in Actions other than by or in the Right of the Corporation.** The Corporation may indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed action, suit, or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative (other than an action by or in the Right of the Corporation) by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorneys' fees), judgments, fines, and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection with such action, suit, or proceeding, if such person acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Corporation and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful. The termination of any action, suit, or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, or conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the Corporation or, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, that the person had reasonable cause to believe that his or her conduct was unlawful.

2. **Indemnification in Actions by or in the Right of the Corporation.** The Corporation may indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed action or suit by or in the Right of the Corporation to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that such person is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the corporation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection with the defense or settlement of such action or suit, if such person acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Corporation, provided that no indemnification shall be made in respect of any claim, issue, or

matter as to which such person shall have been adjudged to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of his or her duty to the Corporation, unless, and only to the extent that the court in which such action or suit was brought shall determine upon application that, despite the adjudication of liability, but in view of all the circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for such expenses as the court shall deem proper.

3. **Right to Payment of Expenses.** To the extent that a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation has been successful, on the merits or otherwise, in the defense of any action, suit, or proceeding referred to in Sections 1 and 2 of this Article, or in defense of any claim, issue, or matter therein, such person shall be indemnified against expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection therewith.

4. **Determination of Conduct.** Any indemnification under Sections 1 and 2 of this Article (unless ordered by a court) shall be made by the Corporation only as authorized in the specific case, upon a determination that indemnification of the director, officer, employee, or agent is proper in the circumstances because he or she has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Sections 1 or 2 of this Article. Such determination shall be made (a) by the Board of Trustees by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of trustees who were not parties to such action, suit, or proceeding; (b) if such a quorum is not obtainable, or even if obtainable, if a quorum of disinterested directors so directs, by independent legal counsel in a written opinion; or (c) by the members entitled to vote, if any.

5. **Payment of Expenses in Advance.** Expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, suit, or proceeding may be paid by the Corporation in advance of the final disposition of such action, suit, or proceeding, as authorized by the Board of Trustees in the specific case, upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the director, officer, employee, or agent to repay such amount, unless it shall ultimately be determined that he or she is entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation as authorized in this Article.

6. **Indemnification Not Exclusive.** The indemnification provided by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those seeking indemnification may be entitled under any bylaw, agreement, vote of members or disinterested directors, or otherwise, both as to action in his or her official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office, and shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a director, officer, employee, or agent, and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, and administrators of such a person.

7. **Insurance.** The Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation, or who is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, against any liability asserted against such person and incurred by such person in any such capacity, or arising out of his or her status as such, whether or not the Corporation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability under the provisions of this Article.

ARTICLE XV DISSOLUTION

Only the Association in annual session shall authorize the dissolution or merger of the Corporation. As a wholly owned, single member organization of the Illinois Baptist State Association (IBSA), if

dissolved, all net assets and all contractual or fiduciary obligations of the Corporation become the property or responsibility of IBSA.

By passing this Article, the IBSA agrees to accept all assets and all contractual or fiduciary obligations of the Corporation upon dissolution of the Corporation by the Association.

ARTICLE XVI AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended by a vote of the Association in annual session, and the submission and approval of any amendments shall follow the same procedures required to amend the governing documents of the Association. The Bylaws may contain any provisions for the regulation and management of the affairs of the Corporation not inconsistent with law or the Articles of Incorporation.





From the Executive Director:

In 2010 a Lincoln cent penny was sold at a private auction for \$1.7 million dollars. One of the rarest pennies, its value was due to a mechanical error with the machines that stamped the pennies. The machines made a very small number of bronze pennies because copper, which was supposed to be replaced because of war rations, was stuck and unnoticed in the stamping machine. This incident in 1943 led to “the most famous error coin in American numismatics.” How a one cent coin can bring a value of \$1.7 million dollars is mind-boggling to me! What unimaginable value was placed on a small coin, basically worthless had this error not occurred.

This Annual Report is our way to communicate our stewardship of resources to you, our supporters, friends, and co-laborers in ministry. As we look at numbers and then associate them with what was a highly unusual year in 2020, I am reminded of our ministry's focus verse for 2021, Ephesians 3:20-21. “*Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly beyond all that we ask or think, according to the power that works within us, to Him be the glory in the church and in Christ Jesus to all generations forever and ever.*”

My hope is that these numbers reflect how our God can take what we see as a worthless year--one that we all want to just forget--and, despite all the obstacles and fear, continue to do immeasurably more than we could have even imagined. Our God gives this small ministry immeasurable value to those we serve in the past, the present, and for the generations to come. He does this despite our own imperfections, mistakes, or even errors. To Him be the glory!!

 Rebecca Whittington welcomed new Board members. Reported the following committee assignments:

 Motion to affirm these committee assignments made by Bennie Tomberlain, seconded by Sherman Smith. Motion approved by previous roll call.
8. Remembering Why
 Paula Joy shared stories of describing the generous donations of food items, funds, and volunteer time at various ministries. Of special note was the volunteer service of “Linda” who faithfully supported the Women of Compassion ministries right up to the time when the Lord called her home to heaven in November, 2020.
9. Recognition of Retiring Employee
 Denny Hydrick reported the retirement of Pam Adams, Administrative Assistant at Angels Cove after 26 years of faithful service. Motion made for a Statement of Appreciation be noted in the Board minutes made by Sherman Smith, second by Brock Bauer. Motion approved by previous roll call.
10. Executive Director’s Report
 Denny Hydrick reported on events and activities occurring since the last meeting:

He further noted God's provision in sustaining services in 2020 during the COVID pandemic noting new methods of service delivery including telemedicine for counseling services, purchase and remodeling of new building, and starting GraceHaven ministry.

Recommendation to approve the Change of Benefits policy on vacation so as not to conflict with other policies. Motion approved by previous roll call.

Motion to approved Administrative Committee report made by Mark Lee, second by Denny Tomberlain. Motion approved by previous roll call.

14. Finance and Development Committee Report and Recommendations

Emily Tynes reported that the committee has no recommendations.

Krystal Donelson review the financial reports noting year-end expense in 2020 were higher than previous year resulting in drawdown of investment funds as was anticipated in the budget. She also updated the Board on the status of the Payroll Protection Program loan offered in response to COVID. Application for loan forgiveness to the Small Business Administration has been impeded due to technical issues in the automated loan processing system. Staff are vigilantly tracking this issue. Finally she reported that the outside independent audit is scheduled for February. Rebecca Whittington noted that at our insistence, the audit will include onsite review of financial records.

Paula Joy reported that both church and individual giving increased in 2020 compared to 2019, notwithstanding the COVID pandemic. The mother's day offering theme is "Heart of Home". A video is in final stages of completion and will be distributed for promoting this major appeal. Plans for the Women of Compassion in-person event with COVID prevention precautions are being made. Additionally, plans for Executive Director's Dinner at Logan St. church and participation in IBSA women's event are underway.

Finance and Development Committee report was approved by consensus.

15. Program Committee Report and Recommendations.

Brock Bauer reported that FBC Maryville has agreed to serve as site for in-person Pathway counseling. He noted that in 2020, approx. 4800 hours of telemedicine counseling services were provided by Pathways staff. Using technology to provide needed service has been extremely beneficial. He noted that GraceHaven services are up and running. Ultrasound services will added upon completion of staff training.

Recommendation was made for Bennie Tomberlain to serve a Secretary of the committee. Motion approved by previous roll call.

A query was raised on the status of the review the alignment of legal counsel's position on abortion with that of BCHFS. Denny acknowledged that this matter is still pending. Rebecca Whittington stated that she will refer this matter to the Administrative Committee for review and recommendations.

Rebecca Whittington thanked all members for their commitment to serve and she looks forward to working together in the 2021. COVID has resulted in limitations on how the Board can connect with each other and she will be exploring avenues for re-connecting and strengthening our Board through spiritual unity covered with prayer using each member's talents and experience in service to the mission of BCHFS.

I. Call to Order

Rebecca Whittington called to order the regular meeting of the BCHFS Board of Trustees at 9:00 a.m. April 17, 2021 GraveHaven Pregnancy Resource Clinic, 4227 Lincolnshire Drive, Mt. Vernon, IL 62864.

II. Scripture and prayer

Chris Slusser prayed after sharing his family's adoption experience as it related to our scripture for today: Jeremiah 1:5, Psalm 139: 13-16, and John 10:10

III. Roll call

Cheryl Dorsey conducted the Roll Call. The following members were present: Sandy Absher, Sarah Ballard, Brock Bauer, Sarah Clark, Cheryl Dorsey, Jake Gray, Tina Grooms, Doug Haile, Danny Hampton, Diana Henry-Aten, Kevin Hutchinson, Rick Layne, Chris Slusser, David Smith, Sherman Smith, Bennie Tomberlain, Emily Tynes, Rebecca Whittington. Absent members: Tom Denton, Mark Lee, and Rockell Warren-Daniels.

Also attending were Denny Hydrick, Paula Joy, Mark McCormack, Bill Foote, Krystal Donelson and Mark Carney.

IV. Approval of Minutes from Last Meeting

The motion to approve the board meeting minutes for January 23, 2021 was made by Jake Gray and seconded by Ben Tomberlain. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

V. Approval of the April 17, 2021 Board Meeting agenda

The motion to approve today's board meeting agenda was made by Brock Bauer and seconded by Jake Gray. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

VI. Welcome to Visitors and Announcements

Rebecca Whittington welcomed our visitors, including Mark Carney, Atlas CPAs & Advisers LLC. Noting the largest "in person" and recent seating of new board members, the Chair launched a round of self-introductions by BCHFS board members.

VII. Seating of New Trustee

Rebecca Whittington welcome our newest board member, David Smith, Pastor, First Baptist in Grayville, Illinois. Dave will be assigned to the Finance & Development committee. The motion to affirm the committee assignment made by Kevin Hutchinson and seconded by Danny Hampton. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

VIII. Recognition of Staff Anniversary

Denny Hydrick recognized Bill Foote, Compliance and Quality Improvement Manager for 20 years of service at BCHFS. The motion for a Statement of Appreciation was made by Jake Gray and seconded by Doug Haile. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

IX. Mother's Day Presentation

Paula Joy, Director of Development and Marketing, introduced the new look of the various Mother's Day promotional materials being used in this year's donation drive. Paula also gave background and context to the "Kat & Colton's Story" video presentation referenced in the promotional material.

X. Executive Director's Report – Denny Hydrick

1. General Report.

- A. Denny updated the board on staff recruitment for open positions (5), as well as his outreach visits to local associations, churches, and the annual IBSA convention.
- B. The **BCHFS Strategic Planning Retreat**, to be held May 5 & 6, 2021 at Pere Marquette, and board members are welcome and should contact Melinda Thomas, if interested in participating. This will be a prime point of future planning for this ministry.
- C. The **July Board Meeting & New Member Orientation**. The July board meeting will have a lighter agenda, which will allow us to accommodate the "new member orientation" postponed due to the pandemic. The board meeting agenda will include a report of the Strategic Planning Retreat and the Executive Director's evaluation.

Rebecca Whittington notes the New Member Orientation is scheduled in tandem with the July board meeting and will allow existing board members to get reacquainted. Board members are also requested to submit Bible verses that they feel speaks to our mission to our Board Chairman or Executive Director.

