What to Bring to Summer Camp 2024 ...and a few items to leave home

- Shorts (no short shorts)**
You will need changes of clothes for each days, plus a couple extra incase of rain or messy activities. There are no laundry facilities available at the camp.
- Shirts**
Campers will receive a camp t-shirt. There is also shirts and other items for sale as the camp store. No spaghetti straps, tube tops, or muscle shirts please.
- Jeans**
One or two pairs will be sufficient. Camp is usually hot!
- Sweater, Hoodie**
While camp is usually hot, sometimes we have chilly days. Also, indoor rooms can be chilly at times.
- Light jacket**
In case of rain. Also consider at umbrellla.
- Socks & Underwear**
It is a good idea to mark all clothing items with your campers name so that they get them back home. Items like these like camp so much that they tend to hang around after everyone leaves.
- Tennis shoes & Flip Flops**
Tennis shoes are best for most camp activities. Flip flops or croc-style shoes are best for swimming & leisure activities.
- Swimsuit**
Choose a modest swimsuit. One piece or two-piece with a colored t-shirt covers most of these problems.
- Bedding (Pillow, Sheets & Blanket or Sleeping Bag)**
Campers will be sleeping on twin sized bunk beds, so please plan accordingly.
- Towels and Washcloth**
Don't forget to also pack a swimming towel.
- Toiletries (Such as Soap, Deodorant, Shampoo, Toothbrush & Toothpaste)**
A small bag to store all of these items is a nice addition as well. DON'T forget the deodorant.
- Flashlight**
While the camps are well lit at night, kids like having flashlights at camp.

Bible

Notebook & Pen or pencil

Notebooks are great for taking notes during the worship services or bible studies and evening devotions.

Medications

Please have your medications in their original bottle and in a Ziplock bag to hand to the camp nurse.

Money for Snacks

The amount of money you would like to send with your child is up to you. Usually campers are fine with \$10-\$20. Some camps will collect money at the start of camp and keep track of money spent throughout the week and return the remainder at the end of camp. During other weeks of camp, students will be responsible to keep track of their own money.
