No matter how big or small...

- We love children and desire them to know God
- Kids Ministry matters because a child's spiritual identity is generally set by age 13
- We are in need for more volunteers

1. Do an Honest Evaluation

- PRAY: Pray to see your ministry the way God sees it
- Get Feedback from volunteers and parents
- Is there another approach, structure, curriculum that would work better?

1. Do an Honest Evaluation

- What is the overall feel about Kids Ministry?
- Why are people not serving?
- Is your communication with volunteers effective enough?
- Do leaders feel appreciated?

2. Create a Recruitment Strategy

- PRAY: Pray to see volunteers the way God sees them
- Share you vision (It's not just childcare!)
- Must come from the top down
- Check your attitude: no "woe is me"
- Create regular reminders to the church

2. Create a Recruitment Strategy

- Celebrate the wins!
- Have a clear process (background checks)
- Go for the personal ask
- Encourage current leaders to recruit friends
- Allow people to 'test drive' or 'shadow'

3. Training Methods

- PRAY: Ask God for His plan for your people
- YOUR GOAL: Multiply yourself by discipling new leaders who will disciple new leaders
- BENEFITS: Cultivate a team spirit, improved skills, open communication

3. Training Methods

- Regularly scheduled meetings
- Develop a mentoring program
- Special Skill development trainings
- All-Church Training/Dinner
- Associational, State, & National conferences

3. Training Methods

- Lunch after church
- Team up with another local church
- Mini-trainings (10-15 min before events)
- Weekly emails
- Encourage their own spiritual growth

4. Training Meeting Tips

- Lots of Reminders!
- Start and end on time
- Variety of teaching methods (just like kids!)
- Use Multi-Media materials (videos, slides, handouts, activities, etc.)

4. Training Meeting Tips

- Show appreciation and support (treats!)
- Allow time for discussion
- Follow up with those that didn't come
- Incorporate something to help them grow in their faith

5. Topics for Training-Preschool

- Learning Centers
- Teaching Babies and Ones
- Safety and Hygiene
- Large group time/Bible Story
- Reaching out to families

5. Topics for Training-Elementary

- Salvation Conversations
- Learning styles
- Adding music, art, drama, games, etc.
- Large Group Time
- Teaching Bible Skills
- Reaching out to families