2. Denny reviewed the **Service Delivery Report** published for this quarter; noting the steady service activity for Pathways this quarter: New clients 100, Individ./Families 321, Total services provided 1,081. The strong numbers speaks to the impact TeleHealth on Pathways ability to provide services during the pandemic.
3. The Executive Director reported on **Ad Hoc Committee Meeting**, thanking those who volunteered to be on the committee as they assisted in fulfilling the task of guiding and advising the Executive Director in moving forward with our Development Team structure.
4. The Executive Director reported on **Approved Item Between Board Meetings**: Approval of the Client Relations Officer job description.
5. **Staff Retirement**. Denny Hydrick "reluctantly" reports that our Director of Clinical Services, Mark McCormack will be retiring August 31, 2021. Mark will continue as a part-time counselor.

XI. Audit Report

Mark Carney of Atlas CPAs & Advisers LLC reported on the BCHFS Audit for Year Ending 201. As noted in the audit report, BCHFS received an "Unqualified Opinion" on its financial statements, which is the highest-level opinion that can be given on financial statements.

Opinion: "In our opinion, the financial statements referred to approve present fairly in all materials respects, the financial position of Baptist Children's Home and Family Services as of December 31, 2020 and 2019, and the changes in its assets and its cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America."

Rebecca Whittington requested Bennie Tomberlain lift a Prayer of Thanksgiving for God's sustaining faithfulness in light of the positive audit report. After prayer, Danny Hampton recognized the integrity and service of Krystal and Denny, as good stewards of BCHFS assets and interests to be noted in the minutes.

Cheryl Dorsey asked the **status of PPP forgiveness application process** for the PPP loan of \$339,043. Krystal Donelson and Denny Hydrick recapped the background and steps they have taken in the process when working with Cabbage and now K Servicing (lender). They also noted technical glitches they experienced with website; a special document-sign cloud is required but not yet available. Application must be made digitally; hard copy application was rejected. Both Krystal and Denny are monitoring this closely to insure completion prior to August deadline. They are awaiting the online release of the new SBA forms.

XII. Committee Reports

1. Administrative Committee Report & Recommendations – Sarah Ballard.

The Administrative committee chair, Sarah Ballard, presented eight recommendations for approval (While listed in the handout, the recommendation “to approve revised policy” was tabled in committee). Rebecca Whittington notes that the committee recommendations come as a motion and a second.

Recommendation #1 – To approve the recommended change to the Staff Development Policy. The policy was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

Recommendation #2 – To approve removal of a Staff training Schedule as a policy. The policy was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

Recommendation #3 – To approve the defense of employees in litigation policy. The policy was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

Recommendation #4 – To approve the policy relating to the destruction of personnel files as it in present form contradicts the board approved Record Retention Schedule. The policy will ensure records are kept for an appropriate length of time per legal review.

Denny Hydrick explains per attorney advice, because we work with minors, BCHFS will maintain these records for 22 years, which is “18 plus 4.” This covers the period a minor can sue through their first 18 years plus 4 more years to age 22. The policy correction was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

Recommendation #5 – To approve the policy relating to the destruction of personnel files as it currently contradicts the Personnel Record Policy. The policy corrections (as displayed on screen) were unanimously approved by Roll Call.

Recommendation #6 – To approve a consolidated Transportation policy per the recommendation of our new liability carrier. Denny Hydrick explains our liability carrier has asked for a Driver Conduct section be added to the policy. He also notes that in the future the wording will be updated. The policy as presented was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

Recommendation #7 – To approve the new policy regarding helmets.

Denny shares a past work experience where a house parent died in front of the kids while skateboarding. Which emphasizes the importance of a helmet policy. Brock Bauer questioned if the helmet policy should apply to all open-wheeled devices (i.e., ATVs, 4-wheelers, hoverboards, etc.).

After much discussion, Rebecca Whittington recognized Jake Gray's motion to amend the motion on the floor, and include additional wording suggested by Chris Slusser. The helmet policy was amended to include the phrasing: *"And any activity as deemed necessary by the Executive Director, including but not limited to all open-wheeled devices (i.e., motorcycles, ATVs, 4-wheelers, hoverboards, or scooters, etc.)."* The motion to amend by Jake Gray was seconded by Bennie Tomberlain. The motion to amend was unanimously approved by Roll Call. To conclude, the recommendation to approve the helmet policy, as amended, was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

Recommendation #8 – To approve newly created job description of Client Relations Officer. The policy was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

2. **Finance & Development Committee Report & Recommendations** – Emily Tynes.

The Finance & Development committee chair, Emily Tynes, presented a three recommendations for approval.

Recommendation #1 – To accept the Audit Report. The report was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

Recommendation #2 – To approve the Overage of the Timber Stand Improvement.

Emily shares that additional funding is needed to exterminate the Japanese Chaff Flower. Denny gives a brief overview of the issue. While the Timber Stand Improvement Plan was approved by the Board in 2017 and accepted by the State, we now must deal with an invasive flower, the Japanese Chaff flower, which has taken over 40 to 50 acres of the property. Last year's controlled burn was only partially successful, so we need to do another burn, as well as the scheduled components of the improvement plan, resulting in additional costs. The total cost will be \$40,290.00, Denny notes that \$20,000 of this amount was approved in this year's budget. Approval of this recommendation would cover the additional \$20,920.00. Note also that we have been approved for a grant by the State to receive a refund for these expenses money, but receipt is not anticipated until about 2023.

The Timber Stand Improvement Overage was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

Recommendation #3 – To approve reallocation of the Capital Money for Security System. BCHFS did not receive the actual estimate until after the 2021 budget was approved, hence the estimated cost used in the budget was low. With Board approval, \$20,000.00 from the \$50,000 Angels' Cove designated money at the Southern Baptist Foundation will be used to complete the project at Angels' Cove. The actual cost of project is \$56,287.00. The reallocation of the Capital Money for Security System was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

A. **Financial Report** – Krystal Donelson

Krystal Donelson presented the Financial and Investment reports highlighting key items noted below. The complete presentation is available on the Board Portal, and Krystal is happy to answer any Board questions.

2020 Year End

- In 2020 BCHFS received its 2nd highest **gift income** since 2003 despite the pandemic and not including PPP. A miracle.
- **Bequests** at \$119,110.00 in 2020 were low compare to previous years. However, we have already received \$124,000 this year.

- **2020 Non-gift income.** Counseling Fees were the highest we have ever received almost \$315,000; on average we are at less than \$200,000 annually. Direct Support was our lowest year attributable to our low census last year. Adoption Fees came in at \$72,000, which agrees with the average.

2021 – First Quarter

- **Gift income** 7% below budget but 9% above 2020 levels.
- **Total Revenue** is 6% below budget and 7% above 2020.
- **Total Expenses** are 12.6% less than budget and 9.5% above 2020.
- **Income.** At the end of the quarter this year, our income which includes our investment withdrawals was \$2,000 above expenses. Our budget called for us to be \$84,000 in expenses over income, we have had a decent quarter.
- **Professional Training Expense.** We will run over budget in professional training for GraceHaven because the Ultrasound training anticipated for 2020 did not occur until the first quarter of 2021. Cost: \$8,000.00.
- **Capital Expenditures.** Replacement of Angels' Cove furnaces at \$5,600.00. Angels' Cove conference room flooring will be installed next week with payment upon completion. Flooring for Ballard and Mathias Cottages is finished, and that bill be paid next week and appear on next quarter's report.
- **Investment Report.** We started the year with a market value of all investment accounts at \$5.4 Million, and as of March 31, 2021, we are at \$5.56 Million, which is an increase in our market value. We did realize a gain of \$83,816 on our liquidation from our Quasi-endowment fund to build our operations reserves so we can withdraw money. So that came out of flexible income fund and our equity fund. We had the addition of a \$125,000 bequest, and we have taken out \$120,000 in withdrawals. We had \$59,000 income for the quarter, an addition of \$125,000, a withdrawal of \$120,000, and an unrealized loss of \$25,959.

B. Development Report – Pamela Joy

Pamela thanked the Board for the opportunity to serve as the Director of Development and Marketing. She currently engaged in building the team to serve on this mission field.

- **Giving.** Church Giving is steady over the first quarter, we received an estate gift, and we have realized an increase in our individual giving not counting the bequest. In the midst of a pandemic, we are especially grateful for the giving from churches and individuals.
- **New Hire.** Pat Scarborough as our fulltime Media Specialist. Pat is from Fairfield and was highly recommended by Pastor Bennie Tomberlain (Board member), and Carmen Halsey (IBSA). Pat is currently updating our website and working on our social media for job postings, etc.
- **Job Openings.** Denny and Paula have been interviewing several people for our development positions; they are wonderful candidates, but we are waiting on the Lord, trusting Him for the right candidates. We do not want to rush into anything. We are praying over positions and ask that you join us in those prayers as the candidates will represent the ministry.
- **Women of Compassion.** A wonderful event held on March 6th at Logan Street Baptist Church. The goal was to have 50 women and we had over a 125 in attendance. They have experience growth (30% each year) and increases we have seen in Women of Compassion over the past 11 years. The original goal was to have 100 Women of Compassion, and we exceeded that at 109 this year. For years

we sought church representatives to share in our churches, but now we have 109 Women of Compassion who are going back to their churches and sharing the ministry. They recommend people, refer people, and tell others how they can give and become Women of Compassion. We celebrate that. The March 6th event is available on the website, but it does not compare with the in-person experience.

- **Mother's Day Appeal.** Paula went through the Mother's Day Appeal promotional materials (i.e., individual & church mailers, QR codes, videos, etc.) that have already been mailed. Cheryl Dorsey asked if digital downloads of the promotional material are available? Yes, they are available and posted on the website. Mother's Day is May 9th and many churches run their offer through Father's Day.
- **Director's Dinner** this year has been moved to October 15th at 6:30 at Logan Street Baptist Church in Mt. Vernon. The third quarter Board meeting will be held in Carmi.
- **Priority 2021.** We will be promoting GraceHaven at the conference.
- **Fall Festival.** September 18th. We welcome volunteers for that planning committee.

Pamela shared and reemphasized the scripture for year: Ephesians 3:20-21. *"Now to him who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, 21 to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, for ever and ever! Amen."* This week this verse has become a reality.

One week ago, one of our young mothers at Angels' Cove gave birth to a 1.5 lbs. baby, at 27th weeks. The update: The baby has survived a week, mother is doing well, and in the deciding mode between adoption or choose adoption. We also have her parents who are involved and helping, and in the midst of all these decisions and emergency events . . . this young woman accepted Christ as her Savior! Please pray for these families we serve. Rebecca Whittington requests prayer for this new mom and baby. Bro. Kevin Hutchinson leads us in prayer for them and all involved in her care.

Danny Hampton had comments for Paula, and shares a phrase, "Price is just an objection in the absence of value." Regarding Women of Compassion, I think the price of \$50 a month (for 10 months) should not be an objectionable if they know the value. In asset gathering for the BCHFS have you made any contacts for appreciated stock or gift annuities? Or are you familiar with that? Paula notes some familiarity with it; it is not an area they have pursued. Danny volunteered to assist with that and referenced the Southern Baptist Foundation in Nashville and others to see a positive result. Moody Bible Institute has been particularly good at that, and while they are a larger organization with a larger budget and reach, there is no reason we can why we can do the same things. Rebecca asks that we pray for Paula in her work, and in appreciation of the time and energy she has invested and planted.

3. **Program Committee Report & Recommendations** – Brock Bauer

No recommendations. Brock does highlight the **Strategic Planning** Session May 5-6, 2021 at Pere Marquette. Every board member is invited to participate if they wish. If you wish to participate, please contact Melinda. This will a very important time for the BCH.

Brock also shares a prayer request with the Board regarding staffing. We are down one house parent at Angels' Cove, we need 2 couples for parents at the Children's Home, and our Pathways counselors are at full capacity, so we are looking for 2 new counselors in Maryville. Denny adds, "or counselors anywhere."

XIV. Miscellaneous Business – Denny Hydrick & Rebecca Whittington.

Retirement –Denny Hydrick “reluctantly” shares that Mark McCormack has announced his retirement from BCHFS as Director of Clinical Services, effective August 31, 2021. Mark will stay on part time as a counselor. “Mark loves the Lord, loves what he does, and loves people. He is one of the most passionate people I know, and we at BCHFS will miss that component of leadership.”

Resolution. Rebecca Whittington shares that Sister Delores ~~DanielsHunter~~ passed away between board meetings; she was a pillar of faith; Woman of Compassion and she gave sacrificially. Rebecca Whittington asks the Board to entertain a motion to send a Resolution to her family acknowledging the appreciation for her unwavering support and Christian mentorship through Women of Compassion. The motion is made by Jake Gray and seconded by Bennie Tomberlain.

Question from the floor: For equity’s sake, are we going to do this for all women going forward? Rebecca believes that when people impact our ministry, the Board should issue a resolution, recording our appreciation in the minutes. This motion is specifically for Delores ~~DanielsHunter~~, but similar actions should be written up as the need arises. Denny notes there is no BCHFS policy, however, when someone to directly affiliated with the ministry in leadership capacity, like Ron and Delores, the practice is to send flowers to the funeral in recognition. The ~~DanielsHunters~~ raised in excess of \$8,000 in memorials. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

Rebecca Whittington notes the changes in State leadership with departure of Sammie Simmons to NAMB, and the onboarding of our new IBSA president, Heath Tibbets.

XV. Executive Session – Rebecca Whittington.

Meeting Minutes

July 17, 2021

I. Call to Order

Rebecca Whittington called to order the regular meeting of the BCHFS Board of Trustees at 9:05 a.m. July 17, 2021 GraveHaven Pregnancy Resource Clinic, 4227 Lincolnshire Drive, Mt. Vernon, IL 62864. The meeting began five minutes late due to the advisory committee meeting which ran over by a few minutes.

The Chair notes that today's board meeting is also a retreat that will serve as an orientation to new board members and be a time for the rejuvenation of effort, rekindling of spirit, and refreshing of relationships within the board.

II. Scripture and prayer

Denny Hydrick and Sandy Absher shared during our devotional time. Denny shared on how to be "plugged in" so that the ministry has impact and changes lives. He recalls the "What If" questions we often ask in life. In the biblical context:

What if . . .

- . . . God hadn't provided a ram in the bush for Abraham & Isaac?
- . . . Noah had not built the Ark?
- . . . Moses had turned and ran from the burning bush instead of running to it?
- . . . Jonah had remained stubborn inside the belly of that great fish and not gone to Nineveh?

. . . *outcome of those decisions would have had generational impact.*

Carrying this thought further, into our BCHFS context:

What if . . .

- . . . Today I decide I'm not going to go to this meeting?
- . . . Today I decide that I'm not going to speak my thoughts?

Sometime little decisions that we make at a crucial moments can not only impact the present but the work we do here can have ***generational impact***. Denny notes that throughout scripture, God often references generational work, changes, and outcomes. Specifically referencing the Book of Joshua where the Children of Israel miraculously cross the River Jordan to enter the Promised Land. In celebration of that miracle, Joshua has one man from each tribe bring a stone and build an altar in Gilgal memorial so that when their children ask what the stones represent, they can recount to those generations how God delivered them. Sadly, we learned in Judges 2:10:

*"After that whole **generation** had been gathered to their ancestors, another **generation** grew up who knew neither the Lord nor what he had done for Israel."*

They didn't do a good job of passing on to their children the testimony of the stones and what the Lord had done for them at the River Jordan.

So often in the work that we do we are not privileged to see the results of those changes. Continuing in this theme, Denny asks Sandy Absher to share her childhood testimony, which she calls her

“Delores Petticoe Story.” Sandy shared her of coming to faith in Jesus Christ at the age of 6 because Delores invited her to VBS. She particularly shared the impact that childhood decision for Christ has had in her family for current and future generations. Sandy “fell in love with Jesus.” Mom and Dad also fell in love with Jesus and never missed church. By the time, Sandy graduated high school, 14 other family members came to know Jesus at that time, but that’s not the end of the story. In 2020, Sandy and Bill saw their 8 yr. old granddaughter come to Jesus. “Suffer the little children to come unto me.” Matthew 19:14 Children are fearless in sharing Jesus, and they are our greatest resource!

What if Delores had decided not to ask Sandy to VBS that day long ago? Generations were impacted by Delores’ invitation & Sandy’s acceptance. Denny closes our time in prayer

III. Roll call

Board President Rebecca Whittington prefaces Roll Call by providing the set up of the Introduction & Connection section that will immediately follow Roll Call. Everyone is asked to introduce themselves and share how God connected them to BCHFS.

Cheryl Dorsey conducted the Roll Call. The following members were present: Sandy Absher, Brock Bauer, Sarah Clark, Cheryl Dorsey, Tom Denton, Jake Gray, Tina Grooms, Danny Hampton, Diana Henry-Aten, Kevin Hutchinson, Rick Layne, Chris Slusser, Emily Tynes, Rockell Warren-Daniels, and Rebecca Whittington. Absent members: Sarah Ballard, Doug Haile, Mark Lee, Bennie Tomberlain, David Smith, and Sherman Smith.

Also attending today’s meeting were Denny Hydrick, Mark McCormack, Bill Foote, Sarah Userly and Krystal Donelson.

IV. Introduction & Connection

As prefaced in the sections above, as part of the Board Retreat & Orientation, the Introduction section was expanded so that all Board members and staff present could introduce themselves and share their unique connection with BCHFS of Illinois.

A powerful, tearful, and joyful time.

There were many powerful testimonies of strong connections wrought through: 1) their love of Jesus, 2) their love for and work with children in their work, church and family life, 3) seeing children come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ, 4) God’s faithfulness through crises pregnancies and other life experiences, 5) personal experiences as an adoptee or an adoptive parent, 6) God’s power through counseling ministry through life challenges & tragic loss, as well as 7) many who God drew through their church’s belief in and support for BCHFS.

Danny Hampton commented about the diversity of life experience around the table noting that, “the ground is level at the foot of the cross.”

After sharing her connection, Rebecca Whittington shares Psalms 56:8, which the Holy Spirit brought to her remembrance as she listened to the many testimonies: *“Thou tellest my wanderings: put thou my tears into thy bottle: are they not in thy book?”* Our tears aren’t futile, this as been a powerful bonding experience.

After all the shares, Pastor Jacob Gray closes this section with prayer. To God be the glory.

VI. Adoption of the July 17, 2021, Board Meeting Agenda

The motion to approve today's board meeting agenda was made by Jake Gray and seconded by Danny Hampton. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

VII. Welcome to Visitors and Announcements

While we had no visitors today, Rebecca Whittington has invited a guest encourager. The honorable David Overstreet and his wife Suzanne are strong Christians and friends of the ministry, and in his position, David can testify to the impact of the BCHFS ministry on his family and Mt. Vernon. He was unable to attend today but will hopefully a guest at the January meeting.

VIII. Board Retreat and Orientation

Due to the constraints of the pandemic, we missed our normal new board member orientation. Consequently, Rebecca Whittington shared how God had laid on both she and Denny's hearts the need for a board retreat and orientation to inform new and refresh current board members. So the reports' sections will not be like our regular quarterly reports, but will be from the perspective of what board members need to know to be informed and plugged in.

IX. Executive Director's Report – Denny Hydrick

1. General Report.

- A. Denny had donor related meetings and preached at several of IBSA churches since the April board meeting, including Freedom Baptist, Oblong, Clay City, Ten Mile.
- B. Attended Critical Incident Training in April 2021.
- C. Conducted a Strategic Planning Retreat at the Pere Marquette Lodge & Conference Center, staff and two or three board members were in attendance.
- D. Met and signed an agreement with an architect who will draw up rough plans for the consideration should we decide to replace some of our older cottages. This was budgeted for this year.
- E. We are very near completion of the transition to one electronic record system, where Pathways, Residential Care, and Angels Cove will all be using the same system. While challenging, it's moving along.
- F. Timber Stand Improvement Plan has been initiated in 2021. Ozark-Corolli Ecosystem Services will be marking trees and has completed and will do another controlled burn in the Fall. In addition, they will be spraying invasive species discussed in our previous report.
- G. As reported in late 2019, BCHFS signed an agreement with a local energy company to drill for oil on our property. Then, the bottom fell out of the oil market. Last month they notified me that they are ready to proceed, they have dug one well, and it is a good producer. While doing that, they have located an even more promising site. So, through this God may provide supplementary income.
- H. We've hired a new couple to house parents in Carmi, the Landings, who come with house parent experience from Arkansas. A former house parent couple, Don, and Dora Riley have returned to Angel Cove. We've also hired a new staff accountant who will replace Emily, who is expecting a baby any day now. We continue to interview for the development position, and still have an opening for house parents.

We have created a commercial video featuring house parents discussing their call to this ministry. It is designed and appropriate for a pastor or church to share during service. It is available on the website. There may be a couple in our churches called to this type of service.

- I. On July 1, 2021, the BCHFS staff received the pay raises budgeted and approved by the board, and the staff communicated its thanks to the boards via emails to the executive director. Denny read a Thank You Card received from a long-term staff member.
2. Denny reviewed the **Service Delivery Report** published for this quarter. Total services provided in June, 498. You will notice that GraceHaven service numbers are now included in this report, and we have worked with 10 women who will probably keep their babies. A doxology moment, Rebecca Whittington observes.

X. **Financial Report** – Krystal Donelson

Krystal Donelson gives a brief report noting that hardcopies of the Financial and Investment reports in our folders. She summarizes by saying, “God is Good!” Krystal is available happy to answer any Board questions.

PPP Forgiveness is still pending. Krystal is in regular contact with K-Services provider, who asks us to be patient. The forgiveness portion of servicing has been handed off to a different service provider. We have done all that we can on our side. Responding to Sandy’s question on terms of repayment, Krystal notes that worse-case scenario is we’d have to pay back the loan at an estimate 1 percent over three years (to be confirmed). Denny anticipates that we will have a definitive answer by the next Board Meeting as the deadline falls in August.

The motion to accept the Director’s and the Financial reports was made by Jake Gray and was seconded by Sandy Ashber.

XI. **Board Orientation**– Denny Hydrick

Regularly the scheduled new board member orientations were canceled in 2020 and 2021 due to inclement weather and the pandemic. As a result, in this retreat Denny Hydrick provides a wealth of information for a board member orientation & refresher. He reviews the history, mission, and ministries of the BCHFS, and the responsibilities of board members and board committees (as noted in the board packet, bylaws, and his PowerPoint presentation).

BCHFS ministries include: 1) The BCH (Residential Care/Carmi), 2) Angels’ Cove Maternity Home (Mt. Vernon), 3) Faith Adoption Ministry (statewide), 4) Pathways Counseling (11 locations), and 5) GraceHaven (Mt. Vernon).

BCHFS Funding. Denny reviews the sources of BCHFS funding. We have always raised our own money for the BCHFS. In meeting with pastors and churches, Denny is careful to share that we do not receive funds from the Cooperative Program and have not in 104 years.

Board Composition. Denny provides an overview of BCHFS BOT composition (materials provided in board packets/notebooks) and reviews the standing committees of the BOT (as delineated in our bylaws).

Highlights:

- There are 21 board members with 4 *ex officio members* who are IBSA board officers, who have voting privileges. See bylaws (located on the Board Portal) for specific details.

- Due to Illinois licensing requirements, our board meets quarterly (unlike other IBSA boards who meet twice a year).
- This year, new board members were seated via Zoom meetings. Denny reminds board members of their roles and responsibilities.
 - You are encouraged to “be engaged, be curious, & ask questions.”
- Standing Committees responsibilities are detailed in the bylaws, “**Section VI – Committees of the Board of Trustees.**” Standing Committees of the BOT are:
 - **Advisory Committee.** Bylaws – Section VI, paragraph A.
Denny shares an addition he has made to the responsibilities of the Advisory committee pursuant to the practice by which we operate, and felt it should be recorded for future generations:
“The Advisory committee shall meet with the executive director prior to the July board meeting for the purposes of the review and evaluation of the executive director’s performance and recommend any corrective action needs or recommend any salary change.”
 - **Administrative Committee.** Bylaws – Section VI, paragraph B.
 - **Program Committee.** Bylaws – Section VI, paragraph C.
 - **Finance and Development Committee.** Bylaws – Section VI, paragraph D.
- Your Role as a Board Member. The Mission of the agency is not set by the executive director or the staff.
 - It is the Board’s responsibility to establish, review, and ensure the agency stays in compliance with the mission.
 - Set policies to make sure the mission is fulfilled. Policies are integral our ability to function.
 - Establish long- and short-term goals and work with the agency.
 - Establish fiscal guidelines. As a board, the fiscal oversight of the ministry is the responsibility of the board, as a whole. While these things are monitored more closely by the finance committee, but each person on the board is responsible for the oversight of that.
 - Help to provide adequate financial resources and support. “Friend-raising.” Be an ambassador, a champion for the ministry.
 - Recommend others with desirable skillsets to serve on the Board. See bylaws, Section III, paragraph 3, Qualifications.
- Denny shares these Helpful tips:

7 Deadly Sins of Board of Trusteeship

1. Acceptance without commitment
2. Membership without attendance
3. Affiliation without dedication
4. Meetings without participation
5. Decisions without integrity
6. Involvement without advocacy
7. Identification without giving

7 Deadly Positions of Trusteeship

1. “We’ve never done it that way before.”
2. “It can’t be done.”
3. “It will cost too much.”
4. “We’re doing alright without it.”
5. “Let’s put it off for now and discuss it later.”
6. “We tried it that way and it didn’t work.”
7. “We’re not ready now.”

Group Prayer Chain Email Pray@BCHFS.com. Denny Hydrick has established a group email to share with those who are willing to pray for the agency, staff, and board member needs.

Update the Board Contact Sheet. Denny Hydrick asks that the board complete the contact sheet and questionnaire. If you are willing to participate in the prayer chain, note “Yes, I’d like to participate,” and add this to the to the bottom of the sheet.

Lunch break: As we prepare to receive “natural food,” Rebecca Whittington asks Kevin Hutchinson to pray and give thanks for the “spiritual food” we received this morning and ask the Lord’s blessings on our lunch.

XII. Strategic Planning – Denny Hydrick

Denny gives a report and summary on our strategic planning process so far. We recently held a 2-day retreat at Pere Marquette, where we began the strategic planning process. Denny looks at our origins and the faith exhibited by those who started the BCHFS.

“Many wondered if the Baptist community of Carmi, would have a strength to continue the ambitious plans for the orphanage, since many southern Illinois citizens were taken by the influenza. But as is so often does, necessity overrules the luxury of doubting. The burden of parentless and homeless children had grown even more during the Spanish Flu Epidemic, quickly outstripping the amount of orphans left in the wake of WWI.”

We now see the results of that faithfulness, and we are in a position today to set similar foundations for the future.

Denny provides an overview to questions discussed during strategic planning retreat, define a SWOT analysis, and reviews the employee survey.

- We received 39 responses from staff, which were anonymous
 - Clarity of our mission – 38 strongly agreed they had a good understanding of the mission.
 - The greatest need for the agency’s leadership to address in the next 3 to 5 years
 - 30% fell into staffing/corp. structure/organization
 - Program improvement
 - The SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, & Threats) Analysis
 - Top three strengths – 50% of responses noted that we were Christ-centered, a called staff, & our ministry focus; 13% Leadership & Vision; 10% Programs & Benevolence (the people we serve); 10% We are a “trauma informed agency;” 10% listed our funding and donors (staff is appreciative that we have donors that pay the paychecks); 4% listed our history/longevity; and 3% fell into miscellaneous topics.
 - Top three weaknesses – 77 responses; 17% Programs not diverse or our processes/outcomes were a weakness; 16% felt staff (short staffed or turnover); 16% technology, training, tools to do your work (safety/physical environment); 14% communication (top-down, flow of information from supervisors); 12% lack of promotion (marketing/advertisement of our services/public relations); 10% Lack of a strong plan for expanding donors or diversifying funding; 8% facilities, programs, location; 8% leadership structure.
 - Opportunities for the future of the ministry – 50 responses; 32% Enhance or expand our programs; 26% New programs (transitional living); 20% Help More/Share Christ More/Support More; 12% Promote/Network more; 8% Technology upgrades & upgrades to our facilities.
 - Threats to the BCHFS, current or future – 39 responses; 36% political/social/govt. interference for a faith-based service.

Example: In KY the governor threatened not to sign the religious waiver allows Sunrise (our counterpart in KY) service residents and receive state funding. The governor changed his/her mind and signed the waiver. Without that waiver that agency would have gone out of business.

21% staff retention/fatigue; 18% aging donors/church closures/denomination decline; 13% litigation/lawsuits; 11% program death (not meeting contemporary needs).

- Areas or items you feel we must address in the next 3 to 5 years? 51 responses; 25% staffing issues (retention/development needs); 24% program structure/design (staffing model); 12% replace cottages & staff housing; 10% “I don’t know.” 8% outcomes/models of care; 8% communications; 6% promotion/marketing; 6% miscellaneous.
 - Core Values – Denny felt strongly that we need to land strongly on our core values. While not formally read for board action, here are some of the core values discussed during the strategic planning retreat. Our filter.
 - **BCHFS C. A. R. E. S.**
 - C – Christ focused (centered)
 - A – Attitude focused (gratitude, grace, & mercy)
 - R – Relationship focused (Customer: client, donor, churches, coworkers)
 - E – Excellence focus (Self Spiritually; become an outcome driven program w/the metrics that confirm)
 - S – Stewardship focus (Resources, staff & clients)

A preliminary report of concepts discussed during our strategic planning retreat included:

- **Organization & Leadership** with enhanced review of and revision of our staff structure and job descriptions. Collaborative management style. Focus on and implement a staff training protocol. Training our supervisor. Risk management. Improve our communication. Focus on staff retention and improvement. Discipling & mentoring staff. Discussions about branding.
- **Operational Needs** – Communications; IT and enhanced systems. Functional space in our offices, cottages, and staff housing. Maintenance of property long-term. Transitional plans in our leadership. Move from the fire-fighting mode. Disaster plans. Creating a collaborative culture and support. Networking and professional growth for staff.
- **Programs** – Create a process to review our programs. Relevance to 2021 & 2022. Stabilizing our programs. Expansion of current programs: teaching life skills, job skills, & trades. Expand our scholarship fund & encouraging our kids to use it. GraceHaven Mobile Unit. Improved Marketing of our services. Increasing the number of therapists. Transitional Living, which is 18 to 20 years old. Homes for sex trafficking victims (DCFS advises that rural setting are the ideal place for these homes). Specialized services around residential care. Family care model around residential care. Statewide community hubs for the ministry; satellite offices/outposts around the state (mobile units). Establish and maintain an alumni association.
- **Infrastructure & Facilities** – New cottages. Hathaway renovation. Ropes course: without certified staff it’s a liability (it’s staff intensive and an attractive nuisance if it remains idle). It’s Denny’s opinion that it is a liability and should be removed. Properties – Aging and current facilities. Need for fiberoptics on the campus. Allow outside groups to use our facilities, like a seminary extension or additional Sunday schools rooms to local churches.

- **Finance & Funding** – Donor engagement and expansion. Minimizing social media; advertising constraints. Emphasize our independence / we do not receive Cooperative Program dollars. Corporate matching donations. Our insurance is partially self-funded and so we carry liability and need to minimize our risk.
- **From the Executive Director’s perspective** – Threats/Concerns – denominational changes; engaging with the churches; reach across denominational lines to have like minded people support the ministry. Finalize our core values. We have significant social and legal challenges against faith-based agencies. Licensing changes and requirements. We have no religious exemption or waiver in the State of Illinois. Education – home district must fund education for BCH kids. Minimize risk, cost of our benefit package. Resident staff property security: how do we secure our properties. The heaviness of our non-liquid assets.

XIII. Miscellaneous Business – Denny Hydrick & Rebecca Whittington.

Budget Preparation. Denny notes that the Directors meet next week to prepare the budget for the BOTs approval in October.

Rebecca Whittington asks the Board, “Where to we fit in?” As we moved out of the pandemic, we need to be plugged into the base. We also need to be plugged in to one another. The prayer email will help us focus on the needs of the ministry and one another.

What can we do to be better friend-raisers and fundraisers? In every board packet folder, you’ve been provided with an “elevator speech” for sharing and building relationships with BCHFS.

We reviewed the giving by association, we looked at our budget (we are looking at a \$1M gap), and we need to be a resource and a support to our Developmental Director and Officer. As we reflect on the 7 deadly sins of a trusteeship, and the 7 deadly positions of trusteeship, how do we measure up? What’s our commitment?

Thank you & Congratulations, Mark McCormack on your retirement! Mark shares a watchword he lives by: “Every day you get a chance to be either grateful or hateful.” I’ve been really grateful for you and my clients. Thank you.

Closing Prayer – Chris Slusser

Motion to go into Execution Session was made by Tina Grooms, and seconded by Sandy Asbher.

The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

XIV. Executive Session – Rebecca Whittington.

Motion to open executive session by Brock Bauer and seconded by Rick Layne. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call. A quorum of 14 was present.

Motion to go into regular session made by Danny Hampton and seconded by Tom Denton. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

XV. Return to Regular Session

The chair entertains a motion to accept the Advisory committee’s recommendation for the executive director salary. The recommendation from committee was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

The chair entertains a motion to accept the executive director’s proposed staff salary schedule. Motion made by Chris Slusser and seconded by Brock Bauer. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

XVI. Adjournment

Rebecca Whittington entertained a motion to adjournment subject to prayer; the motion was made by Emily Tynes and seconded by Rockell Warren-Daniels. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call, and the meeting adjourned after a closing prayer by Brock Bauer at 2:21 p.m.

Rebecca Whittington called to order the regular meeting of the BCHFS Board of Trustees (BOT) at 9:00 a.m. on October 16, 2021. GraceHaven Pregnancy Resource Clinic, 4227 Lincolnshire Drive, Mt. Vernon, IL 62864. Chris Slusser and Cheryl Dorsey open the meeting with prayer.

II. Scripture and prayer

Cheryl Dorsey shares on the importance of sight, seeing, and vision. Through her experience with cataracts, we are reminded of importance of our eyes being enlightened with spiritual understanding (Eph. 1:18). Through Hagar's encounter with on El-Roi, The God-Who-Sees (Genesis 16:13), we are assured that God "sees" is aware of our situations, at all times. And, through lessons learned in Hebrews, grasp the responsibility we have to God and that "great cloud of witnesses," (Hebrews 12:1) as we carry out the mission. As relates to the BCHFS that "great cloud of witnesses" include people like Rev. D.F. Marlin of First Baptist Church, his two deacons, John W. Hall and Eben Renshaw, and the 20 families who sacrificially gave \$3,000 to purchase the first 40 acres of land for an orphanage in 1918. They "laid aside every weight" to heed God's call and give sacrificially during the height of WW1 and the Spanish Flu pandemic to start an orphanage that would become BCHFS, a five-fold ministry. Pastor Marlon was only at FBC of Carmi for 6 years (1916-1922). He like Esther was put in this place "for such a time as this." He obeyed God.

"Now may the God of peace, who through the blood of the eternal covenant brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, equip you with everything good for doing his will, and may he work in us what is pleasing to him, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen." Hebrews 13:20, 21

The time of devotion closed with a circle of prayer lead by Cheryl Dorsey.

Nate Adams, IBSA Executive Director visits via Zoom at President Rebecca Whittington's invitation and provides a word of encouragement to the board. He shares some key points for the board as we work during this time of transition:

1. In the IBSA, at any given time, 10 percent of the member churches are searching for a pastor.
2. You are not alone. There is a larger Baptist family to encourage, support, and advise your board.
3. Many times, the work of the board is routine, but there are two instances when the work of a board requires heroic effort. Those times are:
 - A. In a time of leader transition.
 - B. In a time of crises. (And sometimes that time of transition is a time of crises.)

Nate reminds us of various Psalms of Assent (Psalm 22, in particular). BCHFS Board, like the children of Israel making the arduous upwardly trek from Jericho to Jerusalem, you're being called to heroic effort and "higher ground." The Psalms of Assent, like Psalm 125:1,2, which says

"A song of ascents. Those who trust in the LORD are like Mount Zion, which cannot be shaken but endures forever. As the mountains surround Jerusalem, so the LORD surrounds his people both now and forevermore."

When God calls us, challenges us, it's festival time, it's a rallying time. It's time for heroic effort, and trust in God. A board's responsibility is not to the leader or each other, the primary responsibility of the board is to its mission of the organization, and, in our case, to the God we serve. Be encouraged!

VII. Election of BCHFS BOT Officers

The vice-chairmen of the Advisory Committee, Danny Hampton, makes the report. The Advisory Committee recommends, in view of this time of transition, that the slate of BOT officers remain the same. Current BOT officers are Rebecca Whittington, Chair; Danny Hampton, Vice-Chair; and, Cheryl Dorsey, Secretary. Motion made by Tom Denton, and second by Cheryl Dorsey. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

VIII. Executive Director's (ED) Report – Denny Hydrick

The Chair advises that the ED report will include the ED's resignation, which will be voted upon as part of the acceptance of the ED report.

1. General Report.

- A. "What do you see?" Denny shares 3 photos of a woodland road in a forested area. It's the same photo, the original, then the original with two filters. Each filter gives us a different context of the picture. We also have filters. What is the context of my last ED report today? I want to focus on the context, I reflect on the last five years. Focus on the numbers . . .
 - (1) **Twelve** – In five years, Salvations in the ministry (at least 12). That's worth celebrating in God's kingdom.
 - (2) **5,571** – Since January 1, 2017, we have served 5,571 individuals in ministry.
 - (3) **\$16,051,406** – The number of dollars received from people by this ministry since January 1, 2017.

- (4) **Four**– the number of adoptions last year, the number of infants in a new home because of the ministry of BCHFS.
- (5) **Three** – Three Moms who just in the last few weeks have visited GraceHaven, and because of that ministry, they will carry their babies to term.

Let's celebrate God's work. Psalm 9:12, "Teach us to number our days carefully so we may develop wisdom in our hearts." Let's filter these things through the lenses of our Creator, who allows us to do the work.

- B. **Oil Leases.** The new well in Carmi, IL, as of August 2021, has produced gross value \$100,918.69, and 17% of the should be coming to BCHFS. In September, it produced \$82,674.19, of which \$14,040.56 (17%) should be coming to BCHFS. As of this week, they began drilling a second pump that they anticipate will be a better producer than the first one. So, Denny estimates that by year's end, BCHFS should receive approximately \$115,000 to \$120,000 in royalties. Note: We own 100% of the mineral rights on these tracks, but that is not the cases on other tracks we own. There may be some pumps where that royalties are shared.

While this is a blessing, it also creates a need for PR component to explain this income merely offsets our use of investment money that we use to operate. There is buzz in White County about "all the money coming to BCHFS due to the oil wells."

- C. **Resignation.** Denny has previously submitted his letter of resignation. Denny must change the date of his resignation from Friday, December 3rd to Wednesday, November 30th.

The motion to accept the ED's report, which includes Denny Hydrick's resignation and new out date, was made by Bennie Tomberlin and was second by Tina Grooms. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

The Chair called for a Voice Vote for all those who wish to signify by "Aye" their regrets that all this is happening in the way it is happening. The Roll Call unanimously said, "Aye!" None opposed.

IX. Report of Administrative Committee

- 1. **Administrative Committee** – Sarah Ballard, Committee Chair. (Since Sarah is joining via Zoom, Kevin Hutchinson, Cmte. Sec'y. assists by presenting the recommendations.)

- A. **Recommendation #1** – Part 1, to approve the limits of work-related Family Travel Expenses in 2022 at the current maximum of \$850.00, and Part 2, to Establish Honorarium Limits for BCHFS employees in 2022 at the current maximum \$250.00. Both items are a continuation of limits set in current policy. An annual review of these policies is required.

The policy was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

- B. **Recommendation #2** – Approval of Director of Operations & Compliance job description. With the retirement of the Director of Clinical Services, we've made some adjustments. The manager of Compliance and Quality Improvement was moved into this new position. Bill Foote is currently carrying out those responsibilities of Dir. Of Operations & Compliance, and the proposed job description aligns with current responsibilities. This recommendation to approve the job description comes from committee.

Question: *Is that a temporary change as we go through this season, or is it a permanent change?* Rebecca Whittington notes that there was some discussion on this point, that is, interim vs. permanent. The consensus was that to foster stability in day-to-day operations & upper management, the position is permanent, but can be changed by the board in the future. It does not preclude any reorganization in the future and does not bind the hands of the ED or the

board pursuant to current operational practices. This does not expand the duties that he already has, nor does it give this position hiring/firing authority.

Question: *Given Bill is in the room, is this something that should have been discussed in Executive Session?* Rebecca Whittington responds that were the discussion covering an individual's performance, it would require moving to executive session. However, in this case, we are discussing the establishment of a position.

Question: *Where is the accountability for this new position? How does the BOT know what is going on?* Kevin Hutchinson & Rebecca Whittington note according BCHFS bylaws, in the absence of the ED, the Advisory Committee will give oversight to day-to-day operations. With regard to DCFS compliance, policy has been established that provides for a backup to the ED with the clinical credentials to meet DCFS compliance standards. Per that policy, Bill Foote is already the "next in line" meets DCFS requirements. The Advisory Committee consists of the BOT Officers, and the Committee Chairs of all standing committees.

The job description was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

- C. **Report of New Officers for the Administrative Committee for 2022** – Tom Denton, Chair; Tina Grooms, Vice-Chair; and, Chris Slusser, Secretary.

Motion made by Cheryl Dorsey, and second by Brock Bauer. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

X. **Finance & Development Committee Report and Recommendations** – Emily Tynes

Financial Report – Krystal Donelson, Director of Accounting

1. **PPP Forgiveness.** Krystal Donelson reports that PPP Forgiveness is still pending but with assistance of board member Chris Slusser, she was able to contact Congressman Mike Bost (IL12), who reach out to SBA on our behalf. SBA was aware of the widespread problem with K-Services. They kept in touch with us, and Krystal continued daily monitoring of the site. On August 26, 2021, we did gain access and were able submit our application for PPP Forgiveness. Our account status is now, "Under Review," and the process takes 90 days. Krystal's hope is that the process is wrapped up by years end, so it can be reflected in our reports. Chris Slusser's assistance is greatly appreciated. We filed a complaint against K-Services with the Better Business Bureau.
 2. **Financial Report.** Krystal Donelson gives a brief report on our financial report. Our revenue continues to be below budget, but about the same as last year's. Our expenses are 13% below budget, but 7% more than last year. So, our net expenses exceeding revenue this year, ignoring our investment distributions, is at a negative \$700,000.00. So, we have been drawing off of our investment account, which Krystal will highlight in that report. Our Accounting Director reminds us that we are a non-profit, but expense-wise nothing unusual has come up.
- A. **Capital Improvement Status** highlights. See financial reports, page 11. In total, we've spent about \$95,000 YTD. We still have a few items in progress, i.e. the Angels Cove Security System, as well as, that facility's Landscaping. Our ED notes that the Angels Cove Security System is complete, Krystal indicates that we may not have received all billing for that project yet. GraceHaven Landscaping project for capital not showing any expenses for this year because we tried to take care of it with just items that would be expensed. Rather than major capital improvement. However, this project will be included again in next year's budget; in case the winter weather proves that the major project still needs to be done. That is the replacement of this porch. Recognition and gratitude is expressed by Denny for Krystal's husband, Leslie Donelson, an engineer by trade, who has helped us with this project.

- B. Investments Report.** Krystal advises that it has been an amazing year market value-wise. We began the year with a Fair Market Value of \$5.4 million, and we've taken out \$494,000 to support our operations and capital improvement projects. However, with the gains, both realized and unrealized, we're sitting at a Fair Market Value of \$5.4 million. As of this meeting date, Krystal had not received the September 30th statement from the Illinois Baptist Foundation, so the numbers reflected in the report is as of August 31st.
- C. 2022 Budget.** The 2022 budget calls for total revenues and expenses of \$3,905,000. Krystal gave an overview of the budget highlighting key items by ministry. The budget highlights include:
- Oil Lease Royalties of \$100,000 have been included in the budget. As Denny noted in his report, the royalties will be used to offset (decrease) our use of investment money used for operations.
 - Residential Care. We have a 2nd full time maintenance specialist is included in the budget. Two cottages with four sets of fulltime houseparents. Contracts Tutors to assist student with homework. ARC Training and Consultation. Sealing of campus circle.
 - Angels Cove. Two sets of houseparents. Case manager/Transportation Coordinator. ARC Training and Consultation. Painting of Cottage.
 - Faith Adoptions. Renewal of Haig accreditation is not included.
 - GraceHaven. With more historical information, we are able to improve our estimates, and reduce our utilities and maintenance budgets to be more accurate.
 - Pathways Counseling. The addition of a FT therapist (salaried) for SE Pathways, and a additional licensed (contractual) and non-licensed (salaried) therapist at Metro East.
 - Development. Giving Tuesday Appeal and Fall Festival are being combined. Title I grant income is being moved to "non-development income." Addition of both a FT marketing person, and a FT development officer.
 - General. Retirement of the Director of Accounting and accompanying training and recruitment expense.

Question: *The last time there was a search for an ED, 1) were there expenses, 2) how were they handled in the budget, and 3) how do we handled them in this budget?* Krystal explains the proposed budget was prepared and submitted to IBSA prior to the 2021 annual meeting, as required. Denny notes that last time, while the board voted to cover moving expenses, recruitment and associated expenses were not in the budget. Further, he notes that the BOT has the ability to change the budget up to within three percent, which is approximately \$100,000.00. A buffer that would cover said expenses. In closing on this question, Krystal and Denny share that there are areas (i.e., Workers Compensation premiums, Salaries for open positions, etc.) where budget vs. actual expenses will give us a slight surplus that will allow us to absorb unanticipated recruitment expenses.

Question: *Should the BOT choose to the hire of an interim ED, how are those expenses handled?* Krystal responds that an interim would receive a salary, and because Denny's salary is in this budget, a salary expense for an interim ED would be covered. Additionally, Denny's retirement percentage of between six or eight percent would provide a savings, as a new person would start with a retirement percentage of two percent. Jake Gray recalls that the last time an ED was hired, we authorized the board to spend up to \$20,000.00 from our investment account for expenses related to recruitment/hiring of an ED. Krystal concurs, and notes that the BOT has the authority to do so.

Question: *Do you have a recommendation that the BOT adjust or change the budget in light of this discussion?* As the proposed budget has already been submitted to the IBSA for their

annual book of reports (flagged as “subject to change”), but Krystal is comfortable with leaving it as is and believes we will still meet budget.

Denny highlights and wants the BOT to understand that in this budget, based on his review of the data from the past six or seven years, the proposed Residential Care budget is based on the operation of only TWO cottages. Historical data doesn't support the sustainability of more than two cottages. Once voted upon this will be a big change to the budget and to staff expectations for next year.

Question: *Do we have any tracking on what the residential care budget has been? How has the residential budget changed in regard to staffing? If the budget has stayed the same, and we are only serving 11 children, it is time to address the issue of residential care.* Denny responds that staffing overall (the number of staff) has changed dramatically, but the expenses has not decreased. Denny also notes that he made the decision to early in the year to increase the salary of our house parents to make it more marketable. Turnover for the house parent positions is high. It is challenging work.

Question: *Is there data available to determine where we stand in comparison with other children's homes?* Denny has exhaustively talk with other ministries, and there is a network of other Baptist Children's Homes executives, which meets annually. We met last month in San Antonio, TX, and there was discussion about this. Most children's homes, including Baptists, are closing down cottages. They are moving toward “a family model,” where single moms (and in one case a dad) move into the cottages. The agency then works with the kids, as mom works on her life/job skills to move toward independent living with her/his family. Florida no longer to group home care, and Oklahoma & Alabama are moving away from group home care toward this “family model.” Oklahoma only has one campus (out of three) doing group home care. We are one of the few ministries still offering group home care; the others are Mississippi, New Mexico, and Indiana. Those ministries operating successfully are smaller campuses like Illinois, Indiana, and New Mexico with two or three cottages versus up to 20 buildings.

Question: *Do you have an estimate on what percentage of our budget goes to residential care compared to the overall ministry? Because if, for example, we spend 60% of the budget on two cottages, a discussion on viability is warranted.* Denny says, in terms of dollars, \$1.2 to \$1.3 million of our expenses goes to residential care annually.

Question: *Are there plans for the shuttered cottages; and in terms of the budget, what provision has been made for maintenance of the shuttered cottages?* Denny: Various ideas on alternative uses have been discussed. A number of ideas were brought up during our recent strategic planning retreat. They are assets that should be used for ministry. Krystal: The budget includes funds for maintenance & upkeep of shuttered cottages.

Comments from the floor: 1) If you keep doing what you're doing, you'll keep getting what you're getting. 2) In view of the historical data, staffing challenges, and changes in group home care landscape, God may be telling us to study and address issues for the future. 3) This will be important as we go into the recruitment process.

Denny feels the proposed budget is a solid, robust, and doable budget. It is the best we can do to predict 2022. It is only \$28,000.00 higher and will allow the new ED to have some flexibility. Comment from the floor: This is amazing in light of the fact that we added the GraceHaven ministry this year, and with that addition, we are only \$28,000.00 higher.

Question: *Is there data available on how donations are going for nonprofits?* Denny: There is a trend upwards that is heavily focused on “mission.” New generations are more focus on the

mission versus historical or denominational value. So, it's time we communicate our mission better. Perhaps that's a name change. Perhaps a name that more accurately reflects our mission. Newer generations are moving away from the concept of group homes because children should be in families. That orphanage structure no longer exists. There are truly no orphans in the United States. Should a child have no legal guardian, the State steps in and becomes that guardian, the adult making decisions for those kids.

Comment from the floor: Fox Valley Christian Action runs Riverwoods Family Camp, and they have an apartment dedicated to use by Pastors and pastor families needing R&R. Covenant Harbor Christian Camp and Retreat Center in Lake Geneva offers a similar program to pastors and their families. Recently, we hosted a IMB missionary on furlough from Tanzania who stays on David Jerimiah's church campus in California, where they have housing for missionaries on furlough.

Question: *According to the line item, is the Executive Dinner being canceled in 2022? The Executive Dinner was turned into a fundraiser. Why was the Executive Dinner turned into a fundraiser; how did that come about?* Denny: We wanted to have a fundraiser for the GraceHaven ministry, and with COVID-19, the two events were morphed together in 2021. Given the unknowns about the pandemic, social distancing, and the like in the future, that same model (of a combined event) was budgeted for 2022.

Comment from the floor: Danny gives a word of dissent and gives an example of how the Executive Dinner in his region is a celebration, introduction to the BCHFS ministry, with outreach potential. He believes fundraiser for GraceHaven is a wonderful idea but should not replace the Executive Dinner. In the northern part of the state, the BCHFS ministry is not well known. Rebecca expresses concern about clipping the wings of the incoming ED and ask how we can address reinstating Executive Dinners in the budget. Denny says there is very little expense (food costs), and should we choose to have a few executive dinners next year, the costs would be easily absorbed in the proposed budget.

Additional Comment: As we are discussing the budget, both the executive dinner and a GraceHaven fundraiser are essentially programming issues involving discretionary funds. Shouldn't we approve the budget, and this discussion move to the Development & the Programming committee? There was agreement on discussing programming & development issues later as ordered in the agenda.

3. **Financial Committee Recommendation** – Emily Tynes. The Finance committee voted to approve the 2022 Budget/Capital Improvements as presented. This comes from the committee as a recommendation to approve the financial reports as presented, and the proposed budget for 2022.

The 2022 Budget & Capital Improvements were unanimously approved by Roll Call.

Development Report – Paula Joy, Director of Development & Marketing

- 1) **The new BCHFS tote bag** is introduced and will be used in promotions. The maroon tote not only advertises and promotes BCHFS, but also lists the other ministries available: Faith Adoptions, Pathway Counseling, Angels Cove, & GraceHaven.
- 2) **Fundraising Goals and Methods.**
 - a. **The Fundraising Dinners** – In an effort to reach a different group people, invitations were sent to major gift donors and new donors.

- b. **Social Media** – All program ministries have their own unique Facebook pages. The individual pages will offer detailed information about that ministry. Through this effort we also hope to reach clients. The BCHFS Facebook page is designated to reach and inform our donor base. Comments: Can we post announcements to Associational or Church facebook pages or websites? Can social media be an assigned task, where the person responsible reaches or and posts to these pages, etc.?
- c. **Through our Virtuous System Specific Marketing or Fundraising Emails** – These emails are targeted to a specific interests or significant calendar days. That is, in honor of a birthdate or memoriam; or geared to those with interest in babies or abortion prevention, etc. Prayer prompts are also being posted and have generated a lot of interest and engagement.
- d. **Marketing/Development Literature** are now being updated.
- e. **Development Officer** – Our new development officer is Mariah Bowker who was introduced at the dinner last night. She's has also been doing client relations for GraceHaven, working to identify our target group. She has visited health departments, schools, churches, and doing diaper drives, etc. She also connecting with Rend Lake College and getting information to students.
- f. **Fall Festival** – Our Fall Festival was a success. Despite attendance being down compared to past years, we tried both "site" and "online" quilt auctions with wonderful auctioneers who donated their time. The quilt auction raised \$25,000.00, the largest amount in many year, if not the highest. Quilts went to Oklahoma, Texas, and Missouri. Mariah actually hand-deliver the Missouri quilts to the families. While interested in quilts, they had no knowledge of BCHFS, so Mariah was able to share about the BCHFS ministry.
- g. **Thank You Notes.** A general thank you card for BCHFS has been development.
- h. **Women of Compassion Events.** We will be hosting events in northern Illinois, in the suburbs of Elk Grove Village, and the town of Chabanse.
- i. **The Newsletter** – The format has been changed from newsprint to magazine style. Question: What can the board to do to help you? Be a champion. Visit and share with your circles.

Motion to accept the Development Report was made by Jake Gray, and second by Danny Hester. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

3. **Slate of Finance Committee Officers for 2022** – Emily Tynes

Emily Tynes, Chairman; Rockell Warren-Daniels, Vice Chair; Doug Haile, Secretary

XI. Program Committee Report and Recommendations – Brock Bauer

Recommendation – The committee recommends that BCHFS not renew its Haig accreditation in 2022.

Rationale: Due to the decrease in international placements, and the willingness of all countries (with the exception of China) to allow home studies to be completed by agencies without Haig accreditation. Additionally, there have been changes in the accreditation body itself, it's an intensive process, and there are fees associated with accreditation. With these things in mind, it's the committee's recommendation that the Haig accreditation NOT be renewed.

The recommendation was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

Report of New Officers for the Program Committee for 2022 – Brock Bauer, Chair; Diana Henry-Aten, Vice-Chair; and, Sarah Clark, Secretary.

Motion made by Jake Gray, and second by Doug Haile. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

XII. Executive Director transition and Ad Hoc Committee Reports – Rebecca Whittington

1. **Bylaw review** – discussed earlier in the meeting.
2. **Review of Position Requirements and Job Description.** Tina Grooms shared the Ad Hoc committee review process and presented the changes to the ED job description made with suggestions by Denny Hydrick. A line-by-line review was completed, suggestions were made, and there was discussion on to clarify and include financial background checks pursuant to final attorney review.

The committee modified their recommendation to include the changes discussed and present the ED job description for approval. The recommendation, as discussed, was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

3. **Committee to Aid in Transition Planning** – Benny Tomlinson. Update: One matter is recommended by the committee, Denny’s laptop computer purchased in 2017 and scheduled to be replaced in 2022. The committee recommends that Denny purchased his laptop for \$225, a fifth of the purchase price. After discussion, the recommendation was amended to “give the 4 yr. old laptop computer” to Denny at no cost. This comes from the committee as a motion and a second. The recommendation, as amended was unanimously approved by Roll Call.
4. **Office and cybersecurity** – The committee reviewed various office and cybersecurity needs in transition. Overall, we are in good shape. Upon further discussion, we need an authorized signatory for the primary operation account to replace Denny Hydrick, where he is the sole signatory. The suggestion is for Emily Tynes, Finance Cmte. Chairperson to be the signatory on those accounts. Any fees required for Bonding will be considered a business cost, so no motion/action on this point is required.

Krystal Donelson secured from the files a previous resolution, which after necessary language changes, will cover the needs discussed here.

Action: Chris Slusser made a motion that the resolution that Emily Tynes, become a signatory on any account where Denny Hydrick was the sole signatory, be approved, subject to necessary language changes. The motion was second by Brock Bauer.

The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call.

5. **Liaison Committee with counsel, insurer.** Update: The claim we discussed before in now in the hands of our insurance carrier. Any discussion must be done in executive session.
6. **Interim Executive Director** – Jake Gray, Sandy Absher, & Sara Ballard. Denny supplied the committee with his thoughts on the Interim position, which Jake shared with the BOT.

Recommendation: No former employee of BCHFS should serve as Interim Executive Director.

- Will an interim be caretaker only or will that person be allowed to apply for the ED position?
- Would we consider a female for the interim position?

Action: Rebecca Whittington, BOT President & Moderator appoints the Advisory Committee to act as the Search Committee for the Interim ED, with the advice and consent of the full board.

XIII. Recognition of Retiring Board Members - Denny Hydrick. Our ED recognized all retiring board trustees: Bennie Tomberlin, Rick Layne, Mark Lee, & Jacob Gray. Thank you all.

XIV. Miscellaneous Items - Rebecca Whittington

Review of Letter drafted by Rebecca Whittington at the request Doug Morrow, Illinois Baptist Foundation. He would use the letter address, if needed to explain our transition and provide encouragement to anyone he encounters who has questions. It is for informational purposes.

XV. List of 2021 Meeting Dates and Location – Rebecca Whittington. There was discussion on changing the location of the October Board meeting to GraceHaven, and the July Board meeting would be held in Carmi.

XVII. Return to Regular Session

The board returns to regular session. The chair recognizes that we still have a quorum.

No action was taken in Executive Session.

XVIII. Adjournment

Rebecca Whittington entertained a motion to adjournment subject to prayer; the motion was made by Jake Gray and seconded by Diana Henry-Aten. The motion was unanimously approved by Roll Call, and the meeting adjourned after a closing prayer by Jake Gray.

BYLAWS
OF
ILLINOIS BAPTIST CHILDREN'S HOME AND FAMILY SERVICES

an Illinois Not For Profit Corporation
(herein called the "Corporation")

Adopted November 5, 2014
Changes approved November 7, 2019

ARTICLE I
NAME AND PURPOSE

1. **Name.** The name of the not for profit corporation is the Illinois Baptist Children's Home and Family Services (BCHFS).
2. **Purpose.** The Corporation is a nonprofit agency that is a ministry of Southern Baptists in Illinois established in 1918, and incorporated in 1939 under the laws of the State of Illinois. The Corporation recognizes the value of children and families, and is dedicated to providing Christ centered services to protect, heal and restore.

ARTICLE II
MEMBERSHIP

The Corporation has a sole member, being the Illinois Baptist State Association (the "Association").

ARTICLE III
BOARD OF TRUSTEES

1. **General Powers.** The Board of Trustees will carry out and effectuate the purposes of this Corporation and manage the business and affairs of the Corporation, with full authority to determine the service and operating programs of the Corporation and to take whatever action it may deem advisable to achieve the Corporation's objectives. The Board is accountable to the Association.
2. **Number, Election and Term.** The Board shall consist of 21 trustees, and each trustee shall serve a term of 3 years, with one-third of the trustees elected annually by the Association in its annual session. Trustees may be elected for no more than two consecutive terms, and will not be eligible for reelection to the Board until at least one year has lapsed. The president, vice president, recording secretary, assistant recording secretary, and executive director of the IBSA shall serve as ex-officio members of the board of the BCHFS. The president, vice president, recording secretary and the assistant recording secretary of the Association shall serve with vote, while the executive director of the IBSA staff shall serve without vote.

3. **Qualifications.** The primary criteria to be followed for selection of Board members shall be:
- A. An individual's ability to make a maximum contribution to attaining the goals of the Corporation.
 - B. An individual's understanding of or sympathy for the mission and purpose of the Corporation.
 - C. An individual's high level of emotional and spiritual maturity in the way they conduct their own business and in the way they relate to their own local churches.
 - D. An individual's possession of a reputable and responsible character, and who has not been convicted of a felony or indicated as a perpetrator of a child abuse or neglect report.
 - E. An individual's ability to commit to attend at least 50% of the regularly scheduled Board meetings and invest the time necessary to fulfill assigned responsibilities.
 - F. An individual's active membership in a cooperating church of the Association.
 - G. Individuals that reflect a diversity of strengths and perspectives, possess appropriate skills and experience, and reflect the community being served (ie. demographically, culturally, pastors and laity).
 - H. A minimum of 2/3 of the Board members shall be individuals not ordained to the Gospel ministry or do not derive the major portion of their income from church related employment.
 - I. Directors, officers, and employees of the Association, or entities related to the Association, or any such person whose salary is subsidized by the Association, shall not serve as members of the Board.
 - J. No church shall have more than one member on the Board at the same time. A member of the Board moving to a church, which has a member of the Board, shall resign from the Board. No church shall have a Board member if such church already has a church member on the board of both the Association and the Baptist Foundation of Illinois.
 - K. The Nominating Committee of the Association will nominate Board members for election by the Association in accordance with the rules of the Association, with consideration given to suggestions for trustees from the Executive Director of the Corporation.

4. **Resignation.** Any Trustee may resign at any time by delivering a resignation in writing to the Chairperson or Secretary of the Board. The acceptance of any resignation, unless required by its terms, shall not be necessary to make the resignation effective. The resignation shall be effective when the notice is received unless the notice specifies a later effective date.
5. **Removal.** Any Trustee may be removed at any time in either of the following manners:
 - A. Upon the recommendation of the Board of Trustees, the Association may remove a Trustee prior to the expiration of the Trustee's term in accordance with its own governance and rules. Such removal may occur only upon the Association's finding that the removal of such Trustee is in the best interest of the Corporation and one or more of the following causes for removal are deemed by the Association to exist: breach of trust; neglect of duty; diminished physical or mental capacity; immoral, fraudulent or dishonest conduct; or breach of loyalty or conflict of interest.
 - B. In the event a member of the Board is absent from more than one-half of the scheduled Board and committee meetings in a twelve (12) month period, such Board member shall be automatically removed from the Board and their position shall become vacant.
6. **Vacancies.** If vacancies occur between annual meetings of the Association prospective board members shall be nominated by the IBSA Nominating Committee and considered by the IBSA Board of Directors. A trustee elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office.
7. **Conflict of Interest.** No member of the Board may derive or appear to derive any personal profit or gain, directly or indirectly, by reason of his or her membership on the Board or because of services provided to the Board. Each Board member must disclose to the Board any personal interest, which he or she may have in any current or potential matter before the Board and refrain from participation in any decision on such matters.

No employee of BCHFS or family member of an employee of BCHFS, nor any person whose salary is subsidized by BCHFS nor any person whose service shall provide a conflict of interest (other than those disclosed to and approved by the Board), shall serve as a member of the Board of BCHFS.

ARTICLE IV MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

1. **Regular Meetings.** Regular meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be held four times each year. The Board shall fix the date, time and place of its meetings.
2. **Special Meetings.** The Chairperson, Executive Director or at least twenty percent of the Trustees then in office may call a special meeting of the Board of Trustees. At least 7 days written notice of the date, time and place shall be given to each member of the Board by the person(s) calling the meeting. The notice shall state the nature of the business to be considered at the special meeting, and no business other than that stated in the notice shall be considered at such meeting.

3. **Quorum and Voting.** At all meetings of the Board of Trustees, a majority of the entire Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Except as otherwise provided by law or these Bylaws, the vote of a majority of the trustees present at the time of any vote shall be the act of the Board. The Board may permit any or all trustees to participate in a regular or special meeting by, or conduct the meeting through, the use of any means of communication by which all trustees participating may hear each other simultaneously during the meeting. A trustee participating in a meeting by such means is deemed to be present in person at the meeting.

4. **Action by the Board.** Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board or by any committee thereof may be taken without a meeting if all members of the Board or committee are polled and the action evidenced by one or more written consents describing the action taken, signed by each trustee, and included in the minutes filed with the corporate records reflecting the action taken. Such action shall be initiated by the Chairperson over his or her signature and also requires the consent of the Vice Chairperson, or, in the absence of the Vice Chairperson, the Secretary.

5. **Records and Minutes.** Written records and minutes of all Board meetings and committee meetings shall be maintained and made available for review. Such records reflect the official actions of the Board and at a minimum contain the date of each Board meeting, any committee reports made to the Board, and all actions taken by the Board.

6. **Procedures.** The meetings shall be conducted in accordance with the current edition of Roberts Rules of Order.

7. **Access.** Meetings of the Board of Trustees and committees thereof shall be open to the general public; provided, however, that the Board of Trustees may hold a closed meeting at a specified future date or close a portion of a meeting to the public upon a majority vote of a quorum of the trustees present. Such vote must be taken in an open meeting, and meetings may only be closed for certain issues and discussion in the closed meeting limited to the cited issue(s). Minutes must be taken of the closed meeting. The issues that may be discussed in closed meetings of the Board of Trustees include: 1) personnel and employee compensation matters, 2) hearing of testimony on a complaint against the Corporation or employee to determine the validity, 3) pending or threatened litigation against, affecting, or on behalf of the Corporation, 4) real estate transactions, or 5) the sale or purchase of securities and investments.

ARTICLE V OFFICERS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

1. **Officers.** The officers of the Board of Trustees shall be a Chairperson, a Vice Chairperson and a Secretary.

2. **Election, Term of Office and Removal.** The officers of the Corporation shall be elected for a one (1) year term at the Fall meeting of the Board of Trustees. Any officer of the Corporation may be removed as an officer, with or without cause, by a vote of a majority of the entire Board. When a vacancy occurs, the vacant office will be filled at the next meeting of the Board.

3. **Chairperson: Powers and Duties.** The Chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Trustees and perform such other duties as usually pertains to this office or as the Board of Trustees shall from time to time proscribe. The Chairperson shall serve as a voting member of one of the standing committees and an ex-officio member of all other committees of the Board without vote.
4. **Vice Chairperson: Powers and Duties.** The Vice Chairperson shall perform the duties of the Chairperson in the absence of or at the request of the Chairperson, and all other duties the Board of Trustees shall from time to time proscribe. The Vice Chairperson shall serve as a voting member of one of the standing committees and an ex-officio member of all other committees of the Board without vote.
5. **Secretary: Powers and Duties.** The Secretary shall record the proceedings of the Board of Trustees and provide a copy of the minutes to the Executive Director after each meeting, and shall perform all other duties the Board of Trustees shall from time to time proscribe. The Secretary shall serve as a voting member of one of the standing committees and an ex-officio member of all other committees of the Board without vote.
6. **Delegation.** In case of the absence or disability of any officer or of any person authorized to act for such officer, the Board may from time to time delegate the powers and duties of such officer to any other officer, trustee, or person whom it may select during such period of absence or disability.

ARTICLE VI COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

1. **Standing Committees.** The Board of Trustees shall be organized into four standing committees. The Chairperson of the Board shall appoint each Board member to serve on at least one standing committee each year. Each committee shall have a chairperson, vice chairperson and a secretary that are elected at the Fall Board meeting. The standing committees of the Board are:
 - A. **Advisory Committee.** The Advisory Committee consists of all officers of the Board of Trustees and the chairpersons of each of the other standing committees. The Advisory Committee will act as counsel for the Executive Director. In the event of the death, incapacity, or prolonged absence of the Executive Director, the Advisory Committee shall assume responsibilities for day to day operations until the next meeting of the Board, and shall report to the Board at each regular and special meeting any actions it has taken in the interim. The Advisory Committee will meet with the Executive Director prior to the Fall Board meeting to discuss and develop a slate of nominees for Board officers for the next year.
 - B. **Administrative Committee.** The Administrative Committee is responsible for the general areas of properties, personnel, policy and procedures. The committee shall study, evaluate and make recommendations to the Board regarding: 1) maintenance of current facilities, 2) planning for new construction, 3) long-range planning for the modernization and improvement of the facilities and physical needs of the Corporation, 4) personnel

practices, 5) employee compensation and benefits, 6) staffing standards, 7) manual of procedures, 8) all client and employee grievances, and 9) approval of new positions and job descriptions.

C. Program Committee. The Program Committee is responsible for the general areas of programs and services of the Corporation, and strategic planning. The committee shall study, monitor, evaluate and make recommendations to the Board regarding: 1) the program philosophy of the Corporation, including the needs of society and the distinctive role of the Corporation in meeting those needs, 2) program objectives and annual goals including the strategy most appropriate to meet objectives, 3) ongoing program services and recommend changes if needed, 4) new programs, 5) the strategic plan with regular updates to the Board of Trustees, and 6) the residential care behavior management system according to the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS) licensing standards.

D. Finance and Development Committee. The Finance and Development Committee is responsible for the general areas of financial and investment policies, budgeting, fundraising, and public relations. The committee has the responsibility to monitor, evaluate, establish and make recommendations to the Board regarding: 1) measurable outcomes and goals for specific fundraising efforts, 2) the communication and public relations efforts of the Corporation, 3) approval of internal audit staffing, procedures, and reports, 4) the annual external audit to ensure financial integrity of the Corporation, 5) investment policies regarding designated gifts and long-term endowment funds, 6) financial reports, 7) annual budget, and 8) financing of all current needs and capital projects approved by the Board.

2. Meetings. Each committee shall meet as frequently as may be needed to accomplish its business at the call of its chairperson, the chairperson of the Board of Trustees or the Executive Director.

ARTICLE VII EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

1. Employment and Duties. The Board of Trustees shall employ one Executive Director to provide executive management of the Corporation, administer its programs and services, and perform all other duties assigned by the Board. The Executive Director shall provide an annual report to the Board concerning the status of the Corporation, and also make any recommendations to the Board concerning the needs of the Corporation. The Executive Director shall have only such authority as has been delegated by the Board.

2. Personnel. The Executive Director shall have authority to appoint, reassign, and discharge all employees and staff of the Corporation. Any new position shall be approved by the Administrative Committee of the Board prior to being filled by the Executive Director. With the advice and consent of the Board, the Executive Director shall also appoint and be responsible for all Program Directors as deemed necessary. Program Directors shall perform such administrative duties as are assigned by the Executive Director, and shall be responsible to and under the supervision of the Executive Director.

3. **Properties.** The Executive Director shall have responsibility for the physical properties of the Corporation and shall cause to make any needed repairs or minor improvements to such properties as he or she deems necessary and appropriate.
4. **Execution of Documents.** The Executive Director shall execute all documents on behalf of the Corporation, provided that all conveyances of real estate must be co-signed as provided herein. The Executive Director shall have the authority to authenticate records of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VIII COORDINATING COUNCIL

The Association is the sole member and controlling entity of the Corporation and the Baptist Foundation of Illinois (BFI), all of which are corporations governed by the Illinois General Not For Profit Corporation Act (herein together the “Entities”). A Coordinating Council shall: 1) coordinate the work of the Entities to facilitate harmony and unity, 2) decide matters of dispute between the Entities, and 3) give direction to the Boards of the Entities in matters not clearly defined in the governing documents of the Entities or law. The Coordinating Council is comprised of the president and vice president of the Association, the chairperson and the vice chairperson of boards of the Entities, and the Executive Director of each of the Entities. The governing documents of the Association provides for all terms governing and controlling the Coordinating Council.

ARTICLE IX FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall begin January 1 and end December 31.

ARTICLE X USE AND MANAGEMENT OF FUNDS

The Board of Trustees shall maintain all funds, such as trust funds, endowment funds, and current and capital funds, separate and inviolate as to the cause for which the funds were received. Such funds are not to be used for any other purpose, even temporarily, except as specified by the donors. The Board of Trustees shall determine and manage the investment policy, guidelines, and objectives for the assets of the Corporation in order to meet the current and future expenses of the agency and to insure it continues its ministry.

ARTICLE XI PURCHASE AND SALE OF PROPERTY

All conveyances of real estate shall be authorized by the Board of Trustees. The Board, by a two-thirds vote of the members present and voting, may purchase, or otherwise acquire, lease, mortgage, sell, exchange, or otherwise dispose of any property, personal or real, of the Corporation. The Association must approve the sale, lease, exchange or otherwise disposal of over 40 acres of real property or any combined sale of over one-fifth (20%) of fair market value of the property of the Corporation, other than in the usual and regular course of its activities. The

Board of Trustees may sell any donated real property that has been donated subsequent to January 1, 2018 with the intent for said property to be sold and where said property is not given to be used for direct ministry operations. All instruments conveying real estate shall be executed by both the Executive Director and the Chairperson of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE XII BUDGET AND REPORT

The Corporation shall submit to the Association for its consideration in annual session a financial report and a proposed budget for the ensuing year. The Board shall have the authority to approve over-expenditure of line items, providing the total budget figure remains the same as approved by the Association in session. The Board shall submit for consideration by the Association any plans for new special offerings or capital fund-raising activities, with the presently authorized offering for state-wide promotion being the Mother's Day Offering. During the fiscal year, the Board shall not obligate the Corporation to expenditures nor incur accumulative indebtedness that will exceed its annual budget by an amount greater than three percent of its annual budget.

ARTICLE XIII AUDIT PROCEDURES

The Board of Trustees shall appoint a firm of certified public accountants to examine the books and records of the Corporation for the ensuing year. Upon completion of the audit, a copy of the audit and management letter will be provided to the Executive Director and each member of the Board of Trustees. The Finance and Development Committee will make a report to the full Board regarding the audit. Upon request, a representative of the auditing firm shall personally appear before the Board of Trustees to make a summary presentation of the audit report and answer any questions of the Board. Summary audit information shall be presented to the Association.

ARTICLE XIV SERVICES AND ADMISSIONS

Application for services or admission to a Corporation program shall be made to a designee of the Executive Director. The designee shall gather the facts related to each application and act upon them in his or her discretion. All children and families who can benefit from the services of the Corporation shall be considered for admission without regard to race, sex or religious preference.

ARTICLE XV INDEMNIFICATION

1. **Indemnification in Actions other than by or in the Right of the Corporation.** The Corporation may indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed action, suit, or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative, or investigative (other than an action by or in the Right of the Corporation) by reason of the fact that he or she is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a director, officer,

employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorneys' fees), judgments, fines, and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection with such action, suit, or proceeding, if such person acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Corporation and, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful. The termination of any action, suit, or proceeding by judgment, order, settlement, or conviction or upon a plea of nolo contendere or its equivalent shall not, of itself, create a presumption that the person did not act in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the Corporation or, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, that the person had reasonable cause to believe that his or her conduct was unlawful.

2. **Indemnification in Actions by or in the Right of the Corporation.** The Corporation may indemnify any person who was or is a party or is threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed action or suit by or in the Right of the Corporation to procure a judgment in its favor by reason of the fact that such person is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving at the request of the corporation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, against expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection with the defense or settlement of such action or suit, if such person acted in good faith and in a manner he or she reasonably believed to be in, or not opposed to, the best interests of the Corporation, provided that no indemnification shall be made in respect of any claim, issue, or matter as to which such person shall have been adjudged to be liable for negligence or misconduct in the performance of his or her duty to the Corporation, unless, and only to the extent that the court in which such action or suit was brought shall determine upon application that, despite the adjudication of liability, but in view of all the circumstances of the case, such person is fairly and reasonably entitled to indemnity for such expenses as the court shall deem proper.

3. **Right to Payment of Expenses.** To the extent that a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation has been successful, on the merits or otherwise, in the defense of any action, suit, or proceeding referred to in Sections 1 and 2 of this Article, or in defense of any claim, issue, or matter therein, such person shall be indemnified against expenses (including attorneys' fees) actually and reasonably incurred by such person in connection therewith.

4. **Determination of Conduct.** Any indemnification under Sections 1 and 2 of this Article (unless ordered by a court) shall be made by the Corporation only as authorized in the specific case, upon a determination that indemnification of the director, officer, employee, or agent is proper in the circumstances because he or she has met the applicable standard of conduct set forth in Sections 1 or 2 of this Article. Such determination shall be made (a) by the Board of Trustees by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of trustees who were not parties to such action, suit, or proceeding; (b) if such a quorum is not obtainable, or even if obtainable, if a quorum of disinterested directors so directs, by independent legal counsel in a written opinion; or (c) by the members entitled to vote, if any.

5. **Payment of Expenses in Advance.** Expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action, suit, or proceeding may be paid by the Corporation in advance of the final disposition of such action, suit, or proceeding, as authorized by the Board of Trustees in the specific case, upon receipt of an undertaking by or on behalf of the director, officer, employee, or agent to repay

such amount, unless it shall ultimately be determined that he or she is entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation as authorized in this Article.

6. **Indemnification Not Exclusive**. The indemnification provided by this Article shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those seeking indemnification may be entitled under any bylaw, agreement, vote of members or disinterested directors, or otherwise, both as to action in his or her official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office, and shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a director, officer, employee, or agent, and shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors, and administrators of such a person.

7. **Insurance**. The Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a director, officer, employee, or agent of the Corporation, or who is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a director, officer, employee, or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust, or other enterprise, against any liability asserted against such person and incurred by such person in any such capacity, or arising out of his or her status as such, whether or not the Corporation would have the power to indemnify such person against such liability under the provisions of this Article.

ARTICLE XVI DISSOLUTION

Only the Association in annual session shall authorize the dissolution or merger of the Corporation. As a wholly owned, single member organization of the Illinois Baptist State Association (IBSA), if dissolved, all net assets and all contractual or fiduciary obligations of the Corporation become the property or responsibility of IBSA.

By passing this Article, the IBSA agrees to accept all assets and all contractual or fiduciary obligations of the Corporation upon dissolution of the Corporation by the Association.

ARTICLE XVII AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended by a vote of the Association in annual session, and the submission and approval of any amendments shall follow the same procedures required to amend the governing documents of the Association. The Bylaws may contain any provisions for the regulation and management of the affairs of the Corporation not inconsistent with law or the Articles of Incorporation.


